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


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








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

After more than three weeks of siege, the first Pal-estinians – dozens of dual passport holders and seriously injured – were al-lowed to leave Gaza and enter Egypt via the Rafah crossing, when it was brief-

Even as bombings have driven tens of thousands from their homes and food, water and fuel run low, no one has been allowed to leave the embat-tled enclave, except for four hostages released by Hamas. Another captive was rescued by Israeli forc-es earlier this week. But a limited agreement appeared to have been reached on Wednesday. October with tax collec-tions rising at a 10-month high pace of 13.4% to hit the second-highest month-ly tally of \$1.72 lakh crore. October's GST receipts were 5.7% over the kitty in September, when growth in the indirect tax had slowed to a 27-month low in the indirect tax had slowed to a 27-month low of 10.2%. The 13.4% reve-me growth marks the tick since December 2022 and breaks a three-month streak of deceleration. Domestic transactions and services imports yield-er's revenues. The Finance er's revenues. 53 accidents, 19 deaths per hour in road crashes in 2022, says Ministry

The expansion of the country's road network, including expressways, and an increase in vehicle ownership continue to spur a rise in number of fa-talities due to road acci-dents, with the severity of crashes worsening signifi-cantly over the past decade, according to govern-ment data. India witnessed 53 acci-

India witnessed 53 acci-dents and 19 deaths every hour, or an average of 1,264 accidents and 42 deaths, daily in road crash-es last year, according to a Ministry of Road Transport and Highways report re-leased on Wednesday eased on Wednesday. There were a total 4,61,312 country, which claimed as many as 1,68,491 lives. The number of road accidents in 2022 increased by 11.9% and deaths rose by 9.4%. The severity of road

The nomination will be submitted to the WHO Executive Board during its 154th session on January 22-27 in Geneva, the WHO regional office said in an official communication.

The newly appointed Regional Director will take

over from Poonam Khetrapal Singh on February 1.

Ms. Wazed, in a statement, said the WHO Southeast Asia Region was home to over two billion people – more than a quarter of the people of the planet – and that the region represented a diversity with often differences existing within the boundaries of single member states themselves.

"We will work to promote community-based mental healthcare services in member countries, encourage prevention and promotion in mental health while expanding efforts to include mental health in the public health agenda," Ms. Wazed said.

Reacting to the result, Swarup Sarkar, former Director of WHO SEARO, said the election demonstrated the collective resolve of member states to move forward with the vision set out by Ms. Wazed.

"As a former WHO staff, I would look forward to a stronger, responsive, and responsible WHO working at the global, regional and country levels, on the principle of one WHO and more participation of civil society at all stages of WHO work," he said.

Biggest China Antarctic fleet sails to build research station

BEIJING, NOVEMBER 1

TWO CHINESE icebreaker research vessels and a cargo ship set sail on Wednesday for the Antarctic with more than 460 personnel on board to help complete construction of Chin's fifth station on the world's southernmost continent.

China's biggest flotilla of research vessels deployed to the Antarctic will focus on building the station on the rocky, windswept Inexpressible Island near the Ross Sea, a deep Southern Ocean bay named after a 19th century British explorer.

Work on the first Chinese station in the Pacific sector began in 2018. It will be used to conduct research on the region's environment, state television reported.

China has four research stations in the Antarctic built from 1985 to 2014. A U.S.-based think tank estimated the fifth could be finished next year.

The facility is expected to include an observatory with a satellite ground station, and should help China "fill in a major gap" in its ability to access the continent, the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) said in a report this year.

The station is also well situated to collect signals intelligence over Australia and New Zealand




The cargo ship "Tianhui", or "Divine Blessings", taking construction material for the station, set off from the eastern port of Zhangjiagang.

The five-month mission will include a survey on the impact of climate change. The two ice-breakers will also conduct environmental surveys in the Prydez Bay, the Astronaut Sea in southeast Antarctic, and in Ross Sea and Amundsen Sea in the west.

The mission, China's 40th to the Antarctic, will also cooperate with countries including the United States, Britain, and Russia on logistics supply, state media reported.

Mumbai climbs to fourth rank in prime residential prices index

MUMBAI MOVED UP 18 places to reach the fourth-highest position in terms of y-o-y increase in prime residential prices in Prime Global Cities Index Q3 of 2023 of Knight Frank. It was at the twenty second rank in Q3 2022.

New Delhi and Bengaluru too recorded also moved up. Delhi moved from the thirty sixth rank in Q3 2022 to tenth in Q3 2023, with a growth of 4.1% y-o-y. Bengaluru's went from twenty seventh place in Q3 2022 to seventeenth in Q3 2023 with a y-o-y rise of 2.2%.

The average rise in annual prime residential prices was recorded at 2.1% across the 46 markets in the 12-month period ending September 2023. This is the strongest growth rate

Shishir Baijal, chairman and managing director at Knight Frank India, said, "The robust price trend in the upper end of the market, coupled with a strong sales momentum, has elevated Mumbai's position in this global ranking scale. Sales momentum is significantly stronger in the higher ticket sizes today than it has been in the past five years. The homebuyers' increasing need to upgrade their lifestyle, coupled with stable economic prospects of the country and improving market sentiments should sustain price growth in the short to medium term."

Manila claimed the top spot in the ranking, with a 21.2% annual rise in prices. Dubai, with its 15.9% annual growth, has been displaced from the top position for the first time in eight quarters due to a sharp decline in quarterly growth from 11.6% in Q2 to 0.7% in Q3.

NPCI SENDS INSTRUCTIONS TO STAKEHOLDERS

UPI transactions through voice command from April

SACHIN KUMAR Mumbai, November 1

INDIVIDUALS WILL BE able to make UPI transactions through voice command from April. The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), in a circular, has asked banks, payment service providers and other stakeholders to enable the 'Hello! UPI' feature in their apps by March 31.

"To improve the access and experience on digital platforms, which support payments, NPCI has introduced the 'Hello! UPI' as a feature to drive access and experience of UPI, assisted with voice," said NPCI in the guidelines sent to banks and payment service providers on October 27. "The UPI features such as user onboarding, balance inquiry, financial transaction, complaint resolution, etc will be enabled using voice commands by the user," it added. These guidelines are for the apps, which are already live, a source told FE. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor Shaktikanta Das in September announced the launch of


With the 'Hello! UPI' feature, a user will be able to complete the transaction by simply giving a voice command. For example, if a user wants to send money, she can open the UPI app and say Hello (name of the app) and make the payment to a person (name saved in contact list).

Similarly, if a userwants to check the account balance, he will be able to do so by giving the voice command. Currently, a user has to manually type the command to perform a transaction. Apart from apps, the user will also be able to use this feature through voice calls. She will be required to call a number and give her instructions to complete the transaction.

This service will initially be rolled out in the English and Hindi languages, but gradually users will be allowed to use this voice com-

mand in 11 regional languages.

Bankers say the feature will be useful in taking banking services in rural and semi-urban areas. "Voicebased UPI transactions will help banks in the financial inclusion drive. There are many users in rural areas who find it difficult to do UPI transactions through text command. Voice-based command will be very useful for them," head of digital banking of a public sector bank told *FE*.
