





# Difficult to press for women's quota before LS poll: SC

Forcing quick implementation will amount to virtually legislating, says Justice Sanjiv Khanna; case listed on Nov. 22 along with a similar petition

■ he Supreme Court on Friday described the constitutional amendment reserving one-third of the seats in Parliament, State legislatures, and the Delhi Legislative Assembly for women as a "very good step" towards attaining gender parity in politics, but voiced doubts about stepping in to ensure the implementation of the quota law before the general election in 2024.

"It will be very difficult for us to do that. It will amount to virtually legislating," Justice Sanjiv Khanna, heading a Division Bench, observed.

### Not there yet

The Constitution (One Hundred and Sixth Amendment) Act, popularly called the women's reservation Bill, stipulates 33% reservation for women in the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies. However it won't take effect immediately

Mr. Singh urged the court to declare the "offending" clause in the Constitution (One Hundred and Sixth Amendment) Act of 2023 "void ab-initio".

He argued that a constitutional amendment passed by the Parliament unanimously during a Special Session should not be made to wait indefinitely. Mr. Singh argued that it was settled law that a constitutional amendment cannot be held back unless it was found to be *ultra-vires* the Constitution. "A Special Session was called for implementing the reservation in the Parliament, State legislatures and the Delhi Legislative Assembly. Both Houses passed the Bill unanimously. The Act was notified on September 28, 2023. But still, the object of the Act is yet to be realised," the petition said. The senior lawyer contended that deferring the implementation of the Act till after the Census and delimitation amounted to a virtual stay on its effect and operation for ambiguous reasons.

The petition referred to the 73rd and 74th constitutional amendments of 1993 which gave women one-third representation in local body elections. Dr. Thakur drew the court's attention to the 77th Constitutional Amendment extending reservations for promotions in jobs for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

Finally, the petition highlighted the recent implementation of the 10% EWS reservation for poor Forward Caste sections of the society in educational institutions and public employment.

It said all these amendments were given effect without calling for Census data.

### Cauvery Authority ratifies CWRC's decision on release of water to Tamil Nadu

The Cauvery Water Man-agement Authority (CWMA) on Friday ap-proved the decision of the . Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) to ask Karnataka to release 2,600 cubic feet per second (cu-secs) to Tamil Nadu till November 23

The ratification meant that the upper riparian State would have to release 5.17 thousand million cubic D.K. Shivakumar, also in charge of the Water Re-sources portfolio, said the State did not have any wa-ter to release. As on date, the four reservoirs of Kar-nataka had a combined storage of 56 tmc ft, ac-cording to a post on the so-cial media handle of the Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring

Friday's meeting, held in New Delhi and attended in New Delhi and attended physically by representa-tives of the two principal riparian States, lasted two hours, CWMA chairman Saumitra Kumar Haldar told The Hindu. Officials of the Kerala and Puducherry governments were present virtually. Tamil Nadu had sought the release of 13,000 cusecs, factoring in the backlog.

# The Beatles release their final record — with a little help from AI

THE FINAL Beatles recording is here.

Titled "Now and Then," the almost impossible-to-believe track is four minutes and eight seconds of the first and only original Beatles recording of the 21st century. There's a countdown, then acoustic guitar strumming and piano bleed into the unmistakable vocal tone of John Lennon in the song's introduction: "I know it's true / It's all because of you / And if I make it through / It's all because of you."

More than four decades since Lennon's murder and two since George Harrison's death, the very last Beatles song has been released as a double A-side single with "Love Me Do," the band's 1962 debut single.

"Now and Then" comes from the same batch of unreleased demos written by Lennon in the 1970s, which were given to his former bandmates by Yoko Ono. They used the tape to construct the songs "Free As a Bird" and "Real Love," released in the mid-1990s. But there were technical limitations to finishing "Now and Then."

On Wednesday, a short film titled "The Beatles — Now And Then — The Last Beatles Song" was released, detailing the creation of the track.

We're actually messing around with state-of-the-art technology, which is something the Beatles would've been very interested in.

On the original tape, Lennon's voice was hidden; the piano was "hard to hear," as Paul McCartney describes it. "And in those days, of course, we didn't have the technology to do the separation."

That changed in 2022, when the band — now a duo — was

able to utilise the same technical restoration methods that separated the Beatles' voices from background sounds during the making of director Peter Jackson's 2021 documentary series, "The Beatles: Get Back." And so, they were able to isolate Lennon's voice from the original cassette and complete "Now and Then" using machine learning.

When the song was first announced in June, McCartney described artificial intelligence (AI) technology as "kind of scary but exciting," adding: "We will just have to see where that leads."

McCartney and Starr built the track from Lennon's demo, adding guitar parts George Harrison wrote in the 1995 sessions and a slide guitar solo in his signature style. McCartney and Starr tracked their bass and drum contributions. A string arrangement was written with the help of Giles Martin, son of the late Beatles producer George Martin — a clever recall to the classic ambitiousness of "Strawberry Fields," or "Yesterday," or "I Am the Walrus." Those musicians couldn't be told they were contributing to the last ever Beatles track, so McCartney played it off like a solo endeavor.

"This is the last track, ever, that you'll get the four Beatles on the track. John, Paul, George, and Ringo," Ringo Starr said of Lennon's contributions to the track in September.





# State Food Safety Index 2022-2023



The State Food Safety Index (SFSI) 2022- 2023 released by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) sheds light on the performance of Indian states in ensuring food safety.



The 2022- 2023 index introduced a new parameter, 'Improvement in SFSI Rank', which assessed a state's progress from the previous year. To accommodate this change, weights of other parameters were adjusted.

What is the State Food Safety Index (SFSI)?

It is an annual evaluation that measures the performance of states and union territories on food safety.

The Index is a dynamic quantitative and qualitative benchmarking model that provides an objective framework for evaluating food safety across all States/UTs.

SFSI was started in 2018-19 to create a competitive and positive change in the food safety ecosystem in the country.

- General Decline in State Food Safety Scores:
  - Over the past five years, 19 out of 20 large Indian states, including Maharashtra, Bihar, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh, have experienced a decline in their 2022 - 2023 SFSI scores compared to 2019.

## Decline in 'Food Testing Infrastructure':

 The 'Food Testing Infrastructure' parameter measures the availability of adequate testing infrastructure with trained personnel in each state for testing food samples.

- This parameter **experienced the steepest fall,** with the average score for all large states dropping from 13 out of 20 in 2019 to 7 out of 17 in 2022 2023.
  - Gujarat and Kerala were the best performers in this parameter in 2022 2023 while Andhra Pradesh performed the worst.

# Compliance Scores Decreased:

• This parameter measures licensing and registration of food businesses, inspections conducted, special drives and camps organized, and other such compliance-related tasks carried out by each state's food safety authority.

Scores for the 'Compliance' parameter also declined.

 Punjab and Himachal Pradesh received the highest scores in this parameter and Jharkhand received the lowest score.





# Mercury contamination Source: TH

Tropical birds in Central and South America are exhibiting signs of mercury contamination due to artisanal and small-scale gold mining operations, according to a new study.

Birds living within 7 km of gold mining activity were found to have mercury concentrations over four times higher than those in other areas.



#### Why mercury is used in Gold mining?



Mercury is used in gold mining because **it forms an amalgam with gold**, allowing for the extraction of gold from ore.



This amalgamation process is a simple and effective way to capture fine gold particles, but it also leads to significant environmental and health concerns due to mercury pollution.

## **Key Findings:**

The research suggests that mercury may be playing a role in the declining biodiversity of tropical birds, which has been observed in recent decades.



Mercury contamination has been linked to neurological illness, immune diseases, and reproductive failure in both humans and birds.



Birds are considered sensitive indicators of ecosystem health and are often referred to as the "canary in the gold mine" for their ability to signal environmental issues.
