- Major Millets in India: jowar (sorghum), bajra (pearl millet) and ragi (finger millet).
- Indigenous varieties of "small millets" like kodo, kutki, chenna and sanwa.
- Earliest evidence found of Millets found in Indus civilization: 3000 BC.
- It was ancient food grains first plants domesticated for food.

Climatic condition:

- Short growing season (70-100 days, as against 120-150 days for paddy/wheat)
- Lower water requirement (350-500 mm versus 600-1,200 mm).
- Can grow even in poor soil
- It is a Kharif crop

AS THE Smart Cities Mission approaches the June 2024 deadline, cities in Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan account for the top 10 in terms of completion of projects and financial progress, while UTs and cities in Northeastern states are in the lowest 10 of the 100, *The Indian Express* has learnt.

As per the Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry data as on November 3, about 22% of total projects (1,745 of 7,947) that account for 33% (Rs 57,028 crore of Rs 1.70 lakh crore) of the total cost are still ongoing. The majority of projects (6,202) have been completed, data shows. As of November 10, ministry data showed Surat (Gujarat) topped in terms of completion of projects, fund usage and other criteria, followed by Agra (UP), Ahmedabad (Gujarat),

Varanasi (UP) and Bhopal (MP) in the top five. The rest of the top 10 include Tumakuru (Karnataka), Udaipur (Rajasthan), Madurai (TN), Kota (Rajasthan) and Shivamogga (Karnataka).

On the other hand, the UTs and Northeastern cities have continued to trail. The bottom 10 cities are Kavaratti (Lakshadweep), Puducherry, Port Blair (Andaman and Nicobar Islands), Imphal (Manipur), Shillong (Meghalaya), Diu, Guwahati (Assam), Aizawl (Mizoram), Gangtok (Sikkim) and Pasighat (AP). Sources said this was due to lack of capacities in smaller cities. However, an official said the ongoing projects are likely to meet the June 2024 deadline, Launched in 2015, the Smart Cities Mission selected 100 cities through a competition in phases from January 2016 to June 2018. The selected cities were expected to finish all their proposed projects in five years from their selection. In May this year, the deadline for all cities was extended to June 2024.



SOFIA (Stratospheric Observatory for Infrared Astronomy)

- Scientists have detected atomic oxygen in the atmosphere of Venus through SOFIA airborne observatory.
- Venus (aka Earth's twin) is the second planet from Sun and Earth's nearest planetary neighbour.
 - Unlike Earth, it rotates clockwise (east to west) i.e backward.
 - It has no moons/rings and is the hottest planet due to "runaway greenhouse effect".
- SOFIA is the world's largest airborne astronomical observatory (joint program of NASA and German Aerospace Center).
 - It flies in the stratosphere, above 99% of Earth's infraredblocking atmosphere to observe the infrared universe.

Underwater Volcano Eruption

A new island has emerged near <u>Japan's Ogasawara island chain</u> following an underwater volcano eruption in late October 2023.

The island formed through **phreatomagmatic eruptions** triggered by the interaction of magma with seawater.







e-way Bill



As per the World Health Organization, about one in every three deaths that take place from nonmelanoma skin cancer is reportedly caused by working outdoors under the sun.



- मौलाना अबुल कलाम आज़ाद के बारे में मुख्य तथ्य:
- मौलाना अबुल कलाम आज़ाद, जिनका जन्म 11 नवंबर, 1888 को हुआ था, एक विद्वान, शिक्षाविद्, स्वतंत्रता सेनानी और भारतीय राष्ट्रीय कांग्रेस (आईएनसी) के विरष्ठ नेता थे।
- वह 1923 में 35 वर्ष की आयु में कांग्रेस के अध्यक्ष के रूप में सेवा करने वाले सबसे कम उम के व्यक्ति बने।
- वह महात्मा गांधी के नेतृत्व वाले अहिंसक सविनय अवज्ञा आंदोलन के प्रमुख समर्थकों में से एक थे।

He was the first Education Minister of independent India. He served in the position from 1947 to 1958.

He was instrumental in the establishment of premier educational institutions, including the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) and the University Grants Commission (UGC).

He was posthumously awarded India's highest civilian honour, **Bharat Ratna**, in **1992**.

- वह स्वतंत्र भारत के पहले शिक्षा मंत्री थे। उन्होंने 1947 से 1958 तक इस पद पर कार्य किया।
- उन्होंने भारतीय प्रौद्योगिकी संस्थान (आईआईटी) और विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (यूजीसी) सहित प्रमुख शैक्षणिक संस्थानों की स्थापना में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई।
- उन्हें 1992 में मरणोपरांत भारत के सर्वोच्च नागरिक सम्मान, भारत रत्न से सम्मानित किया गया था।

In 1912, he started a weekly journal in Urdu called Al-Hilal which played an important role in forging Hindu-Muslim unity after the bad blood created between the two communities in the aftermath of Morley-Minto reforms (1909).

Maulana Abul Kalam Azad then started another weekly called Al-Balagh with the same mission of propagating Indian nationalism and revolutionary ideas based on Hindu-Muslim unity.

Maulana Azad was arrested in 1930 for violation of the salt laws as part of Gandhiji's Salt Satyagraha.

He was put in Meerut jail for a year and a half. He again became the president of Congress in 1940 and remained in the post till 1946.

His Works: Basic Concept of Quran, Ghubar-eKhatir, Dars-e-Wafa, India Wins Freedom, etc.

Indian Council for Cultural Relations, for introduction of Indian culture to other nations.

Sahitya Academy for development of literature;



Government Office Accessibility

<u>Mandate:</u> Government offices in non-accessible buildings must relocate services. Services should be <u>moved to the ground floor</u> or an accessible location within the same facility.

• सरकारी कार्यालय पहुंच-योग्यता अधिदेश: गैर-पहुंच योग्य भवनों में स्थित सरकारी कार्यालयों को सेवाओं को स्थानांतरित करना होगा। सेवाओं को भूतल या उसी सुविधा के भीतर किसी सुलभ स्थान पर ले जाया जाना चाहिए।

- Airline Policy: Airline policy <u>necessitating medical clearance for certain PwD</u> categories is inconsistent with global Civil Aviation Requirements. All airlines, whether Indian or foreign, <u>must implement the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016</u>, to protect the <u>rights and dignity of individuals</u> with disabilities

Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016
Replaces PwD Act, 1995; Fulfils India's obligations to the United National
Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD).
"A person with a disability" is someone with long-term physical, mental,
intellectual, or sensory impairments hindering equal participation in society.
"Person with benchmark disability" has at least 40% of a specified disability,
certified by the certifying authority.
1. 21 types of disabilities covered under this act.
2. Rights and entitlements: Reservation in higher education, government jobs,
allocation of land, poverty alleviation schemes, etc.
3. Establishment of Authorities: Office of Chief Commissioner of Persons with
Disabilities, assisted by 2 Commissioners and an Advisory Committee.
4. Penalties: Violators are punishable with imprisonment up to six months and/or
a fine of Rs 10,000, or both.
1. National Action Plan (NAP) for Skill Development of PwDs: Skill training for self-
reliance under the Scheme for Implementation of RPwD Act 2016.
2. Scheme of Assistance to PwDs for Purchase/Fitting of Aids/Appliances (ADIP
Scheme): Financial aid for aids/appliances.






