



## India-specific AI model to find gestational age developed

Researchers have deve-loped an India-specific ar-tificial intelligence model to precisely determine the gestational age of a foetus in the second and third trimester of pregnancy

The model has been designed by researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology-Madras and the Translational Health Science and Technology Science and Technology Institute, Faridabad, It is

Institute, Faridabad. It is part of an interdisciplinary group for advanced research on birth outcomes—search on birth outcomes—GARBH-InD programme. The Garbhini-GAz is the first late-trimester GA estimation model to be developed and validated using Currently models used for

Currently models used for Western population are in use which could prove erroneous when applied in the later part of pregnancy due to variations in the growth of the foetus in the Indian population, the re-searchers say.

### The Garbhini-GA2 accurately estimates reducing error by

rately estimates the foetus age, reducing error by al-most three times.

The Indian data would The Indian data would help to provide appro-priate care for pregnant women and determine the precise date of birth, thus

precise date of birth, thus reducing maternal and in-fant mortality rates. Rajesh Gokhale, Secre-tary, Department of Bio-technology, said GARBH-ini, the department's flag-ship programme, was being validated across the country.

country. Several investigators, in-cluding Himanshu Sinha, associate professor, Bhu-pat and Jyoti Mehta School of Biosciences, Depart-ment of Biotechnology, IT-Madras, and Shinjini Bhatnagar, principal investiga-tor of the programme and a distinguished professor at THSTI, were involved in

the project.
The findings were published in the peer-reviewed Lancet Regional Health Southeast Asia.

Breaking away from the classical format, he liberated the romantic form from Persianised Urdu to convey pain in simple verse like *Deewaron* Se Milkar Rona Achcha Lagta Hai and tweaked the plaintive orchestration to create a new, youthful riff that could declare Mohe Aai Na Jag Se Laaj Main Itna Zor Se Nachi Aaj Ki Ghungroo Toot Gaye.

The image of an elegantly dressed Udhas with a harmonium, not a hair out of place, whispering ever so softly into the microphone, *Aur Ahista Kijiye Baatein Dhadkain Koi Sun Raha Hoga*, is etched in the memory of most of those who grew up at a time when *Chitrahaar* was giv-

ing way to music videos and the middle class was opening up to the idea of attending ghazal concerts.

But the song that immortalised Udhas was *Chitthi Aayi Hai* which he sang for Mahesh Bhatt's *Naam*. Released in 1986, the Laxmikant-Pyarelal composition emerged as the anthem of diaspora and migrants.

Picturised on Udhas, the song was addressed to the Indian diaspora in the film but such is the verve in Udhas's voice that Anand Bakshi's lines became the epitome of every migrant's yearning for his home. Letters gave way to emails, Skype, and Zoom calls but

the song continued to create a lump in the throat every time Udhas raised his pitch to plead *Panchhi Pinjra Tod Ke Aaja*, *Desh Paraya Chhod Ke Aaja*.

The song made him a household name after he had already knocked at young hearts with Purab Na Jaivo Paschhim Na Jaivyo (Jawaab, 1985). It was followed by Ek Hi Magsad (1988), where he composed the music and rendered the popular number Chandi Jaisa Rang Hai Tera. The same year, he sang the popular duet Aaj Phir Tumpe Pyar Aaya Hai with Anuradha Paudwal for Feroz Khan's Dayavan. Another unforgettable

heartfelt ditty that continues to evoke pain is *Jeeye To Jeeyen Kaise* that he rendered for Nadeem Shravan in *Saajan* (1991). His voice could engage the connoisseur as well as the aesthete in a truck driver. We all have covered many miles listening to a bus driver playing *Na Kajre Ki Dhaar (Mohra, 1994)* on his rickety cassette player.

Hailing from a family of landlords in Charkhadi town in Rajkot, Udhas was introduced to music by his father, a government servant who loved to play rabab.

Udhas started as a tabla player but soon switched to the classical genre under the guidance of Ustad Ghulam Qadir Khan. When the family shifted to Mumbai, Udhas learned under Navrang Nagpurkar, an exponent of the Bhendi Bazar Gharana, who also taught Asha Bhosle. His elder brothers, Manhar and Nirmal, were already established performers. It was Manhar who introduced Udhas to playback singing. After initial setbacks, Udhas switched to non-film ghazals where he found instant success with albums

like Aahat, Muqarrar, Tarannum, and Mehfil.

Many of his popular ghazals revolved around paimana (flagon) and maikada (tavern). Ghazals like Ek Taraf Uska Ghar, Ek Taraf Maikada, and Sharab Cheez Hi Aisi Hai became an essential feature of his concerts, but he also faced criticism for normalising excessive alcohol consumption. Udhas held that these were metaphors for the intoxication of the divine in Sufi poetry but the argument did not always hold as he sang Ek Ek Ho Jaye Phir Ghar Chale Jaana with Kishore Kumar in Ganga Jamunaa Saraswati (1988). Music companies also pandered to this image by naming his albums Nasha, Paimana, and Madhosh. Because of his deep emotional connection with the diaspora, the Padma Shri was always in great demand for overseas concerts, and performed at the Roval Albert Hall in London and Madison Square in New York.

Even when Hindi cinema moved away from ghazals, his concerts continued to have a faithful following.

# Govt. launches project aimed at anaemia control in girls



Under Mission Utkarsh, 15 central ministries or departments will work to elevate districts at the bottom, to State and national averages. This project will cover approximately 10,000 Anganwadi Centres in the five districts.

Ayush systems, backed by evidence from institutions like ICMR, will offer cost-effective solution to tackle anaemia, Union Minister Smriti Irani said.





# RICE FORTIFICATION

Fortifying rice involves grinding broken rice into powder, mixing it with nutrients like iron, folic acid and vitamin B12, and then shaping it into rice-like kernels using an extrusion process. 





ing sheep, goats, horses and cows, at the end of 2023, official statistics show. 70% percent of Mongo

The United Nations said climate change is increasing the frequency and intensity of dzuds.

Mongolia has experienced six dzuds in the past decade, including the winter of 2022-23 when 4.4 million head of livestock perished.

perished. This year's dzud has been exacerbated by a summer drought that pre-vented animals from build-

ing up enough fatty stores to survive the harsh winter.

Longtime Silicon Valley reporter Kara Swisher unwraps how we got to this point in her incendiary memoir, *Burn Book*, coming out on Tuesday, an exposé that also seeks to avert technological calamity on the perilous road still ahead.

Ms. Swisher skewers many of the once-idealistic

tech moguls who, when she met them as entrepreneurs decades ago, promised to change the world for the better but often chose a path of destructive disruption instead. And along the way, they amassed staggering fortunes that have disconnected them from reality.

### Harsh critiques

Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg, who broke into a sweat during an onstage interview with Ms. Swisher in 2010, and Tesla CEO Elon Musk, who once talked to her regularly before cutting off communi-

### **Immense reputation**

CEOs, including Mr. Zuckerberg and Mr. Musk, regularly granted her exclusive interviews, fed her scoops and sometimes even secretly called her for advice, according to her book.

Though she no longer

resides in Silicon Valley, she has remained plugged into – and worried – about what is happening with technology, particularly with the accelerating rise of artificial intelligence and its potential for causing even more damage than she thinks has already been done by social media, smartphones and other products that haven't been tightly regulated.

Ms. Swisher said that she hopes *Burn Book* serves as shot across the bow of both the technology industry and governments around the world, a warning that the same mis-

steps that happened during the past 20 years must not be repeated as artificial intelligence seeps into all corners of society.

"Don't get fooled a second time," Ms. Swisher said of what she hopes the book's main takeaway will be. "We need our government to make these (technology-industry) people accountable and that has not happened. We need them to understand consequences because they certainly haven't done us right on the damaging parts of technology. We need to stop letting them off the hook."

ndia on Tuesday announced the names of the four astronaut-designates for the Gaganyaan human spaceflight mission, planned for launch in 2025.

The names of the Indian Air Force (IAF) pilots — Group Captain Prasanth Balakrishnan Nair, Group Captain Ajit Krishnan, Group Captain Angad Pratap and Wing Commander Shubhanshu Shukla — were revealed for the first time in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his visit to the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) here.

The final crew for the mission will be picked from among the four.

Shortlisted through a rigorous selection process, they have been undergoing training in various aspects of space flight, initially in

Russia, and later at the Astronaut Training Facility established by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) in Bengaluru.

The Prime Minister presented the four with 'astronaut wings' on the occasion.

According to ISRO, the Gaganyaan programme is designed to demonstrate indigenous capability to undertake human space flight mission to Low Earth Orbit (LEO). The mission is expected to pave way for a "sustained Indian human space exploration programme" in the long run.

### **Preparations on**

In the run-up to the crewed mission to LEO, IS-RO is in the process of conducting various tests. These include the Integrated Air Drop tests, Test Vehicle Missions, pad Abort Tests. There will be unmanned flights before the actual flight.

ISRO has also announced plans to send astronauts to the moon by 2040.

During his visit, Mr. Modi reviewed the progress on the Gaganyaan Mission and dedicated three technical facilities developed at a cost of about ₹1,800 crore to the nation.

This includes a state-ofthe-art Trisonic Wind Tunnel at the VSSC, integration facilities for the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, and the Semi-cryogenic Integrated Engine and Stage Test Facility (SIET) at the ISRO Propulsion Complex (IPRC) at Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu.





DNA is a polymer made up of units called nucleotides. The nucleotides are made of three different components: a sugar group, a phosphate group, and a base. There are four different bases: adenine, thymine, guanine and cytosine.

#### WHAT HOLDS DNA STRANDS TOGETHER?

DNA strands are held together by hydrogen bonds between bases on adjacent strands. Adenine (A) always pairs with thymine (T), while guanine (G) always pairs with cytosine (C). Adenine pairs with uracil (U) in RNA.

#### FROM DNA TO PROTEINS

The bases on a single strand of DNA act as a code. The letters form three letter codons, which code for amino acids - the building blocks of proteins.

PROTEIN TRANSCRIPTION TRANSLATION

An enzyme, RNA polymerase, transcribes DNA into mRNA (messenger ribonucleic acid). It splits apart the two strands that form the double helix, then reads a strand and copies the sequence of nucleotides. The only difference between the RNA and the original DNA is that in the place of thymine (T), another base with a similar structure is used: uracil (U).

In multicellular organisms, the mRNA carries genetic code out of the cell nucleus, to the cytoplasm. Here, protein synthesis takes place. 'Translation' is the process of turning the mRNA's 'code' into proteins. Molecules called ribosomes carry out this process, building up proteins from the amino acids coded for.



# Supreme Court issues contempt notice to Patanjali, MD Balkrishna

NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Tuesday issued contempt notice against Patanjali Ayurved and its Managing Director Acharya Balkrishna for publishing advertisements of products in violation of the Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954 and its Rules, despite an undertaking given to the court in November.

A Bench of Justices Hima Kohli and Ahsanuddin Amanullah said the company and Mr. Balakrishna had violated its assurance to the Supreme Court on November 21, 2023 to refrain from advertising or branding its products as "permanent relief" for diseases like obesity, blood pressure, asthma, etc., in violation of the 1954 Act.

"What do you mean by

'permanent relief'? There are only two types of permanent reliefs. One, the person dies. Two, the person is cured. There is no third 'permanent relief'," Justice Amanullah addressed the lawyer for Patanjali.

Justice Amanullah asked the Centre, represented by Additional Solicitor General K.M. Nataraj, whether it had taken any action on the issue of Patanjali advertisements violating the law.

Mr. Nataraj said he would file a "better" affida-

vit. He said it was up to the States to implement the provisions of the Act.

During the hearing, the court pointed out that it had on November 21 directed the company to not make any "casual statements" to the print or electronic media about the efficacy of their medicinal products or indulge in any disparaging statements about other disciplines of medicine like allopathy.

#### Order violated

However, a press conference was held by Baba Ramdev, on November 22, the very next day of the Supreme Court order, the Bench observed.

When the court asked how exactly Baba Ramdev was associated with Patanjali, the company's lawyer vaguely responded that he was a yoga guru and a sanvasi. Senior advocate P.S. Patwalia, appearing for the petitioners including the Indian Medical Association (IMA), intervened to point out metaphorically that Baba Ramdev was like "everything and nothing at the same time" to Patanjali.

The Bench directed the company and its Managing Director to file their replies to the contempt notice in two weeks. Meanwhile, the court restrained Patanjali from advertising or branding medicinal products as cures for diseases or disorders specified under the 1954 Act and its Rules.

The court also cautioned the stakeholders in Patanjali from making any statements adverse to any system of medicine in the print or electronic media in any form.

The Bench listed the case on March 19.

# 'Entire country taken for a ride': SC slams Patanjali for misleading ads

THE ENTIRE COUNTRY has been "taken for a ride", the Supreme Court said on Tuesday while restraining till further orders on Patanjali Ayurved, a company co-founded by yoga guru Ramdev and dealing in herbal products, from advertising or

Justice Khanwilkar retired from the Supreme Court in July 2022.



Apart from a Chairperson, the Lokpal can have eight members, four judicial and four non-judicial.



- In 1809, the institution of ombudsman was inaugurated officially in Sweden.
  - In the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Ombudsman as an institution developed and grew most significantly after the Second World War.
  - New Zealand and Norway adopted this system in the year 1962 and it proved to be of great significance in spreading the concept of the ombudsman.

- In India, the concept of constitutional ombudsman was first proposed by the then law minister Ashok Kumar Sen in parliament in the early 1960s.
  - The term Lokpal and Lokayukta were coined by Dr. L. M. Singhvi.
- In 1966, the First Administrative Reforms Commission recommended the setting up of two independent authorities—at the central and state level, to look into complaints against public functionaries, including MPs.

- What are the Key Provisions of the Lokpal and Lokayuktas (Amendment)
   Act, 2016?
- It amended the Lokpal and Lokayukta Act, 2013.
- It also amended section 44 of the 2013 Act that deals with the provision of furnishing of details of assets and liabilities of public servants within 30 days of joining the government service.
- It replaces the time limit of 30 days, now the public servants will make a
  declaration of their assets and liabilities in the form and manner as
  prescribed by the government.



- The judicial member of the Lokpal either a former Judge of the Supreme Court or a former Chief Justice of a High Court.
- The non-judicial member should be an eminent person with impeccable integrity and outstanding ability, having special knowledge and expertise of minimum 25 years in the matters relating to anti-corruption policy, public administration, vigilance, finance including insurance and banking, law and management.
- The term of office for Lokpal Chairman and Members is 5 years or till the age of 70 years.
- The **members are appointed by the president** on the recommendation of a Selection Committee.

The selection committee is composed of the Prime Minister who is the Chairperson, Speaker of Lok Sabha, Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha, Chief Justice of India or a Judge nominated by him/her and One eminent jurist.
For selecting the chairperson and the members, the selection committee constitutes a search panel of at least eight persons.

What comes under the Jurisdiction of Lokpal and its Powers?

Jurisdiction of Lokpal includes Prime Minister, Ministers, members of Parliament, Groups A, B, C and D officers and officials of Central Government.

- The Inquiry Wing of the Lokpal has been vested with the powers of a civil court.
- Lokpal has powers of confiscation of assets, proceeds, receipts and benefits arisen or procured by means of corruption in special circumstances.
- Lokpal has the power to recommend transfer or suspension of public servant connected with allegation of corruption.
- Lokpal has the power to give directions to prevent the destruction of records during the preliminary inquiry.





# Newborns are at a new low, fewer couples marry

*Tokyo:* The number of babies born in Japan last year fell for an eighth straight year to a new low, government data showed on Tuesday. The 758,631 babies born in Japan in 2023 were a 5.1 per cent decline from the previous year, according to the Health and Welfare Ministry. It was the lowest number of births since 1899. The number of marriages fell by 5.9% to 489,281 couples. AP

According to Kingston, from 1995 to 2008, Japan's number of regular workers decreased by 3.8 million while the number of irregular workers increased by 7.6 million.



Japan's population is projected to shrink well into the middle of this century, dropping to an estimated 88 million in 2065 — a 30% decline in 45 years.

# Qualcomm, Jio to bring ₹8,000 | 5G smartphone by 2024-end

## Product targeted at 300 million 2G users

JATIN GROVER New Delhi, February 27

SAN DIEGO-BASED QUALCOMM, a global innovator in wireless products, solutions and technologies, is working with Reliance Jio to develop a 5G smartphone priced below \$99 (around ₹8,000). The phone is likely to be launched by the end of the current calendaryear, Qualcomm's seniorvice-president and general manager of handsets Chris Patrick said at the ongoing World Mobile Congress in Barcelona.

In 2020, Qualcomm Ventures, the investment arm of Qualcomm, had invested ₹730 crore in Jio Platforms, translating into a 0.15% equity stake.



The duo developing a smartphone priced around ₹8,000 is significant as it may accelerate the migration of 2G users to 4G and 5G services. While Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea have 2G users, Jio's network is fully 4G-5G. There are some smartphones priced around ₹8,000 in the market today,

but the Qualcomm-Jio product is expected to be packed with more features — higher RAM (random access memory) and a better processor — which may make it more attractive to consumers.



# Tangail Saree

Bangladeshis annoyed after West Bengal gets GI Tag for Tangail Saree.

<u>Tangail sarees</u> named after the place called Tangail, located in Bangladesh.

Weavers from Tangail region of then East Bengal, migrated to different parts of West Bengal and continued their weaving profession for production of Tangail Sarees.

The Tangail saree is a simplification of Jamdani cotton saree but with minimal designs in body portion, thereby minimizing the labour and price.

The traditional tangail borders had a 'paddo' or lotus pattern, pradeep or lamp pattern apart from popular 'ans par' that was common in Shantipur region.

Materials used - Tangail weavers normally used cotton and the texture is usually high and compact.

Tassar silk yarn, Mercerized cotton yarn, dyed twisted cotton yarn are used as extra warp for making designs in the borders of the sarees.


Jacquards fabrics are used for making designs in the borders.

Coloured yarns are used for both warp and weft and in extra warp also.

### Rani Chennamma






The Campaign is trying to invoke Chennamma's memory to show that women can be the vanguards of safeguarding dignity and justice. Rani Chennamma's bravery is an inspiration to the women of the country.

Her stride and quick thinking to safeguard her homeland can be seen as a testament to her commitment and dedication to protecting her kingdom.



Chenamma was born on 23rd October 1778, in Kagati, a small village in present-day Belagavi district in Karnataka.

After Mallasarja's death in 1816, his eldest son, Shivalingarudra Sarja, ascended the throne. But it wasn't long before Shivalingarudra's health started deteriorating.



At the age of 15, she married Raja Mallasarja of Kittur, who ruled the province until 1816.

Kittur needed an heir apparent to survive. However, Shivalingarudra had no natural heir and Chennamma too had lost her son.



Before his death in 1824, Shivalingarudra adopted a child, Shivalingappa, as the successor. However, the British East India Company refused to recognise Shivalingappa as the successor of the kingdom under the 'Doctrine of Lapse'.



• John Thackery, the British official at Dharwad, launched an attack on Kittur in October 1824.

•

### **Battle Against British:**

In 1824, a fleet of 20,000 British soldiers was positioned on the foothills of the Kittur fort as they attempted to invade the former princely state of Karnataka.

But Rani Chennamma retaliated and killed a British official to protect and safeguard her homeland.

Trained in martial arts and military tactics, she was a formidable leader.

She led her army into battle, employing guerrilla warfare tactics to surprise the British forces

- What is the Doctrine of Lapse?
- It was an annexation policy followed widely by Lord Dalhousie when he was India's Governor-General from 1848 to 1856.
- According to this, any princely state that was under the direct or indirect control of the East India Company where the ruler did not have a legal male heir would be annexed by the company.
  - As per this, any adopted son of the Indian ruler could not be proclaimed as heir to the kingdom.
- By applying the doctrine of lapse, Dalhousie annexed the States
  of:
  - Satara (1848 A.D.), Jaitpur, and Sambalpur (1849 A.D.),
     Baghat (1850 A.D.), Udaipur (1852 A.D.), Jhansi (1853 A.D.), and Nagpur (1854 A.D.).

However, the rights to build, operate, and manage the nuclear stations, as well as fuel management, will remain with the **state-run Nuclear Power Corporation of India Ltd. (NPCIL)** as per legal provisions.



Private companies are anticipated to generate revenue from electricity sales, while NPCIL will operate the projects for a fee.

# KALIA Scheme

It is a cash assistant scheme launched by Odisha Government in 2018 to accelerate Agricultural Prosperity and reduce poverty in the State.

Financial assistance of Rs.25,000 will be given per farm family over 5 seasons.

# Operation AMRITH (Antimicrobial Resistance Intervention for Total Health)

 The Kerala Drug Control Department launched Operation AMRITH to prevent the overuse of antibiotics in the state.

### Background

• In 2011, the Indian government introduced the **H1 rule** to prohibit the **over-the-counter (OTC) sales** of antibiotics without a prescription, responding to the growing concern over antimicrobial resistance (AMR).

- In 2013, the rule to limit the OTC restriction was limited to second- and third-line antibiotics, allowing the sale of first-line antibiotics without a prescription.
  - Step was taken to ensure that life-saving antibiotics remained accessible to the public, especially in remote areas
- Operation AMRITH enforces the original H1 rule, mandating a doctor's prescription for acquiring any class of antibiotics.

**BRIC-THSTI Faridabad and IIT Madras** researchers have developed an Indiaspecific model to determine the **age of a foetus in a pregnant woman** in the second and third trimesters precisely.

About

Currently, the **age of a foetus (gestational age, GA)** is determined using a formula developed for **Western populations** and are likely to be erroneous when applied in the later part of pregnancy due to variations in the growth of the foetus in the Indian population.
