





### India's fight against rare diseases

he tragic death of 19-year-old child actress Suhani Bhatnagar from dermatomyositis, a rare sorder that causes inflamm in muscles, came in the same in miscies, came in the same month as Rare Disease Day, which is marked today. The last day of February every year is consecrated to support crores of individuals who, because of their rare medical conditions, have long

rare medical conditions, have long been neglected and stigmatised. According to the World Health Organization, rare diseases afflict 1 or less per 1,000 population. Barely 5% of the over 7,000 known diseases worldwide are treatable. Most patients typically receive only basic treatment that alleviates symptoms. Some require exorbitantly priced antidotes and supportive medication throughout their lives, which they can't afford.

### Rare diseases in India India accounts for one-third of the

global rare disease incidence, with ver 450 identified diseases These range from widely known ones such as Spinal Muscular Atrophy and Gaucher's disease to Atrophy and Gaucher's disease to lesser-known ones such as Mucopolysaccharidosis type I and Whipple's disease. Roughly about 8 crore-IO crore Indians suffer from one rare disease or another; over 75% are children. Yet these diseases are largely controlled. diseases are largely overlooked. Resource constraints apart, India languishes near the bottom on awareness, diagnosis, and drug

development for rare diseases. 





# Singapore's shrinking population: Fertility rate below 1 % for first time

SINGAPORE, FACING a dwindling population and a manpower shortage, has seen its resident total fertility rate (TFR) drop to an estimated 0.97 per cent in 2023, the first time it has dropped below one per cent in the country's history.

The TFR, which refers to the average number of babies each woman would have during her reproductive years, fell from 1.04 in 2022 and 1.12 in 2021, Minister in the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) Indranee Rajah told Parliament on Wednesday.

The birth rate remains below the replacement rate of 2.1 – the level at which a population replaces itself. The latest figure places Singapore among countries with the lowest birth rates globally, with South Korea topping the list at 0.72 in 2023, The Straits Times newspaper reported on Wednesday.

There were 26,500 resident marriages and 30,500 resident births in 2023, said Indranee, who oversees the National Population and Talent Division, which is under the Strategy Group in the PMO.

"Overall, however, there were fewer resident marriages and births annually on average

over the last five years, compared to the preceding five-year period," she said.

Singapore is confronted with the "twin demographic challenges of a persistently low fertility rate and an ageing population", the daily quoted the minister as saying. These challenges are not unique to Singapore, she added. Neighbouring Malaysia and Thailand also saw their fertility rates fall in 2022.

Indranee gave various reasons for Singapore's low fertility, including the Covid-19 pandemic disrupting some couples' marriage and parenthood plans.

She added, "Others cite concerns about the financial costs of

child-raising, pressures to be an excellent parent, or difficulties managing work and family commitments." Indranee said the falling numbers reflect a generational change in priorities, and young people may not even see marriage or parenthood as important life goals.

The falling TFR has serious implications for Singapore's future, she cautioned. She said, "With fewer births, we will face a shrinking workforce. It will be increasingly challenging to maintain our dynamism, attract global businesses and create opportunities for the next generation." She said countries such as South Korea and Italy have already experi-

enced this, and they are grappling with economic slowdowns and falling wages.

In 2023, the government announced various measures to support marriage and parenthood, including doubling the government-paid paternity leave and increasing Baby Bonus benefits. It has also supported the adoption of flexible work arrangements as part of efforts to help working parents manage jobs and families.

A tripartite work group is developing guidelines on flexible work arrangements that will be compulsory for employers to follow once they are implemented later in 2024, the Singapore daily reported. PTI

**RELIANCE INDUSTRIES AND** Walt Disney on Wednesday announced the merger of their television and streaming media companies in India — Viacom 18 and Star India — creating an \$8.5-billion entertainment juggernaut. The move has been

in the works since December 2023.

As part of the transaction, the media undertaking of Viacom18 will be merged into Star India through a court-

approved scheme of arrangement. In addition, RIL has agreed to invest \$1.4 billion (₹11,500 crore) into the JV for its growth strategy. While RIL will own a 16.34% stake in the combined entity, Viacom18 and Disney will have 46.82% and 36.84%, respectively. Nita Ambani will be the chairperson of the JV and Uday Shankar will be the vice-chairperson.

pleted by the last quarter of calendaryear 2024 or by early 2025, the companies said, subject to regulatory and shareholder approvals.


Disneywill provide a content licence to the JV and may also contribute certain additional media assets to the JV, it said. This will include a licence to more than 30,000 Disney content assets apart from the exclusive rights to distribute Disney films and productions in India.

At a broader level, the JV will be one of the leading TV and digital streaming platforms for entertainment and sports content in India, with more than 100 TV channels like Star Plus, Colors and Star Sports.

# Maharashtra Exempts Private Schools from RTE Quota Admissions

- The Maharashtra school education department recently issued a gazette notification exempting private unaided schools from the mandatory 25% admission quota for disadvantaged groups and weaker sections under certain conditions.
- As per The Right Of Children To Free And Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (RTE Act) (section 12.1(C)), unaided schools are obligated to ensure that 25% of Class 1 students admitted must belong to "weaker section and disadvantaged group in the neighbourhood".



- Right to Free and Compulsory Elementary Education: Children aged 6-14 years are entitled to free, compulsory education in local schools, with enrollment in an ageappropriate class for those above 6 not in school.
  - Aided schools must also offer education for free, proportionate to their funding, but not less than 25%.





# Countries with higher per capita GDP invest more in R&D




# Brain Drain
