The famous Cuttack Rupa Tarakasi (silver filigree) has been given the Geographical Indication (GI) tag by the Geographical Indications Registry in Chennai. The application for this was filed by the Odisha State Cooperative Handicrafts Corporation Limited and was facilitated by the Department of Textile and Handicrafts, Government of Odisha. Filigree has been traditionally associated with fine craftsmanship and luxurious design in classical jewellery.

The historical records attached along with the GI filing mention: "Archaeological evidence suggests that filigree was incorporated into jewellery as early as 3,500 BCE in Mesopotamia where it is practised even today as Telkari work. According to historians, there is every possibility that the Tarakasi work reached Cuttack from Persia through Indonesia some 500 years ago by sea trade. The argument is based on similar workmanship seen in both Cuttack and Indonesia."

Tripura Risa Textile, Hyderabad Lac Bangles, Majuli Mask of Assam and the Assam Majuli Manuscript Painting are other products that got GI tag.

The Majuli Mask of Assam is made in different varieties and sizes as they are mainly divided into different categories – *Mukha bhaona* covers the face; the *Lotokoi* hanging mask, which is bigger in size, extends to the chest; while *Cho Mukha* (huge mask) covers the head and body.

Status of GI Tags Registration:

Compared to other nations, India lags in GI registration.

Till December 2023, Intellectual Property India received just 1,167 applications, of which only 547 products have been registered, as per the GI Registry.

> Germany leads in GI registrations, with 15,566 registered products, followed by China (7,247), as per 2020 data with the World Intellectual Property Organization.

- Globally, wines and spirits comprise 51.8% of registered GIs, followed by agricultural products and foodstuffs at 29.9%.
 - In India, handicraft (about 45%) and agriculture (about 30%) comprise the majority of the GI products.

- Concerns Regarding the GI Tags in India:
- Concerns with GI Act and Registration Process:
 - The GI Act, 1999 framed over two decades ago, requires timely amendments to address current challenges.
 - **Registration forms and application processing times** need simplification for easier compliance.
 - The current application acceptance ratio is only about 46% in India.

- Lack of **suitable institutional development** hampers effective implementation of GI protection mechanisms.
- Producers often struggle post-GI registration due to a lack of guidance and support.
- Ambiguity in Producers' Definition:
 - The lack of clarity in **defining "producers" in the GI Act of 1999** leads to the involvement of intermediaries.
 - Intermediaries benefit from GIs, diluting the intended advantages for genuine producers.

CM Bhagwant Singh Mann Leads Launch of 'Mission Samarth' for Punjab Schools

PUNJAB launched 'Mission Samarth' in government schools. Under the dynamic leadership of CM Bhagwant Singh Mann, 'Mission Samarth' aimed to strengthen foundational literacy and numeracy skills of children from classes 3 to 8. The Punjab Government geared up to enhance the learning enhancement program, 'Mission Samarth', in government schools.

Under Mission Samarth, teachers identified 'weak' children through baseline tests and categorized them into two groups—Level 1 and Level 2'. Special classes and study materials were provided to bring them up to the required learning levels according to their age and grade. The project focused on

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English, Mathematics, and Punjabi.

"It was not the first time that such baseline tests were conducted and weak students were given special focus. A similar exercise was undertaken earlier under the 'Parho Punjab, Parhao Punjab' project during the previous government. However, this time, the entire exercise was further refined to ensure no student was left behind. Special learning materials were provided to teachers to help them focus on students who needed extra coaching."

Teachers from primary and upper-primary sections had already been trained on how to conduct baseline tests under Mission Samarth, and the project was launched. It was a two-month project, and students received extra coaching until December and were tested again.

"Several studies and surveys, including ASER and NAS, suggested that a large number of children in Punjab still could not read basic text nor do simple calculations. The aim was to identify such children and provide them support and a conducive learning environment to bring them up to the required learning levels. Teams from the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) prepared special learning materials, which would soon reach schools. The project was the brainchild of Punjab Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains and was inspired by CM Bhagwant Singh Mann's vision of Transforming Education in the Punjab State.

INTERNATIONAL DAYS CELEBRATING WOMEN

International Women's Day is a global holiday celebrated annually on March 8 as a focal point in the women's rights movement. Kochi's Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL) was in the national limelight recently when PM Narendra Modi inaugurated ₹4,000-crore worth infrastructure projects and expressed confidence the port city in Kerala would soon become South Asia's largest ship-repair centre.

With the addition of a new dry dock and international ship repair facility costing ₹2,800 crore approximately, the public sector unit is raring to achieve new highs.

Madhu S. Nair, CMD, CSL, says opportunities abound in the shipbuilding market, given the growing demand globally. "We are inspired by the PM's speech during his recent visit, which is a major im-



petus for CSL and India's shipbuilding infrastructure. We are not expecting any immediate outcome after the PM's statement. But we believe it would help us pick up further orders."

The shipbuilding sector is set for greater growth primarily due to the challenges faced by ageing fleets the world over in meeting the new regulatory requirements, thus accelerating the demand for fleet replacements.

India commands less than 1% of the \$140-billion global shipbuilding market. "However, going by the order intake over the past 2-3 years at CSL and other yards in the country, we could be looking at much better numbers in the coming years," he says. In the area of ship re-

Focus on rebuilding economy amid huge budgetary deficit

PAKISTAN'S NEWLY-ELECTED Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday raked up the Kashmir issue in his maiden address but pledged to improve ties with all leading nations, including the country's neighbours.

Shehbaz said that Pakistan would not become part of any "great game" and his government would increase the number of friends. He pledged to build and improve ties with all leading nations, including neighbours.

"We will keep ties with neighbours on the basis of equality," Shehbaz, 72, said as he easily won the election in the National Assembly to become Pakistan's prime minister for a second time.

He said that his government would work hard and set a goal to become a member of G20 coun-

tries by 2030. The G20 or Group of 20 is an intergovernmental forum of the world's major developed and developing economies.

He, however, raked up the Kashmir issue and equated it with Palestine. "Let's all come together [...] and the National Assembly should pass a resolution for the freedom of Kashmiris and Palestinians," he added.

Shehbaz, who was the consensus candidate of the PML-N and the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), received 201 votes in the 336-member house.

Shehbaz said that the country was facing challenges primarily due to the fragile economy. He said that he was starting his tenure when the country was facing a budgetary deficit of more than one trillion rupees.

"How we will pay the salaries for armed forces and how to pay the civil servants," he wondered and added that reforming the economy was the biggest challenge faced by the country. He promised to bring investment into the country and create economic conditions that would spur economic growth. He highlighted that the energy sector was crumbling due to the accumulating debt owed by the country to the power-producing companies.

Objective: The GROW report aims to facilitate restoration projects for achieving national commitments of Land Degradation Neutrality and restoring 26 million hectares of degraded land by 2030, as well as creating an additional carbon sink of 2.5 to 3 billion tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent.



- The report highlights that India possesses approximately 55.76 million hectares of wastelands, comprising 16.96% of the total geographical area (TGA) of the country.
- These degraded lands have suffered from reduced productivity and biodiversity due to various natural and human-induced factors. However, the report suggests greening and restoring these wastelands through agroforestry.



- What is the GROW Portal?
- The GROW portal is hosted on the Bhuvan platform, ensuring universal access to state and district-level data related to agroforestry suitability. Through the portal, users can access detailed maps and assessments of agroforestry suitability across different regions of India.

Shri Morarji Desai Birth Anniversary PIB

The Prime Minister paid tributes to Shri Morarji Desai on his birth anniversary.

Born on 29th February 1896 in Bhadeli village, Gujarat.

Graduated from Wilson Civil Service in Bombay and served as a Deputy Collector for twelve years.

Morarji Desai was an Indian politician and activist who served as the fourth Prime Minister of India from 1977 to 1979.

The Forty-fourth Amendment of the Constitution of India was enacted during his tenure as Prime Minister.



Morarji Desai joined Congress during the Civil Disobedience Movement. Imprisoned thrice and actively participated in individual Satyagraha and Quit India Movement.



He became Chief Minister of Bombay in 1952 and also served as Minister for Commerce and Industry, then Finance Minister.



Resigned under the Kamraj Plan and led the Administrative Reforms Commission. Became Prime Minister in 1977.

The **implementation of PM Janjati Adivasi Nyay Maha Abhiyaan (PM-JANMAN)** has been slowing down due to simultaneous data collection of beneficiaries under the scheme.

About the PM-JANMAN

The Union Cabinet approved the scheme in **2023** and the scheme is implemented during **FY 2023-24 to 2025-26.**

The Mission would provide **PVTG families and communities (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups)** essential services.

'Vikramaditya Vedic Clock'

- The world's first Vedic clock, the 'Vikramaditya Vedic Clock,' based on Indian 'panchang' calculations, was inaugurated at Jantar Mantar in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh.
- Ujjain is located at the precise point of interaction with the zero meridian and the Tropic of Cancer. According to Hindu astronomical belief, Ujjain was once considered India's central meridian, determining the country's time zones and time differences.

 Jantar Mantar, an astronomical observatory (a UNESCO World Heritage site) constructed by Maharaja Jai Singh II, can be found in the following cities in India:

3 new moons discovered around Uranus and Neptune

Three new moons, <u>one around Uranus and two around</u> <u>Neptune</u>, have been confirmed by the <u>International</u> <u>Astronomical Union</u>.

- Uranus' moon, <u>S/2023 U1, is about 5 miles across</u> making it one of the <u>smallest known moons around any of the eight</u> <u>planets in the solar system</u>, and will be <u>named after a</u> <u>Shakespeare character</u>,
- Neptune's moons, S/2002 N5 and S/2021 N1, will be named after the Nereids — the daughters of the sea god Nereus from Greek mythology.



Context: Saturn has regained its title as the planet with the most moons in the solar system. The discovery of 62 new moons brings Saturn's total to 145, surpassing Jupiter, which has 95 officially recognized moons.
