he Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court on Tuesday acquitted former Delhi University Professor G.N. Saibaba and five others in a case under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act for alleged Maoist links, saying the prosecution could not prove the case against them beyond reasonable doubt.

Within hours, the Maharashtra government approached the Supreme Court seeking an urgent hearing, after it failed to convince the High Court to stay the implementation of the judgment.

A Bench of Justice Vinay Joshi and Justice Valmiki S.A. Menezes also set aside the life sentence awarded to Prof. Saibaba and the other accused – Mahesh Tirki, Hem Mishra, Pandu Narote, Vijay Tirki and Prashant Rahi – by a sessions court in 2017, and held the sanction for prosecution under UAPA as "null and void".

Ques 1: What is Maoism?

Answer: Maoism is a form of communism developed by Mao Tse Tung. It is a doctrine to capture State power through a combination of armed insurgency, mass mobilization and strategic alliances. The Maoists also use propaganda and disinformation against State institutions as other components of their insurgency doctrine. Mao called this process, the 'Protracted Peoples War', where the emphasis is on 'military line' to capture power.

Ques 2: What is the central theme of Maoist ideology?

Answer: The central theme of Maoist ideology is the use of violence and armed insurrection as a means to capture State power. 'Bearing of arms is non-negotiable' as per the Maoist insurgency doctrine. The maoist ideology glorifies violence and the 'Peoples Liberation Guerrilla Army' (PLGA) cadres are trained specifically in the worst forms of violence to evoke terror among the population under their domination. However, they also use the subterfuge of mobilizing people over issues of purported inadequacies of the existing system, so that they can be indoctrinated to take recourse to violence as the only means of redressal.

Ques 3: Who are the Indian Maoists?

Answer: The largest and the most violent Maoist formation in India is the Communist Party of India (Maoist). The CPI (Maoist) is an amalgamation of many splinter groups, which culminated in the merger of two largest Maoist groups in 2004; the Communist Party of India (Marxist-Leninist), People War and the Maoist Communist Centre of India. The CPI (Maoist) and all its front organizations formations have been included in the list of banned terrorist organizations under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.

What is the Current LWE Situation in the Country?

- According to the government, Maoist violence in the country has gone down by 77% since 2010.
- As per the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) the number of resultant deaths (security forces + civilians) has come down by 90% from the all-time high of 1,005 in 2010 to 98 in 2022.
- The influence of Maoists and associated violence has been falling consistently in the country because of multiple factors:

- A stronger push by security forces in Maoist strongholds.
- Roads and civic amenities reach the interior to a greater extent than earlier.
- A general disenchantment with the **Maoist ideology** among the youth, which has deprived the insurgent movement of new leadership.

<u>The agreement says Beijing will provide free military assistance to Maldives</u> to foster ties between the two nations; Muizzu says no Indian troops to remain on island, 'in uniform or in civil clothes'

ays after a technical team from India arrived in the Maldives to replace troops that President Mohamed Muizzu wanted removed, the Maldivian Defence Ministry announced signing a military pact with China.

Maldives's Minister of Defence Mohamed Ghassan Maumoon and Major General Zhang Baoqun, Deputy Director at China's Office for International Military Cooperation, on Monday signed an agreement on "China's provision of military assistance gratis to the Republic of Maldives, fostering stronger bilateral ties", the Maldivian Defence Ministry said. The two sides also held bilateral talks on military cooperation.

The Ministry's post on social media platform X did not mention details of what the agreement entails. Further, China donated 12 green ambulances to the Maldives's Health Ministry on Monday. The development is in line with the two countries agreeing to "elevate" China-Maldives relations to a "comprehensive strategic cooppartnership". erative during Mr. Muizzu's fiveday state visit to China in January.

Maldivian Foreign Minister Moosa Zameer posted on X, "Delighted to host the China EXIM Bank delegation, and the Chinese military delegation for lunch today. We had fruitful discussions on bolstering our economic and security partnerships between the two countries. Looking forward to continued collaboration."

It also coincides with New Delhi's apparent compromise with Male, agreeing to withdraw its troops stationed in the island nation, instead replacing them with a technical team to help operate India-gifted aircraft. The decision was made amid Mr. Muizzu's persistent calls for the removal of Indian troops, a campaign promise-turnedofficial pledge made by the leader. Following bilateral discussions between a highlevel core group, the two sides in early February reached a consensus on Indian troops leaving the Indian Ocean archipelago by May 10, in phases.

Addressing a public event on Monday, Mr. Muizzu reassured his supporters that Indian troops will no longer be stationed in the Maldives after the date, "either in uniform or in civil clothes". He appeared to be responding to critics claiming that Indian soldiers had returned to the island nation in civil attire.

Bitter back and forth

Meanwhile, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's recent comments at an event in New Delhi, where he said that "big bullies don't provide USD 4.5 billion in aid when the neighbours are in trouble", referring to Indian assistance to Sri Lanka during its crisis in 2022, have drawn wide attention in the Maldives.

Interpreting it as a "swipe at" Mr. Muizzu, several Maldivian media outlets reported the remarks, linking them to Mr. Muizzu's media comments soon after his return from China in January.

"Maldives may be small, but that doesn't give others the licence to bully the country," Mr. Muizzu had said. During his China visit, the Maldivian leader also urged Chinese travellers to reclaim their top spot in tourist arrivals to the island nation. India was the largest source market last year, but has since moved to the sixth spot, following the "boycott Maldives" campaign that went viral on Indian social media earlier this year.

According to the Maldivian Tourism Ministry's latest figures, China accounts for 12.8 % of the total number of visitors – 4,31,002 as of March 3 – recorded in 2024, while India accounts for 6.4 %. Earlier this year, Beijing said, "The relations between China and the Maldives now stand at a new historical starting point."

Australia unveiled plans to ramp up investment in Southeast Asia on Tuesday, setting aside \$1.3 billion to bolster trade in a region of rising economic might.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese announced the funding as leaders from the 10-nation Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) forum met in Melbourne for a three-day summit.

"The government I lead has made it clear. More than any other region, Southeast Asia is where Australia's future lies," Mr. Albanese told a business forum on the summit's sidelines.

Following a series of bruising disputes, Australia has increasingly looked

Australia's new funding package will provide export financing and loans geared largely toward infrastructure and renewable energy projects.

Why Lakshadweep base INS Jatayu matters

AMRITA NAYAK DUTTA NEW DELHI, MARCH 5

ON WEDNESDAY, Naval Detachment Minicoy will be commissioned as INS Jatayu, an upgraded naval base, marking an important milestone in the Indian Navy's resolve to incrementally augment security infrastructure at the strategic Lakshadweep Islands.

While India has had a naval detachment in Minicoy on the southernmost atoll of the archipelago since the 1980s, INS Jatayu will effectively be the country's second naval base in Lakshadweep. The Navy's first base on the islands, INS Dweeprakshak in Kavaratti, was commissioned in 2012.

INS Jatayu will be commissioned days after Prime Ministers Narendra Modi and Pravind Jugnauth of Mauritius jointly inaugurated an airstrip and a jetty that India has built on the Mauritian island of Agaléga off the coast of Africa in the western Indian Ocean.

Names of ships, bases, and detachments of the Indian Navy carry the prefix INS.

The Lakshadweep Islands

Lakshadweep, "a hundred thousand is-



lands" in Sanskrit and Malayalam, is an archipelago of 36 islands located between 220 km and 440 km from Kochi. The islands, only 11 of which are inhabited, have a total area of only 32 sq km.

The Lakshadweep are part of a chain of coralline islands in the Indian Ocean that includes Maldives to the south, and the Chagos archipelago farther beyond. Given their location in the Indian Ocean, the Lakshadweep are of huge strategic importance to India. Minicoy straddles vital Sea Lines of Communications (SLOCs) — the world's main maritime highways — including the Eight Degree Channel (between Minicoy and Maldives) and the Nine Degree Channel (between Minicoy and the main cluster of Lakshadweep Islands). In consequence, the Lakshadweep Islands are also vulnerable to marine pollution.

INS Jatayu naval base

The existing Naval Detachment Minicoy, which is under the operational command of

the operational command of the Naval Officer-in-Charge (Lakshadweep), will be commissioned as INS Jatayu.

A naval detachment has administrative, logistics, and medical facilities. INS Jatayu will be upgraded to a naval base with additional infrastructure such as an airfield, housing, and personnel, after obtaining the requisite environmental and other clearances.

While the fragile ecology of the island may pose challenges for the construction of a jetty, there are plans to construct a new airfield that will be capable of operating both military and civil aircraft.

Teeth to Navy operations

The basing of an independent unit with requisite infrastructure and resources will enhance the overall operational capability of the Navy in the islands. The establishment of the base is in line with the government's focus on comprehensive development of the islands.

The Navy has also said that the base will

enhance its operational reach, facilitate its anti-piracy and anti-narcotics operations in the western Arabian Sea, and augment its capability as the first the region

responder in the region.

With the commissioning of INS Jatayu, the Navy will add to its strength on the western seaboard. The proposed airfield will allow operations for a range of aircraft, including P8I maritime reconnaissance aircraft and fighter jets, and extend the Navy's reach and operational surveillance capabilities at a time when India is seeking to counter the growing Chinese influence in the Indian Ocean Region.

This has an immediate bearing at a time when India's relations with the Maldives have come under strain since the election of the pro-China President Mohamed Muizzu.

Musk loses world's richest person title to Jeff Bezos

FOR THE FIRST time in more than nine months, Elon Musk is no longer the world's richest person. Musk lost his position atop the Bloomberg Billionaires Index to Jeff Bezos after shares in Tesla tumbled 7.2% on Monday. Musk now has a net worth of \$197.7 billion; Bezos' fortune is \$200.3 billion.

It's the first time that Bezos, 60, the founder of Amazon, has topped Bloomberg's ranking of the richest people since 2021.

The wealth gap between Musk, 52, and Bezos, which at one point was as wide as \$142 billion, has been shrinking as Amazon and Tesla shares move in opposite directions. While both are among the so-called Magnificent Seven stocks that have propelled US equity markets, Amazon shares have more than doubled since late 2022 and are within striking dis-



tance of a record high. Tesla is down about 50% from its 2021 peak.

Tesla shares fell on Monday after preliminary data showed shipments from its factory in Shanghai slumped to the lowest in more than a year. Amazon, meanwhile, is coming off its best online sales growth since early in the pandemic.

Pay Package

Musk's wealth could take a further hit after a Delaware judge struck down his \$55 billion pay package at Tesla, where he's chief executive. The decision took the side of an investor who'd challenged Musk's compensation plan, which had been the largest in history.

Options that were included in the voided plan are one of Musk's largest assets, alongside his stakes in Tesla and SpaceX. The Bloomberg index continues to include them in its calculations of his wealth. The vast majority of Bezos's fortune comes from his 9% stake in Amazon. He's the online retailer's largest shareholder.

For Bezos, being atop the wealth rankings is a familiar perch. He first overtook Microsoft co-founder Bill Gates as the world's richest person in 2017. But a massive rally in Tesla shares left Bezos jockeying with Musk for much of 2021 for the top spot. **—BLOOMBERG**

- What are the Highlights of the Recent Household Consumption Expenditure Survey?
- About:
- The Household Consumption Expenditure Survey (HCES) is conducted by the National Statistical Office (NSO) every 5 years.

- It is designed to collect information on the consumption of goods and services by households.
- The data collected in HCES is also utilized for deriving various other macroeconomic indicators such as Gross Domestic Product (GDP), poverty rates, and Consumer Price Inflation (CPI).
- NITI Aayog has stated that the latest consumer expenditure survey indicated that poverty has come down to 5% in the country.
- The findings of the last HCES, conducted in 2017-18 were not released after the government cited "data quality" issues.

- Increase in MPCE:
- It reveals a 33.5% increase in MPCE in urban households since 2011-12, reaching ₹3,510, while rural India's MPCE increased by 40.42% to ₹2,008.
- In 2022-23, 46% of rural household expenditure and 39% of urban household expenditure were on food items.



Distribution of MPCE by Population Percentiles:

The **bottom 5% of India's rural population,** ranked by MPCE, **has an average MPCE of Rs. 1,373** while it is Rs. **2,001 for the same category of population in the urban areas.**

India's First Dolphin Research Centre

- India's inaugural National Dolphin Research Centre (NDRC) marks a significant milestone in the conservation efforts for the endangered Gangetic dolphin (Platanista gangetica).
- Located strategically near the Ganga river in Patna, Bihar, the NDRC aims to be a hub for comprehensive research on various aspects of Gangetic dolphins, including behavior, survival skills, and causes of mortality.

 Bihar is home to around half of the estimated 3,000 Gangetic dolphins in India.
 The Ganges river dolphin, discovered in 1801, historically inhabits the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Meghna and Karnaphuli-Sangu river systems in India, Nepal, and Bangladesh.

National aquatic animal of India

Facts

- Can only live in freshwater; prefer deep water
- Essentially blind; hunts by emitting ultrasonic sound
- Can't breathe in water; must surface every 30-120 seconds for air
- Also called 'susu' because of sound they make while breathing

Habitat & Distribution

- Distributed in Ganges and Brahmaputra River basins of India, Nepal and Bangladesh.
- Distribution range in India covers 7 states namely, Assam, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Bihar, Jharkhand and West Bengal.

Cavum Cloud

- Recently, NASA's Terra satellite captured a cluster of cavum clouds over the Gulf of Mexico off Florida's west coast.
- About the Cavum Clouds
- These clouds appear as if a large circle or ellipse has been neatly cut from the clouds, leaving feathery wisps in the middle of the hole.



• Formation:

- Cavum clouds are formed when aeroplanes fly through banks of altocumulus clouds, mid-level clouds that contain supercooled water droplets.
- As air moves around the plane, a process called **adiabatic expansion** can make the droplets freeze into ice crystals.
- The ice crystals eventually grow heavy and fall out of the sky, leaving a hole in the cloud layer.
- The falling ice crystals are visible in the centre of the holes as wispy trails of precipitation that never reach the ground – features called virga.

Venice Biennale



- The 60th edition of the Venice Biennale, known as "the Olympics of the art world", will open on April 20, 2024.
- Venice Biennale
- The Venice Biennale is one of the biggest and most prestigious art fairs in the world, beginning in 1895.
- Biennale is an Italian word which means 'every other year'. Over the years, however, it has come to mean a large international exhibition that takes place every two years.

 Biennales feature contemporary art by artists from various countries that are usually linked by a common curatorial theme, providing a framework for exploring contemporary social, economic and political ideas in an international context.

- India's participation
- India made its debut at the Biennale in 1954. Recording robust sales, the exhibition comprised over 50 paintings of masters such as M F Husain, S H Raza, Jamini Roy, Amrita Sher-Gil, and Francis Newton Souza.
- After 1954, the country officially participated in the event in 2011. The exhibition was organised by Lalit Kala Akademi and curated by Ranjit Hoskote. It featured works by artists like Zarina Hashmi, Gigi Scaria, Praneet Soi, and the Desire Machine Collective.

Zombie Deer Disease

- Zombie deer disease is spreading and rising in USA and scientists are concerned that it could jump to humans.
- It is a <u>contagious degenerative disease</u>, also known as <u>chronic</u> <u>wasting disease</u> (CWD).

The 1st case of chronic wasting disease (CWD) was discovered in Colorado in 1967.

Caused by – <u>A prion.</u>

Prions are misfolded proteins that can cause normal proteins in the brain to misfold as well, leading to neurological degeneration.

Science Special

Zombie Deer Disease Found In Many US Animals, Scientists Worried Of Potential Spread To Humans. Here's Why

A abp LIVE

- As the degeneration continues, the afflicted animal's brain cells die, ultimately resulting in its death.
- Vulnerable species deer, elk, reindeer, sika deer, and moose.
- **Spread** So far in Canada, the US, Norway, Sweden and South Korea.
- **Transmission** They are reportedly spread via bodily fluids like saliva, urine, blood, or feces.

- **Diagnosis** It can only be confirmed by testing brain or lymph node samples from dead animals.
- There is *no reliable test for live animals* yet.
- **Prevention** By <u>reducing the contact and transmission</u> of prions among cervids and their environment.
- **Treatment** There are <u>no treatments or vaccines</u> available.
• In Humans – While there is <u>no conclusive evidence that CWD</u> <u>can directly infect humans</u>, the possibility remains a point of concern.

- Prion diseases, such as Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (CJD) in humans and "mad cow disease" in cattle, have shown that they can cross the species barrier with devastating consequences.
- The outbreak of mad cow disease in Britain, for instance, resulted in the slaughter of millions of cattle and led to 178 human deaths attributed to the human variant of the disease since 1995.

PROJECT SEABIRD

The Project Seabird is a naval infrastructure project that involves a *naval base in Karwar, Karnataka*.

- The project was originally conceived by <u>Admiral OS Dawson</u>, the Chief of Naval Staff in the early 1980s.
 - The 1st phase of this project was commissioned in 2005 and the 2nd phase is yet to be completed.

Once completed, it will be the largest naval base in the Asia.

India's 1st Green Hydrogen plant in stainless steel sector

OHOH

- Union Minister for Steel and Civil Aviation recently inaugurated India's 1st Green Hydrogen Plant in Stainless Steel Sector in Haryana.
- It will be the world's 1st off-grid Green Hydrogen plant for the stainless-steel industry and the world's 1st Green Hydrogen plant with rooftop & floating solar.

- This project's target is to reduce carbon emissions by around 2,700 Metric Tonnes per annum and 54,000 tons of CO2 emissions over next 2 decades.
- Green hydrogen refers to hydrogen produced from water electrolysis, splitting water into hydrogen and oxygen by using renewable energy-powered electrolysers.



he World Economic Forum's (WEF) Centre for the 4th *Industrial Revolution (C4IR) was recently launched in Hyderabad.*

It is the 1st thematic centre focused on healthcare and life sciences in Telangana.

The C4IR focuses on 3 key areas - real-world evidence, healthcare analytics and informatics, and software as a medical device.
