he Supreme Court on Wednesday condemned the illegal felling of over 6,000 trees to construct buildings, ostensibly for "eco-tourism" at the Jim Corbett National Park in Uttarakhand, as a "classic case" of nexus between politicians and officials working to ransack the environment for shortterm commercial ends.

"The present case depicts a sorry state of affairs of human greed devastating one of the most celebrated abodes of tigers i.e. the Corbett Tiger Reserve," a three-judge Bench headed by Justice B.R. Gavai observed.

The court also directed the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change to form a specialised committee to study and recommend whether tiger safaris should be permitted in the buffer areas of a tiger reserve.

'Laws ignored'

On the "huge devastation" caused by the illegal felling, the court said it was "amazed at the audacity" of former Uttarakhand Forest Minister and Congress leader Harak Singh Rawat and former Divisional Forest Officer Kishan Chand for giving forest and wildlife conservation laws a complete go-by and throwing the public trust doctrine "into the dustbin".

The court said the cost of restoration would be recovered from these errant individuals and officials. The money would be used exclusively for forest restoration. The Bench said in case

The Bench said in case the committee's recommendations were in favour of having tiger safaris in peripheral areas of tiger reserves, it should recommend guidelines for their operation. The guidelines would be applied on a pan-India basis.

The committee has to file its report in three months.

The court said safaris already existing like the one in Pakhro zone at Corbett, need not be disturbed. It, however, directed the Uttarakhand government to establish an animal rescue centre in the vicinity of the safari.

- Jim Corbett National Park was established in 1936 as India's first national park.
- Originally named Hailey National Park after Sir Malcolm Hailey, it was renamed in 1955-56 to honor Jim Corbett, a renowned conservationist and author who played a key role in its creation.
- The park is located in the Nainital district of Uttarakhand state in northern India. The nearest city is Ramnagar, located about 12 km away.

- The total area of the Jim Corbett National Park is 1,318 km2 (509 sq mi). This includes 520 km2 (200 sq mi) of core area that forms Jim Corbett National Park, plus 797 km2 (307 sq mi) of buffer area consisting of the Sonanadi Wildlife Sanctuary and reserve forests.
- Jim Corbett National Park is part of the larger Corbett Tiger Reserve which was first to come under the Project Tiger initiative launched in 1973.
- The elevation of the park ranges from 1,300 ft to 4,000 ft (396 m to 1,220 m) above sea level. It has a variety of landscapes including ravines, ridges, streams, marshes and plateaus. The Ramganga River flows through the Patli Dun valley in the center of the reserve.

- The major rivers flowing through Jim Corbett National Park are the Ramganga River, Kosi River, Sonanadi River, and Mandal River.
- The Ramganga River is considered the "lifeline" of the park, originating from the Gairsain region of the Lesser Himalayas.
- It flows roughly 40 km east to west through the park before entering the Gangetic plains near Kalagarh.
- The river is supplemented by tributaries like the Sonanadi, Mandal and Palain Rivers within the park.

HC quashes Karnataka's decision to hold board exams for Classes 5, 8, 9, 11

In a setback to the State government, the Karnataka High Court on Wednesday quashed the State's decision to hold board examinations for Classes 5, 8, 9, and 11 from the academic year 2023-24 and said it was taken without following the due process of law.

The court said the scheme of holding board exams was taken without framing the rules under Sections 22 and 145 of the Karnataka Education Act, 1983, which mandates that the government will have to frame rules for the implementation of the exami-

nation system besides seeking views from stakeholders prior to finalising such rules.

"When the government intends to bring changes to the examination system affecting such a large number of students, it would be desirable as well as mandatory to follow the democratic procedure stipulated," the court said. In case of failure to follow the stipulated procedure, the court said, "there need be no further justification to set such faulty measures at naught, regardless of merit of the policy and the object behind such measures".

Justice Ravi V. Hosmani delivered the verdict while allowing the petitions filed by the Registered Unaided Private Schools' Management Association-Karnataka and Organisation for Unaided Recognised Schools, Bengaluru.

The petitioner-associations had questioned the legality of the government's October 6 and 9, 2023, notifications issued under Section 22 of the Act, through which the government decided to introduce board exams for Classes 5,8,9 and 11 to be conducted by the Karnataka State Examination and Assessment Board (KSEAB) in place of holding regular exams through the respective educational institutions.

"The object of new examinations, howsoever laudable, cannot cure procedural defects" in issuing the impugned notifications, the court observed.

Announcing the decision at a press conference here on Wednesday, State Food and Civil Supplies Minister G.R. Anil said K-rice is being launched with an intention to provide good quality rice at affordable rates to the public through Supplyco outlets.

The existing supply of subsidised rice from Supplyco of 10 kg per card will continue, with K-rice too forming a part of it, the State Minister said.

Differentiating K-Rice from Bharat Rice, Mr. Anil said that while high-quality varieties are being sold at subsidised rates under the K-Rice brand, rice that is available at ₹18.59 per kg through National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd (NAFED) and National Cooperative Consumers' Federation Of India Limited (NCCF) is being sold as Bharat Rice at ₹29 per kg.

"While the Bharat Rice is being sold to the public with the Union government making a profit of ₹10 per kg, the State government is shouldering an additional burden of ₹9.5 to ₹11.11 per kg to distribute Krice," said Mr. Anil.

- The Union government announced retail sale of rice at Rs 29 per kg under 'Bharat Rice' through three cooperatives.
- The move is aimed at controlling the rise in rice prices, which have risen by 14.5 per cent in retail and 15.5 per cent in the wholesale markets in the last one year.

- India is the largest rice exporter globally with a 45% share in the world rice market.
- Overall rice exports in April-May of 2023 were 21.1% higher compared with the same period last financial year.
 - In May 2023 itself, export of Basmati rice was 10.86% higher than its exports in May 2022.

 The shipment of non-Basmati rice has been on the rise for the last three years and the export of Basmati rice in 2022-2023 was higher than the previous year.

Last year's total surpassed the previous record reached in 2016, when 8,084 people died during migration.

The IOM said that because safe and regular migration pathways remain limited, hundreds of thousands of people attempt to migrate every year via irregular routes in unsafe conditions.

The Mediterranean ocean crossing continues to be the deadliest route for migrants, with at least

3,129 deaths and disappearances registered last year.

Primary cause

Slightly more than half of the total migrant deaths in 2023 came as a result of drowning, with 9% caused by vehicle accidents, and 7% in violence.

The IOM's Missing Migrants Project was established in 2014 as an openaccess database on migrant deaths and disappearances.

It has since documented more than 63,000 cases

worldwide, though the true figure is estimated to be much higher due to challenges in data collection, particularly in remote locations.

"As we mark the Missing Migrants Project's 10 years, we first remember all these lives lost," IOM deputy director general Ugochi Daniels said.

"Every single one of them is a terrible human tragedy that reverberates through families and communities for years to come," Ms. Daniels added.

India to become upper middle-income country by 2031: Crisil

ENS ECONOMIC BUREAU MUMBAI, MARCH 6

AFTER EXPANDING by 7.6 per cent in the current fiscal, India's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth is likely to decelerate to 6.8 per cent in the fiscal 2025 (FY25) as higher interest rates and lower fiscal impulse will temper domestic demand, Crisil Ratings said in a report on Wednesday. Despite this, commenting on country's growth, Crisil added that between FY25 and FY31, the size of the economy will inch closer to the \$7 trillion mark and the rise in per capita income would place India in the upper middle-income category.

"At that point, India will become the third-largest economy in the world," it said.

The economic growth in FY25 will moderate due to normalisation of the net tax impact on GDP seen in FY24 and as uneven growth in key trade partners will restrict healthy export recovery. But, India will retain its position as the fastest-growing large economy, the rating agency said.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has projected the real GDP growth for 2024-25 at 7 per cent. The recent data from the National Statistical Office (NSO) showed that the country's economy is expected to grow at 7.6 per cent in 2023-24.

Crisil said the transmission of the rate hikes effected by the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the RBI between May 2022 and February 2023 still continues and is likely to weigh on demand next fiscal. The RBI raised the repo rate – the key policy rate – by 250 basis points (bps)pv between May 2022 and February 2023. One basis point is one-hundredth of a percentage point. On the other hand, regulatory actions to tame unsecured lending will have a bearing on credit growth.

In November last year, the RBI increased the risk weights on the exposure of banks towards consumer credit, credit card receivables and non-banking finance companies (NBFCs) by 25 per cent up to 150 per cent.

MP university 'forgets' to conduct exam, students protest

EXAM OFFICIALS at the Jabalpur Rani Durgavati University in Madhya Pradesh are facing allegations that they forgot to conduct the first-semester examination for the MSc computer science batch, prompting students to protest with blindfolds and accuse university officials of negligence.

The university had released time tables of 3 exams last month, meant to be held from February 21 to March 13.

According to the time table, the exam for Computer Organisation and Assembly Language subject of MSc first semester was scheduled to be held on March 5, and students had already received admit cards.

Candidates reached the university at 8 am Tuesday but were informed there was no exam and the university had not prepared the question paper, members of NSUI alleged. **J**

Candidates reached the university at 8 am Tuesday but were informed there was no exam and the university had not prepared the question paper, members of NSUI alleged.

University registrar Deepesh Mishra told *The Indian Express*, "It is wrong to suggest there was major negligence on our part. There were 12 exams that day, including the MBA exam attended by 1,600 students. In the MSc computer science paper, there were only 9 students from first semester. There was some negligence."

NSUI (Jabalpur) leader Sachin Rajak said, "This is a serious case of negligence by university administration. How can they forget the datesheet and other necessary arrangements for the exam?"

V-C Dr Rajesh Verma and Mishra immediately released a new exam schedule and officials concerned have been given 3 days to explain what went wrong. "We issued notice and formed a team to investigate the matter. So far, it appears that the examination was not conducted because the question paper never reached the examination centre because of a miscommunication with the strong room. Officials have been tasked to ensure the examination is conducted, and their leaves have been cancelled till this is done," Mishra said.

 MethaneSAT, a new satellite backed by Alphabet Inc's Google and the Environmental Defense Fund group, was launched recently.

- The satellite will track and measure methane emissions at a global scale and was launched aboard a SpaceX Falcon9 rocket from California.
- It is not the first spacecraft to identify and quantify methane emissions, it will provide more details and have a much wider field of view than any of its predecessors.

- Methane Emissions and Need to Track it
- Contribution of Methane Gas: Methane is an invisible but strong greenhouse gas, and the second largest contributor to global warming after carbon dioxide, responsible for 30 percent of global heating since the Industrial Revolution.
 - According to the United Nations Environment Programme, over a period of 20 years, methane is 80 times more potent at warming than carbon dioxide.

Formation of Ground level Ozone:

- The gas also contributes to the formation of ground-level ozone — a colourless and highly irritating gas that forms just above the Earth's surface.
 - Exposure to ground-level ozone could be contributing to one million premature deaths every year.

 Major Contributor: The main reason is fossil fuel operations, which account for about 40 percent of all human-caused methane emissions.

- MethaneSAT will orbit the Earth 15 times a day, monitoring the oil and gas sector.
- Specifications: It can track differences in methane concentrations as small as three parts per billion in the atmosphere, which enables it to pick up smaller emissions sources than the previous satellites.
 - MethaneSAT also has a wide-camera view of about 200 km by 200 km allowing it to identify larger emitters so-called "super emitters".

India's 1st underwater metro

- Prime Minister will inaugurate India's 1st under-river metro tunnel in <u>Kolkata</u>.
- The metro tunnel has been built under <u>Kolkata's Hooghly</u> <u>River</u> that will connect Howrah Maidan to Esplanade.
- With this, Kolkata Metro joins elite club of London, Moscow, Munich metros.
- The Howrah metro station is also the deepest in India.



- <u>Raksha Mantri</u> launched the <u>Acing Development of</u> <u>Innovative Technologies with iDEX (ADITI) scheme</u>, aiming to <u>promote innovations in critical and strategic defence</u> <u>technologies</u>.
- Under this scheme, start-ups can receive a grant-in-aid of up to Rs 25 crore for their research and development efforts in defence technology.

- The scheme is part of the iDEX framework and aims to develop about 30 deep-tech critical and strategic technologies while bridging the gap between defence requirements and innovation capabilities.
- Additionally, the event unveiled the <u>11th edition of the</u> <u>Defence India Start-up Challenge (DISC)</u> with 22 problem statements, inviting innovators to propose solutions to enhance defence capabilities.
- The Innovations for Defence Excellence (iDEX) framework is a program that <u>aims to promote innovation and technology</u> <u>development</u> in India's <u>defence and aerospace sectors</u>.
