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

SC to consider contempt plea against SBI for seeking time

Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud on Thursday said the Supreme Court would consider listing a contempt petition against State Bank of India (SBI) Chairman Dinesh Kumar Khera for seeking time till June 30 to provide complete details of electoral bonds purchased since April 2019 to anonymously fund political parties.

The contempt petition, filed jointly by petitioners Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and Common Cause, said the Supreme Court, while striking down the electoral bonds scheme, had directed the SBI to share details of the bonds sold to anonymous donors and political parties who had benefited from the transactions to the Election Commission by March 6.

Almost 60% of the funds received by political parties cannot be traced and come from "unknown" sources, including electoral bonds, according to a report by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

The ADR, which analysed the audit reports and the donations declared in statements filed by political parties with the Election Commission of India each year, said that between the financial years 2004-05 and 2022-23, the country's six national parties collected ₹19,083.08 crore from unknown sources.

At present, political parties are not required to reveal the names of individuals or organisations giving them less than ₹20,000. As a result, three-fifths of the funds received cannot be traced and are from 'unknown' sources, the report said.

Of the ₹3,076.88 crore declared as income by national parties in 2022-23, ₹1,832.87 crore – or more than 59% –came from unknown sources. Of this, the share of income from electoral bonds was ₹1,510.61

The vast majority of these funds went to the BJP. During 2022-23, the ruling party declared ₹1,400.23 crore as its income from unknown sources. This amounts to 76.39% of the total income from unknown sources declared by all national parties; the other five national parties together have received only ₹432.63 crore from unknown sources.

The Congress came a distant second, claiming 17.19% of the national pie and declaring ₹315.11 crore as its income from unknown sources.

The other parties included in the ADR's analysis were the Communist Party of India (Marxist), the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), the Aam Aadmi Party, and the National People's Party.

he Tribal Affairs Ministry is planning to collaborate with the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) to deploy V-SAT (very small aperture terminal) stations on a pilot basis for around 80 tribal villages in Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, and Maharashtra to bring Internet services there, according to a proposal unveiled on Thursday at a Ministry event meant to brainstorm innovative projects for tribal development.

ISRO chief S. Somnath confirmed to *The Hindu* that they were going to collaborate with the Ministry on this project and that the two bodies would soon sign a memorandum of understanding to give pilot connectivity (services such as Internet, medical and educational connectivity) to these tribal-dominated villages.

This proposal was among the many that were tabled at Thursday's meet-

ing, chaired by Tribal Affairs Minister Arjun Munda, on innovative projects for empowering tribal communities.

Various projects

In addition to the collaboration with the ISRO, proposals for projects with other eminent institutes such as the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Delhi, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi, Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Calcutta, and Indian Institute of Science (IISc) in Bengaluru

were discussed.

The collaboration with the ISRO will see the government set up V-SAT stations for these 80 villages that are geographically remote and have difficult terrain, challenges that have kept them out of reach of connectivity for the longest time.


Officials at the Tribal Affairs Ministry said the pilot project would be monitored so that it could be scaled up to other similar tribal villages in other States as well, adding that the goal was also to help

with e-governance in these remote areas. They added that the Ministry was in the process of identifying these 80 villages in these four States and soon the modalities of the project would be worked out.

Apart from this, the Ministry is partnering with the AIIMS to conduct advanced research on tribal health issues with special emphasis on sickle cell anemia and in organising training programmes for doctors and paramedical staff working in tribal areas. Plans are also on for setting up a Bhagwan Birsa Munda Chair of Tribal Health and Haematology at the AIIMS.

In addition, a proposal has been brought to set up a similar specialised department for appropriate technology and entrepreneurship in collaboration with the IIT, Delhi and the IIM, Kolkata.

One other proposal was also tabled to collaborate with the IISc for setting up a training facility which will offer courses on semiconductor to tribal students.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Bank Indonesia (BI) on Thursday signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) here for establishing a framework to promote the use of local currencies viz., the Indian Rupee (INR) and the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) for cross-border transactions.







Under the India Al Mission, the government will look to establish a computing capacity of more than 10,000 GPUs and also help develop foundational models with a capacity of more than 100 billion parameters trained on datasets covering major Indian languages for priority sectors such as healthcare, agriculture and governance. AI Curation Units (ACUs) will also be developed in 50 government departments. The proposal also includes the establishment of an AI marketplace designed to offer AI as a service and pre-trained models to those working on such applications.

The implementation of this AI compute infrastructure will be done through a public-private partnership model with 50 per cent viability gap funding. If the compute prices come down, the private entity will have to add












Global Cervical Cancer Elimination Forum

 The first ever Global Cervical Cancer Elimination Forum (GCF) in Cartagena de Indias, Colombia, secured nearly USD 600 million in funding from the World Bank, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and UNICEF.

 The funds will be utilised to enhance global access to vaccination, screening and treatment for cervical cancer.

- Cervical cancer is a cancer that starts in the cervix, which is the lower end of the uterus that connects it to the vagina.
- It's caused by a long-lasting (human papillomavirus) HPV infection, which is a common virus transmitted through sexual contact.
- Cervical cancer is ranked as the fourth most prevalent cancer among women globally.
- Despite available tools for prevention and elimination, it claims a woman's life every 2 minutes globally, with over 90% of cervical cancer deaths in 2022 occurring in low- and middle-income nations.

WHO's Global Strategy for Cervical Cancer Elimination, launched in November 2020, targets, by 2030:

90% of girls vaccinated against HPV by age 15

70% of women screened with a high-performance test by ages 35

and 45 90% of women with cervical disease receive treatment.

• Indian Government intends to initiate a three-phase vaccination drive against human papillomavirus (HPV) for girls aged 9-14, aiming to mitigate the risk of cervical cancer.


SC Upholds Rajasthan's Two Child Rule

 SC upholds Rajasthan rule barring those with more than 2 kids from police force.

About

 Rule 24(4) of the Rajasthan Police Subordinate Service Rules, 1989, which stipulates a maximum limit of two children per candidate, is non-discriminatory and constitutional.

- Rajasthan has a law which bars persons over two children on or after June 1, 2002 or male candidates with more than one living wife to be appointed in the Subordinate Police Services.
- "Population control and family planning" is a subject on the concurrent list, which contains matters both the Centre and the states can legislate on. Thus, several states have made laws to push for the family planning to opt two child policy.



The **Rajasthan Panchayati Raj Act 1994** disqualifies those with over two children from contesting elections as a panch or a member.

The **Odisha Zilla Parishad Act, 1991**, bars those with more than two children from contesting.

The **Gujarat Local Authorities Laws (Amendment) Act, 1962**, disqualifies those with more than two children from contesting elections for bodies of local self-governance, like panchayats, municipalities, and municipal corporations.



- **2 separate launches** It is the <u>1st mission involving 2 launch</u> <u>vehicles</u> aimed at completing a single mission.
 - **LVM-3** It will launch with <u>3 components</u> (Propulsion Module, the Descender Module and the Ascender Module).
 - **Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV)** It will launch the *Transfer Module and the Re-entry Module*.



• If successful, Chandrayaan-4 will make India only the 4th nation to bring back samples from the lunar surface.

• GBBC

- The GBBC was <u>launched in 1998</u>, in the USA and was initially restricted to the USA only.
- GBBC is a citizen-driven scientific project aimed at counting and reporting the details of birds in the area of their neighborhood.
- It was an initiative of Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society of USA.
- In 2013, it took the global stage turning into a global bird census.



- The latest data of World Poverty Clock showed India has managed to bring down 'extreme poverty' below 3% of its population.
- The World Poverty Clock provides real-time estimates until 2030 for almost every country in the world.
- It monitors progress against Ending Extreme Poverty, which is the UN's first Sustainable Development Goal (SDG). The escape rate calculates the current rate of poverty reduction in the world.

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
