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

HC dismisses Cong. plea in tax dues case

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday rejected the plea by the Congress chal-lenging an order of the In-come Tax Appellate Tribu-nal (TAT) declining to stay an Income Tax depart-ment notice to the party for recovery of outstanding tax of over \$100 crore.

Details hand-delivered to poll body, says SBI

The State Bank of India (SBI) on Wednesday in-formed the Supreme Court that details of electoral bonds anonymously pur-chased by contributors and encashed by political and encashed by political parties from April 2019 to February 15, 2024 were hand-delivered to the Elec-tion Commission of India (ECI). The SBI said a total of 22,217 electoral bonds

20,421 were redeemed by parties, the SBI affidavit said. Though the Supreme Court had sought informa-tion only from April 12, 2019, the bank said the selling and redeeming of elec-toral bonds had started from April 1. The ECI has time till March 15 to pu-blish the information from

The bank said it has shared information with the ECI about the dates of purchase of electoral bonds, the names of pur-chasers and the denomina-tion of the bonds. Similar-ly, the dates of encashment of the bonds, names of pol-ceived the contributions and denomination of the bonds encashed were also provided.

A Bench headed by Justice Sanjiv Khanna agreed to list for hearing the plea by NGO Association for Democratic Reforms, which said the new law on the appointments of ECs should

be put on hold.

The NGO said the Chief Justice of India (CJI) should be brought back on board the high-profile selection committee headed by the Prime Minister for appointments of ECs to the top poll body as directed by a landmark Supreme Court judgment in the *Anoop Baranwal* case of March 2, 2023.

'Free and fair elections'

"Now, the Executive has the ability to appoint two Election Commissioners which can give an unfair advantage to the Executive. The role of the Election Commission is critical in ensuring free and fair elections and therefore, the appointments must also be seen to be fair and free from any bias or latches to the government of that time," the organisation, represented by advocate Prashant Bhushan and Cheryl D'Souza, submitted.



The portal will be a one-stop point where people from disadvantaged sections of society can apply for and monitor the progress of all loan and credit schemes already available to them.

Maharashtra's Ahmednagar to be called Ahilyanagar

The Maharashtra Cabinet on Wednesday formally approved the renaming of Ahmednagar district to Ahilyanagar after the 18th Century Maratha queen Ahilyabai Holkar. The decision to rename the district had already been announced by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde in May last year on the 298th birth anniversary of Ahilyabai Holkar. The renaming of Ahmednagar follows the Mahayuti government's decision to rename Aurangabad district as Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar and Osmanabad as Dharashiv. The demand for renaming Ahmednagar was started by BJP leader and MLC Gopichand Padalkar, an influential leader of the Dhangar (shepherd) community.

Who is Ahilyabai Holkar?

- Ahilyabai (1725 -1795) was one of the women rulers of Medieval India who belongs to the Holkar dynasty of the Maratha Empire.
- She was married Khanderao Holkar in 1733 at the tender age of 8. Her husband was killed in the battle of Kumbher in 1754.

A learning deficit

And though there is more awareness about this thanks to Pratham's annual surveys, little seems to have changed on the ground. The students are allowed to discuss and solve problems with their peers and learn from one another. Every child gets to touch, feel, and use the learning material – whether a maths manipulative, a whether a matts manipulative, a book, or a science kit. The teacher stays in the classroom while the children work and gives them feedback in real time. The children cognitively engage with the topic. There is a happy buzz of students taking ownership for their own learning. This is student engagement and this is what makes the classroom a meaningfu

space for every learner. Unless the teacher participates student engagement cannot happen. Classroom learning opportunities must be made available to everyone, irrespectiv of gender, caste, religion, special needs, or disability. When needs, or disability. When teachers actively engage students in a lesson, learning outcomes improve. This seems like a simple premise. Why then is it so difficult to implement in the classroom? The many problems that plague the education system, including inadequate teacher allocation, poor systemic governance. poor systemic governance, outdated teaching practices, lack of teacher support and coaching, all contribute to making this hard

to implement at scale. to implement at scale. There are many teachers who teach with passion and dedication despite the challenges. However, even when we have dedicated teachers teaching and good student attendance, children still do not always learn. A part of the

cannot customise their teaching to suit the learner's needs.

Teaching the teacher Teachers have not seen how Teachers have not seen how practices such as questioning are practiced. This is because teacher education and training in India tends to be theoretical. It is conducted in seminar-style and tends to be a one-way communication. There is little communication. There is little opportunity for practice provided to the participants. We must see teachers as learners to and provide them with an engaging learning environment with 70% practice and 30% theory so that training serves a two-fold purpose: teachers get trained, but also experience learner engagement

for themselves.
Additionally, there is no one in school to support teachers. All of hand-holding to support us in adopting new behaviour. Even the support of the support o

students choices in the classroom result in higher engagement and better learning outcomes. Simple can positively impact the learning environment. In India, we have spent a few years discussing the Right to Education but this is a Right to Learning. Else, reading every ASER report will only lead to more disappointment.

In contrast, in the 2019-23 period, Russia's share re-duced to 36%.

France's share in India's arms imports was just 0.9% in the 2009-13 period. However, in the 2019-23 period, its share climbed to 33%, making it the second largest supplier. 



Chart 1: The chart shows the volume of arms transfers from the five major arms exporters to India in terms of trend-indicator value (TIV)




Subsequently, he went for the floor test on January 10 last year, which he passed with flying colours as even the Congress voted in favour. He had secured 268 votes.

However, riled at Prachanda's decision to support the Nepali Congress presidential candidate, the UML withdrew support to the government in February, paving the way for the Congress to join the government. A year later, Prachanda, last week, ditched the Nepali Congress and forged a new Left alliance with the UML.



European lawmakers give final approval to world's first AI law

LONDON, MARCH 13

EUROPEAN UNION lawmakers gave final approval to the bloc's artificial intelligence law Wednesday, putting the world-leading rules on track to take effect later this year.

The European Parliament voted overwhelmingly in favor of the Artificial Intelligence Act, five years after they were first proposed. The AI Act is expected to act as a global signpost for other governments grappling with how to regulate the fast-developing tech.

"The AI Act has nudged the future of AI in a human-centric direction, in a direction where humans are in control of the technology and where it helps us leverage new discoveries, economic growth, societal progress and unlock human potential," said Dragos Tudorache, a Romanian lawmaker who was a co-leader of the Parliament negotiations.

Big tech companies generally have supported the need to regulate AI while lobbying to ensure any rules work in their favour. OpenAI CEO Sam Altman caused a minor stir last year when he suggested the ChatGPT maker could pull out of Europe if it can't comply with the AI Act — before backtracking to say there were no plans to leave.

Like many EU regulations, the AI Act was initially intended to act as consumer safety legislation, taking a "risk-based approach" to

High-risk uses of AI, such as in medical devices or critical infrastructure like water or electrical networks, face requirements like using high-quality data and providing clear information to users.

Some AI uses are banned because they're deemed to pose an unacceptable risk, like social scoring systems that govern how people behave, some types of predictive policing and emotion recognition systems in school and workplaces. Other banned uses include police scanning faces in public using AI-powered remote "biometric identification" systems, except for serious crimes like kidnapping or terrorism.

The law's early drafts focused on AI systems carrying out narrowly limited tasks, like scanning resumes and job applications. The astonishing rise of general purpose AI models, exemplified by OpenAI's ChatGPT, sent EU policymakers scrambling to keep up. They added provisions for so-called generative AI models, the technology underpinning AI chatbot systems that can produce unique and seemingly lifelike responses, images and more.

Developers of general purpose Al models — from European startups to OpenAI and Google — will have to provide a detailed summary of the text, pictures, video and other data on the internet that is used to train the systems as well as follow EU copyright law.

AI-generated deepfake pictures, video or audio of existing people, places or events must be labeled as artificially manipulated. There's extra scrutiny for the biggest and most powerful AI models that pose "systemic risks," which include OpenAI's GPT4 — its most advanced system — and Google's Gemini.

Brussels first suggested AI regulations in 2019, taking a familiar global role in ratcheting up scrutiny of emerging industries, while other governments scramble to keep up. The Act is expected to officially become law by May or June, after a few final formalities.

US-BASED applied AI lab, Cognition, has introduced what it claims is the world's first AI software engineer. The makers say that the AI agent, named Devin, has successfully passed practical engineering interviews held by leading AI companies. It has also completed real jobs posted on Upwork, an US-based freelancing platform, according to Cognition.

"Devin is a tireless, skilled teammate, equally ready to build alongside you or independently complete tasks for you to review. With Devin, engineers can focus on more interesting problems, and engineering teams can strive for more ambitious goals," read the company's official blog post on Devin.

What can Devin do?

The AI agent comes with advanced capabilities in software development, including coding, debugging, problemsolving, etc. Devin uses machine learning algorithms to constantly learn and improve its performance and adapt according to new challenges. It can build and deploy apps end-to-end and can also train and fine-tune its own AI models.

Devin can plan and execute complex engineering tasks that would require thousands of decisions. This is possible owing to Cognition's advances in long-term reasoning and planning. According to the company, Devin can recall relevant context at each step, self-learn over time, and even fix mistakes.

assisted of the previous state-of-the-art model.

In terms of performance, Devin AI is capable of augmenting efficiency and speed within software development processes by automating repetitive tasks, instantly generating code, expediting project timelines, and cutting down development expenses substantially.

One of the most notable facets of Devin AI is that it is immune to human errors or inconsistencies. The AI agent is capable of guaranteeing precision and uniformity in coding practices which can lead to the development of superiorquality software products.

It needs to be noted that the company has not disclosed anything about the AI model that is powering Devin AI, nor has it revealed detailed technical specifications. Some of the other popular AI-powered tools that help with coding are OpenAI Codex, GitHub Copilot, Polycoder, CodeT5, Tabnine, etc.

What challenges, opportunities does it bring?

While the company has elaborated on the capabilities of Devin, some experts feel that the AI software engineer may struggle with complex requirements or instances that rely on human intuition and creativity. Besides, AI tools such as Devin seem to fan concerns about job losses.

However, others believe that Devin can be an ally for thousands of software engineers, offering new avenues of collaboration between human ingenuity and AI.

What can Devin do?

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Besides, the makers have also endowed the AI software engineer with the ability to proactively collaborate with the user. It reports progress in real-time, is capable of accepting feedback, and works along with the user through design choices as needed.

What about its performance?

On the SWE-Bench benchmark (a benchmark for evaluating large language models on real-world software issues found on GitHub), Devin correctly resolved 13.86 per cent of the issues without any assistance compared with the 1.96 per cent unassisted and 4.80 per cent

OpenAl Codex, GitHub Copilot, Polycoder, CodeT5, Tabnine, etc.

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What is Cognition?

Cognition, the firm behind Devin, is headed by Scott Wu. Cognition calls itself an applied AI lab that is focussed on reasoning. The company claims that it is building AI teammates with capabilities that surpass existing AI tools. "Building Devin is just the first step—our hardest challenges still lie ahead," reads the website.

The agent will soon be available to be hired for engineering works, but for now, companies need to join a waitlist.

Pi Day: Understanding the world's most famous mathematical constant

MARCH 14. OR 3/14 as per the American convention, is celebrated as Pi Day worldwide as an ode to the most well-known approximation (3.14) of the mathematical constant Pi.

The tradition was started by physicist Larry Shaw of the Exploratorium museum in San Francisco in 1988, and has since seen global popularity.

On the day, mathematicians try to raise awareness on their subject among lay persons, through lectures, museum exhibitions and pie-eating competitions.

In 2019. UNESCO's 40th General Conference designated Pi Day as the International Day of Mathematics.

What is Pi?

Pi, often represented by the Greek letter pi, is the most famous of all mathematical constants. It represents the ratio of a circle's circumference (boundary) to its diameter (a straight line between two points on the circle's boundary, passing through its centre). Regardless of the circle's size, this ratio always remains constant.

Pi is an irrational number — it is a decimal with no end and no repeating pattern - which is most often approximated to 3.14, or the fraction 22/7.

How is Pi calculated?

The importance of Pi has been recognised for at least 4,000 years. Academic Petr

Beckman in his classic A History of Pi (1970) wrote that "by 2.000 BC, men had grasped the significance of the constant that is today denoted by pi, and that they had found a rough approximation of its value."

Both ancient Babylonians and ancient Egyptians came up with their own measurements, probably by drawing a circle of EXPLAINED some diameter, and then measuring its circumference using a rope of said diameter in length. Babylonians settled

at 25/8 (3.125) as the value of Pi, while ancient Egyptians settled at (16/9)2 (approximately 3.16).

It was Greek polymath Archimedes

(circa 287-212 BCE) who came up with the method to calculate Pi

that remained in use till the 17th century. He realised that the perimeter of a regular polygon of 'n' sides inscribed in a circle is smaller than the circumference of the circle. whereas the perimeter of a similar polygon circumscribed about the

> circle is greater than its circumference. This can be used to calculate the limits within which the value of Pi must lie. Now, as one keeps adding

more and more sides to this polygon, it gets closer and closer to the shape of a circle. Having reached 96-sided polygons, Archimedes proved that 223/71 < Pi < 22/7

(in decimal notation, this is 3.14084 < p < 3.142858).

Following Archimedes, this method was used by mathematicians constantly increasing the number of sides of the polygon to calculate Pi to ever greater decimal places.

The problem with this method, however, is that it is extremely labour intensive. For instance, it took Dutch mathematician Ludolph van Ceulen (1540-1610) a staggering three decades to calculate Pi to 35 decimal points.

It would be Isaac Newton (1643-1727) who significantly simplified the process of calculating Pi. In 1666, he calculated Pi up to 16 decimal places using calculus, which he discovered along with mathematician Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz (1646-1713). What had taken mathematicians years to calculate now could be done in a matter of days.

But why does all this matter?

Circles are everywhere in the world. So are three-dimensional shapes like cylinders. spheres, and cones, all of which carry the proportion of Pi. Knowing Pi's value, thus, has some crucial practical benefits in the fields of architecture, design, and engineering. From constructing water storage tanks to fashioning hi-tech equipment for satellites, the value of Pi is indispensable in all sorts of areas.

Moreover, Pi seems to be woven into descriptions of the deepest workings of the universe – from calculating the vastness of space or understanding the spiral of DNA.



Why taps are running dry in Bengaluru

For the last two weeks
Bengaluru has been
reeling under a severe
water crisis. While the
drought in the Cauvery
basin is the immediate
reason, groundwater
depletion and unplanned
construction in the
country's IT capital are
the other causes.

Banasree Purkayastha looks at whether the city can find a lasting solution to its water woes



1,450 mn litres

of water from the Cauvery river needed by Bengaluru every day

700 mn litres

of groundwater extracted every day additionally to meet the city's water demand

1,940 mn litres

Other cities in India too are running dry

CITIES ACROSS INDIA have been facing water shortages due to massive population growth and unplanned urbanisation. In 2019, Chennai's reservoirs ran dry, forcing the government to bring 10 million litres of water a day by tankers to its citizens. Neither Bengaluru or Chennai is rain-deficient, and have faced floods in recent years.

AWorld Wide Fund for Nature report in 2020 warned that 30 Indian cities would face a 'grave water risk' by 2050 due to a sharp spike in population. By 2030, 40% of India's population will live in urban areas, up from 34% in 2011, making the situation worse.

▶ Current water crisis in Bengaluru

BENGALURU IS STARING at a Cape Town-like water crisis this rear with the depletion of groundwater and a drought in he Cauvery basin. Even before beak summer has set in, 1,214 of he 10,955 borewells drilled by he city's municipal corporation have dried up. In 3,700 others, vater levels have dropped. The city needs 1,450 million litres per day (MLD) of water from the Cauvery and an additional 700 4LD from groundwater

resources. Its water supply body — Bengaluru Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) — has been urging people to use treated water for non-drinking purposes.

The real challenge is the next two to three months. With the summer expected to be more severe this year, 7,082 villages and 1,193 wards, including in Bengaluru Urban district, need to gear up for a prolonged drought-like situation.

Reasons behind the water shortage

THE CURRENT SITUATION is a result of multiple factors including depletion of groundwater resources, reliance on distant water sources, lack of access to BWSSB water supply connection in peripheral parts of the city, and an inefficient water management system. The city's population has gone up from 8.7 million in 2011 to 12.6 million in 2021, putting additional pressure on existing

water supply facilities.

The poor rainfall in 2023 due to the El Nino effect precipitated the situation as adequate groundwater recharge could not happen. Its effect was evident as summer set in the third week of February, which usually starts only in March in Bengaluru. The Krishnaraja Sagar Dam in Mandya district from where Cauvery water is supplied to Bengaluru also does not have adequate water.

Impact on industrial production


THE PROLONGED WATER scarcity is a cause for concern for industries too, particularly small and medium enterprises (SMEs). The major industrial districts in the state require 290 MLD of water. Industrial areas in Bengaluru urban and rural, Tumakuru, Chikkaballapura and Kolar districts are already facing drinking water problems, and without uninterrupted supply, the state's industrial growth may suffer in the short term.


Sectors such as textile processing, chemical industries, paper manufacturing and packaging which are especially water-dependent, apprehend potential disruptions to production in March. The number of effluent treatment plants in industrial areas are too few to meet the demand for treated water. IT companies in the city are better placed as they have been implementing water conservation measures.

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
Coral Bleaching in Great Barrier Reef








HARMFUL COLOURS FOUND IN FOOD

Rhodamine B: It is used as an industrial dye. Because of its low cost, Rhodamine B is often used for food colouring - an illegal practice by all means. It has been classified as a potential carcinogen by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC). Its prolonged use in food can lead to liver dysfunction or cancer

Sunset Yellow: It is a synthetic dye used in food, drugs, and cosmetics. If consumed alone or in combination with other dyes, Sunset Yellow can cause allergic or pseudo-allergic reactions and severe reactions among asthma and urticaria patients



Carmoisine: A synthetic food dye, it is also called Food Red. IARC classifies it as a category 3 carcinogen. Its prolonged consumption can affect liver, kidneys and trigger behavioural changes among children, besides triggering skin rashes, and respiratory allergies

Tartrazine: A yellow, nitrous derivative compound, it is used as a synthetic food colouring chemical. Prolonged intake can cause angioedema, eczema, bronchitis, and headaches. It affects the thyroid gland and hormones

- Recently, the Karnataka Government has announced a ban on the use of harmful colouring agents in popular food items like cotton candy and Gobi Manchurian.
- The ban targets Rodamine B in cotton candy and imposes restrictions on Tartrazine usage in Gobi Manchurian.
 - Rhodamine B is a chemical compound commonly employed in synthetic dyes for colouring silk, jute, leather, cotton, and wool, as well as in the cosmetics and plastics industries
