Army raises first unit to operate Apache attack helicopters in Jodhpur

Preparing to induct the first batch of AH-64E Apache attack helicopters into its fold, the Indian Army Aviation Corps raised its first unit at Jodhpur on Friday that will operate the helicopters. The Apaches will be the second attack helicopters in the Army after the indigenous light combat helicopter (LCH).

The 451 Aviation Squadron was formally raised at Jodhpur on Friday in the presence of Lt. Gen. A. K. Suri, Director-General of the Army Aviation Corps, a defence official said. "Army will receive the first batch of three Apaches in May and another three in July," the official added.

India signed a deal with Boeing for six more Apaches for the Army, at a cost of around \$800 million, in February 2020. As part of the deal, six pilots and 24 technicians were trained





OWIK SUPPLY Chain Private Ltd. a warehouse and storage company, that purchased electoral bonds worth Rs 410 crore, is associated with Reliance Industries Limited (RIL), given that directors in the shareholder companies of Qwik Supply are serving or retired top executives of RIL.

Further, one of the directors in Qwik Supply Chain is also a director in several companies such as Reliance Polyester Private Limited, Reliance Oil and Petroleum Private Limited, Reliance First Private Limited, and Reliance Fire Brigade Services Private Limited.

Qwik Supply's registered email address as per the RoC is also linked to Reliance Industries Limited's domain (ril.com).

When contacted, an RIL spokesperson only said that Qwik Supply is "not a subsidiary of RIL". He did not respond to questions on the ownership of Qwik Supply and the link of its shareholders with RIL promoter Mukesh Ambani.

At least one director in five of these six companies is a top RIL executive; in the sixth company, one of the directors is a former top executive from RIL.

Qwik Supply's financial statements accessed from RoC shows its net turnover was Rs 9,813 crore in FY21, Rs 11,165 crore in FY22 and Rs 15,734 crore in FY23. In these three years, its net profit was Rs 24.24 crore, Rs 22.09 crore and Rs 33.65 crore, respectively.

In other words, Qwik Supply's aggregate profit of Rs 79.98 crore over the previous years was much lower than Rs 410 crore it spent on purchase of electoral bonds.

New Satellite-Based Toll Collection System

 Recently, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways of India announced in Parliament that the government intends to roll out a new highway toll collection system based on the global navigation satellite system (GNSS) before the model code of conduct for the 2024 election becomes effective.

- The proposed highway tolling system utilises the GNSS, including the Indian satellite navigation system GAGAN (GPS Aided GEO Augmented Navigation) for accurate location tracking.

- It uses a large constellation of satellites to provide more accurate location and navigation information to users globally as compared to the GPS alone.
- Implementation involves fitting vehicles with an On-Board Unit (OBU), or tracking device, which communicates with satellites to determine location.

GAGAN

- GPS Aided GEO Augmented Navigation (GAGAN) is an initiative by the Indian Government for Satellite-based Navigation Services in India.
- It aims to enhance the accuracy of global navigation satellite system (GNSS) receivers through reference signals.

- He founded the <u>Native School of Bombay</u>, which was renamed 1st as the Bombay Native Institution, and then as the Board of Education which finally evolved into the prestigious <u>Elphinstone</u> <u>College</u>.
- He suggested to name the 1st medical college of Mumbai after the Sir Robert Grant, the erstwhile Governor of Bombay who tried to establish medical institution in the then Bombay
- Grant Medical College in Mumbai is one of the oldest medical institutions in South Asia.

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
