The Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC), the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) facility at Thumba in Thiruvananthapuram, has developed a multi-purpose app that will help astronauts on the Gaganyaan space flight mission carry out a range of tasks such as looking up vital technical information or communicating with one another.

The Space-borne Assistant and Knowledge Hub for Crew Interaction (SAK-HI) will, among other things, monitor the health of the astronauts, help them stay connected with Earth and even alert them about their dietary sche-

The project was first approved by PM Narendra Modi on August 15, 2018.

It will send the three member crew to space for at least seven days by 2022.

ISRO hopes to deploy its biggest rocket, GSLV MK III, for this project.



The space agency hopes to launch the first mission within 40 months from the date of approval. It would be one of the cheapest manned spaceflights in the world, with the estimated cost of not more than **Rs 10000 crore**.

### Spring season 'disappearing' in many States, shows study

Analysis of records since 1970 reveals increased warming between Dec. and Feb. across country; at 2.3 degrees Celsius, Manipur records the biggest jump in temperature in the winter months

ndian States have been gradually registering a withdrawal of spring, a period of relatively benign weather between the winter of January and the scorching summer of April, a 50-year analysis of meteorological records suggests.

Researchers from the agency Climate Trends calculated the monthly average temperature for 33 States and Union Territories from 1970 to the present. This was the period during which the impact of global warming has been empirically observed and for which consistent data exist. For each State or Union Territory, the rate of warming for each month was compared with each three-month meteorological season. For instance, December, January, and February are considered the winter months in meteorological terminology.

#### Significant trend

Every region analysed had a 'net warming' during winter. Manipur had the biggest change since 1970 (2.3 degrees Celsius), while Delhi had the smallest (0.2 degree Celsius). "Winter is

the fastest warming season for 12 out of the 34 States and territories considered. This is second only to autumn, which was the fastest warming season in 13 regions," the analysts noted.

There were significant differences in the pattern of temperature changes during the winter. The southern part of the country had "strong" warming in December and January. Sikkim (2.4 degrees Celsius) and Manipur (2.1 degrees Celsius) had the larchanges in gest temperature in December and January, respectively. The northern part of the country had weaker warming and even cooling during December and January.

rates during this period (-0.2 degree Celsius in December, -0.8 degree Celsius in January), and among the States, Ladakh (0.1 degree Celsius in December) and Uttar Pradesh (-0.8 degree Celsius in January) had the lowest warming rates.

#### Sharp change

The pattern changes dramatically between January and February. All regions have warmed in February but the warming is especially pronounced in many of the regions that showed cooling or low warming in the previous months. Jammu and Kashmir had the highest warming (3.1 degrees Celsius) and Telangana had the lowest (0.4 de-Delhi had the lowest grees Celsius).

### Vaccine for dengue may be out in markets by mid-2026, says IIL

#### CHENNAI

Vaccine for dengue could be available commercially as early as mid-2026. Indian Immunologicals Ltd. (IIL) has finished the first phase of clinical trials to determine the safety of the vaccine, the company's managing director K. Anand Kumar said. The second and third phases of trials to test the vaccine's efficacy are expected to begin shortly. IIL is a wholly owned subsidiary of the National Dairy Development Board, established in 1982.

"We have completed phase 1 trial, [which is] to determine safety. It was very successful. There have been no adverse reports. We will start phase 2 and 3 trials soon," Dr. Kumar said in an interaction with *The Hindu* in Chennai over the

past weekend.

The findings of the first phase have already been published in peer-reviewed journals, he said. "We should have completed the trial in December but it was delayed by a few months. We wanted to release it in early 2026 but now, may be by mid-2026, we will be ready to release the vaccines," he added.

"For dengue, we got the virus strains from the National Institute of Virology. We will release the results of the clinical trials," he explained of the protocol requirements for any such scientific work.

The company is also de-

veloping a vaccine for the Zika virus and for the Kyasanur Forest Disease (KFD).

The virus, first identified in 1957 in Karnataka's forests, is reported to have infected 400 to 500 people annually since then. Transmission in humans occurs through an infected tick's bite or due to contact with an infected animal, especially a sick or dead monkey.

"The ICMR (Indian Council of Medical Research) has agreed in principle to help undertake, bear all the cost for clinical trials for the Zika vaccine and we are discussing codeveloping the vaccine for KFD along with the Council," Dr. Kumar said.

In January this year, the company launched the Hepatitis A vaccine, Havisure. The product has taken off well, Dr. Kumar said.

### Apple in talks with Google to use Gemini for iPhones

APPLE IS IN talks to build Google's Gemini artificial intelligence (AI) engine into the iPhone, according to people familiar with the situation, setting the stage for a blockbuster agreement that would shake up the AI industry.

The two companies are in active negotiations to let Apple license Gemini, Google's set of generative AI models, to power some new features coming to the iPhone software this year, said the people, who asked not to be identified. Apple also recently held discussions with OpenAI and has considered using its model, according to the people.

If a deal between Apple and Google comes to fruition, it would

For years, Alphabet's Google has paid Apple billions of dollars annually to make its search engine the default option in the Safari web browser on the iPhone and other devices. A deal would give Gemini a key edge with billions of potential users. But it also may be a sign that Apple isn't as far along with its AI efforts as some might have hoped — and threatens to draw further antitrust scrutiny of both companies.

Apple is preparing new capabilities as part of iOS 18 — the next version of the iPhone operating system — based on its own AI models. But those enhancements will be focused on features that operate on its devices, rather than ones delivered via the cloud. So, Apple is seeking a partner to do the heavy lifting of generative AI, including functions for creating images and writing essays based on simple prompts.

Spokespeople for Apple and Google declined to comment.

OpenAI didn't immediately respond to a request for comment. Since early last year, Apple has been testing its own large language model — the technology behind generative AI — codenamed Ajax. Some employees also have been trying out a basic chatbot dubbed Apple GPT. But Apple's technology remains inferior to tools from Google and other rivals, according to the people, making a partnership look like the better option.

A deal with Apple would be Google's highest-profile partnership for Gemini to date and could be a major boon for the company's AI efforts. Apple has more than 2 billion devices in active use that could potentially become home to Google Gemini later this year. In January, Samsung Electronics rolled out new smartphones with AI features powered by Gemini.

# India-EFTA Trade Deal





- India and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) recently signed the Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA).
- India previously rejected the inclusion of "data exclusivity" clauses in the agreement which would have restricted Indian pharmaceutical companies from producing generic drugs.
- Now, India and EFTA agreed to exclude the most "sensitive" agricultural products and gold imports from the pact.

### What are the Key Highlights of the TEPA?

**About:** The India-EFTA trade deal was finalised a decade after initial negotiations broke down in **2013** due to disagreements.

- Recent geopolitical changes and a shared goal to reduce dependence on China facilitated the agreement.
- TEPA comprises 14 chapters with a main focus on market access related to goods, rules of origin, trade facilitation, trade remedies, sanitary and phytosanitary measures, technical barriers to trade, investment promotion, market access on services, intellectual property rights, trade and sustainable development and other legal and horizontal provisions.

- EFTA Commitments:
- To increase foreign direct investments in India by USD 100 billion over 15 years.
- The investments do not cover foreign portfolio investment. Target to generate 1 million direct jobs in India through these investments.
- Commitments related to Intellectual Property Rights in TEPA are at the Trade-Related Aspects of the Intellectual Property Rights level.

- Tariff Offers: EFTA offers 92.2% of tariff lines covering 99.6% of India's exports.
  - India offers 82.7% of tariff lines covering 95.3% of EFTA exports.
  - India excludes sectors like dairy, soya, coal, and sensitive agricultural products from tariff concessions.
- Mutual Recognition: TEPA has provisions for Mutual Recognition Agreements in Professional Services like nursing, chartered accountants, architects etc.

- India and EFTA:
- India is the EFTA's 5th-largest trading partner after the European Union, the United States, Britain and China.
  - Two-way trade between India and EFTA was USD 18.65 billion in 2022-23, with a trade deficit of USD 14.8 billion for India.
    - Switzerland is India's largest trading partner in this bloc of nations, followed by Norway.
  - The biggest exports to India were pharmaceutical items (11.4%) and machinery (17.5%), while organic chemicals (27.5%) made up the majority of EFTA imports.

• TEPA is the 4th major deal signed by India to promote trade and economic cooperation in the last 3 years. The others are with Australia, Mauritius and the UAE.

- The FLNAT assesses Reading, Writing, and Numeracy skills, to evaluate foundational literacy and numeracy skills.
  - The test will be conducted in all districts of participating States/UTs at District Institutes of Education and Training (DIETs) and Government/aided schools.

- FLNAT aims to certify non-literate learners and promote multilingualism by conducting the test in regional languages, aligning with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.
- Learners who qualify will receive a certificate from the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognising their achievement in foundational literacy and numeracy skills.

- New India Literacy Program, popularly known as ULLAS is a centrally sponsored scheme for the period 2022-2027 to cover all aspects of Education For All, previously known as Adult Education.
- The scheme empowers adults aged 15 and above with basic literacy, numeracy, and critical life skills, fostering lifelong learning.
- Implemented through volunteerism, it promotes social responsibility and access to regional language content on the DIKSHA Portal and ULLAS mobile app.

# Para Archer Sheetal Devi Named ECI National PwD Icon

- Recently, the Election Commission of India has announced Para Archer and Arjuna Awardee, Sheetal Devi (winner of 2 gold and 1 silver medal in the Asian Para Games 2022) as its National Person with Disabilities (PwD) Icon.
- Her name was announced at an Exhibition Cricket Match between the Indian Deaf Cricket Association Team and District Cricket Association team, held in Delhi.

National Action Plan for Prevention and Control of Snakebite Envenoming (NAP-SE)



- The Union Health Ministry launched a National Action Plan for Prevention and Control of Snakebite Envenoming (NAP-SE) in India.
- Snakebite Envenoming
- The snakebite envenoming (poisoning from snake bites) was classified by the World Health Organisation (WHO) as a high-priority **neglected tropical disease**.
- An estimated 1.8 2.7 million people worldwide are envenomed annually.

## Snake bites in India

- In India, around 90% of snake bites are caused by the 'big four' among the crawlers – common krait, Indian cobra, Russell's viper and saw scaled viper.
- In India, around 50,000 deaths occur of an estimated 3-4 million snake bites annually which accounts for half of all snakebite deaths globally.
- India accounts for almost 50% of global snakebite deaths.

## About NAPSE

- Vision: "To prevent and control snakebite envenoming in order to halve the numbers of deaths and cases of disability that it causes by 2030"
- It aims at systematic reduction of snakebite envenoming risk through sustained availability of anti-snake venom, capacity building, referral mechanism and public education.
- NAPSE provides a broad framework for states to develop their own action plan for management, prevention and control of snakebites through the 'One Health' approach.

# Gender Inequality Index 2022

- The Gender Inequality Index 2022 has been released by UNDP in their Human Development Report 2023/2024.
- About the index
- GII is a composite metric of gender inequality using three dimensions:
  - reproductive health, empowerment and the labour market.
- A low GII value indicates low inequality between women and men, and vice-versa.

# Denmark topped the index followed by Norway, Switzerland and Sweden.

## India has registered a significant jump of 14 ranks in Gender Inequality Index 2022.

- It ranked 108 out of 193 countries with a score of 0.437 in GII 2022.
- In 2022, India saw improvements across all HDI indicators life expectancy, education, and gross national income (GNI) per capita and life expectancy rose from 67.2 to 67.7 years, expected years of schooling reached 12.6, mean years of schooling increased to 6.57 and GNI per capita saw an increase from USD 6,542 to USD 6,951.

To diagnose pre-diabetes and diabetes (both type 1 and type 2), the hemoglobin A1C (HbA1C) test, also known as the glycated hemoglobin or glycosylated hemoglobin test is used.

## Background

- India accounts for 17% of all diabetes patients in the world.
- Over 35% of Indians suffer from hypertension and nearly 40% from abdominal obesity, both of which are risk factors for diabetes.

- How does the test work?
- Sugar or glucose enters the bloodstream from the food it attaches to the hemoglobin in the red blood cells.
  - Hemoglobin is a protein that transports oxygen to all the cells of your body.
- Everybody has some sugar attached to their hemoglobin. Those with pre-diabetes and diabetes, however, have more.
- The HbA1C test measures the percentage of the red blood cells that have sugar-coated, or glycated, hemoglobin.

### Test Results

- The HbA1C levels are provided as either a percentage or in **mmol/mol** (which stands for millimoles per mole).
- An Hb1A1C below 5.7% is considered normal; between 5.7 and 6.4% may indicate you are pre-diabetic; and 6.5% or higher can indicate diabetes.

<b>Interpretation(s)</b> GLYCOSYLATED HEMOGLOBIN(HBA1C), EDTA WHOLE BLOOD-<b>Used For</b>:

1. Evaluating the long-term control of blood glucose concentrations in diabetic patients.

2. Diagnosing diabetes.

3. Identifying patients at increased risk for diabetes (prediabetes).

The ADA recommends measurement of HbA1c (typically 3-4 times per year for type 1 and poorly controlled type 2 diabetic patients, and 2 times per year for wellcontrolled type 2 diabetic patients) to determine whether a patients metabolic control has remained continuously within the target range.

1. eAG (Estimated average glucose) converts percentage HbA1c to md/dl, to compare blood glucose levels.

2. eAG gives an evaluation of blood glucose levels for the last couple of months.

3. eAG is calculated as eAG (mg/dl) = 28.7 \* HbA1c - 46.7

<b>HbA1c Estimation can get affected due to :</b>

1. Shortened Erythrocyte survival : Any condition that shortens erythrocyte survival or decreases mean erythrocyte age (e.g. recovery from acute blood loss, hemolytic anemia) will falsely lower HbA1c test results. Fructosamine is recommended in these patients which indicates diabetes control over 15 days.

2. Vitamin C & E are reported to falsely lower test results. (possibly by inhibiting glycation of hemoglobin.

# Model Code of Conduct (MCC)

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- Model Code of Conduct comes into force for 2024 Lok Sabha elections.
- Guidelines The MCC of the Election Commission of India (ECI) is a set of guidelines issued to regulate political parties and candidates prior to elections.
- Rules The rules range from issues related to speeches, polling day, polling booths, portfolios, the content of election manifestos, processions, and general conduct, so that free and fair elections are conducted.

- Comes into Force The MCC comes into force from the date the election schedule is announced until the date that results are out.
- Provisions The MCC contains eight provisions dealing with general conduct, meetings, processions, polling day, polling booths, observers, the party in power, and election manifestos.
- Restrictions Parties in both centre and state, should ensure that it does not use its official position for campaigning.

## • No policy, project or scheme can be announced that can influence the voting behaviour.

- No advertising at the cost of the public exchequer or using official mass media for publicity on achievements to improve chances of victory in the elections.
- Ministers must not combine official visits with election work or use official machinery for the same.
- Ruling party cannot use government transport or machinery for campaigning.
- Ruling government cannot make any ad-hoc appointments in government, public sector undertakings etc., which may influence the voters.

- Political parties can be criticised based only on their work record and no caste and communal sentiments can be used to lure voters.
- Mosques, Churches, Temples or any other places of worship should not be used for election campaigns.
- Bribing, intimidating or impersonation of voters is also barred.

- Election Silence Holding public meetings during the 48-hour period before the hour fixed for the closing of the poll is also prohibited.
- The 48-hour period is known as election silence.
- Binding Nature It has no statutory backing, meaning anybody breaching the MCC cannot be proceeded against under any clause of the Code. Everything is voluntary.

The ECI can issue a notice to a politician or a party for an alleged breach of the MCC either on its own or based on a complaint by another party or individual.

Once a notice is issued, the person or party must reply in writing, either accepting fault and tendering an unconditional apology or rebutting the allegation.

# Bhutan's Gelephu project

Bhutan's Gelephu project, a regional economic hub, aims to build a "Gelephu Mindfulness City" as a special administrative zone, focusing on non-polluting industries like IT and education.

This initiative, led by Bhutan's Prime Minister, seeks support from India for financing and expertise.

- The Gelephu Project is <u>significant for Bhutan</u> as it aims to promote tourism by upgrading the Gelephu airport, boosting employment, and addressing geopolitical concerns with China.
- For India, it strengthens ties with Bhutan, aligns with regional infrastructure plans, and facilitates demand for power supply through initiatives like the <u>South Asian power grid</u>.
