

Many pharma companies that bought poll bonds faced regulatory actions

A closer look at the electoral bond data indicates several firms in the pharmaceutical sector that purchased the bonds were under the scanner of the Enforcement Directorate or the I-T Department at some point in the past five years; some were also in the cross hairs of U.S. FDA over quality control

n March 15, The Hindu reported that many top pur-chasers of electoral bonds had also been under the scanner of the Enforce-ment Directorate or the Inment Directorate or the In-come Tax (I-T) Department at some point in the past five years. A closer look at the electoral bond data re-leased indicates more such companies, especially in the pharmaceutical sector.

For example, on July 6, 2022, the I-T Department searched more than 40 of-fices of the Bengalurubased pharmaceuticals maior Micro Labs Ltd., which makes Dolo 650.





2023 was the 'hottest year' on record, confirms WMO

In line with observations by climate agencies, the World Meteorological Organisation has officially confirmed 2023 to be the hottest year on record. "The State of Global Climate Report", published on Tuesday, stated that the global average near-surface temperature was 1.45 degrees Celsius (with a margin of uncertainty of \pm 0.12 degrees Celsius) above the pre-industrial baseline. It was the warmest 10-year period on record. The previous, joint warmest years were 2016 at 1.29 ± 0.12 degrees Celsius above the 1850-1900 average and 2020 at 1.27 ± 0.13 degree Celsius.

2023 warmest year on record, 2014-23 warmest decade: WMO

THE WORLD Meteorological Organisation (WMO) has made it official: 2023 was the warmest year on record, while the past decade (2014-23) was the warmest ever, the WMO said in its latest report on Tuesday.

In its annual State of the Climate Report, the WMO has said that global mean surface temperature in 2023 was 1.45 degrees Celsius higher than the average of the 1850-1900 pre-industrial period. This is significantly higher than the 1.29 degrees Celsius increase from pre-industrial times that was recorded in 2016.

The decadal average of the global mean surface temperature between 2014 and 2023 was 1.2 degrees Celsius higher than the pre-industrial average, making it the warmest 10-year period on record.

The WMO report noted that the observed concentrations of three main greenhouse gases — carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide — also touched new records in 2022, the last year for which consolidated global figures were available. Carbon dioxide

concentrations in 2022 had reached 417.9 parts per million, 150 per cent of the levels seen in the pre-industrial times, while methane concentrations were 1,923 parts per billion, which was 264 per cent of pre-industrial levels. Nitrous oxide concentrations in 2022 were observed at 335.8 parts per billion, which was 124 per cent of pre-industrial level, the report said.

Much of this information had been released in November last year, using data till October, in a provisional report that WMO brings out to coincide with the annual climate change conference. The data till October was so strong that none of the trends were expected to change during the remaining two months of the year. "Concentrations of greenhouse gases continued to rise (in 2022). Ocean heat content and sea level reached record observed highs and the rate of increase is accelerating. Antarctic sea ice extent hit record observed lows. Key glaciers suffered record losses. The climate crisis is the defining challenge that humanity faces," said Celeste Saulo, Secretary-General, WMO, in a statement.

With 70 per cent of Earth's area covered by water, the rising

greenhouse gases generate excess energy, which remains accumulated in the form of heat and is absorbed by oceans. In addition to this heat, oceans absorb carbon dioxide, which together with warming of the sea waters result in ocean acidification, rising sea level and more.

The ocean heat content in 2023 exceeded the 2022 value, thus reaching a 65-year high record, the WMO said.

The Mediterranean Sea and Atlantic Ocean remained unusually warm, besides the Pacific Ocean warming owing to the El Nino conditions that commenced in June last year.

As like heatwave and coldwave on land, there are oceanequivalent components in the oceans known as marine heat wave and marine cold wave, 2023 being an El Nino year — when there prevails higher than normal sea surface temperatures along the equatorial Pacific Ocean marine heat wave persisted along the North Atlantic Ocean. According to WMO, at least 32 per cent area of the total global oceans suffered from marine heatwave everyday last year (23 per cent area during the 2016 El Nino episode).

Delhi tops the list—world's most polluted capital city in 2023



DELHI WAS the most polluted capital city in the world last year, and the third most polluted city in India after Begusarai and Guwahati in terms of PM (Particulate Matter) 2.5 levels, according to the World Air Quality Report for 2023.

The report was prepared by IQAir, a Swiss air quality technology company. It uses data from monitoring stations of government agencies, educational institutions, and non-profits across the world, the report said.

In 2023, Delhi's annual average PM 2.5 level was 92.7 µg/m3—placing the Indian national capital at the top of a list of 114 capital cities in the world. This was followed by Dhaka in Bangladesh, with a PM 2.5 level of 80.2 µg/m3. Air quality guidelines of the World Health Organisation (WHO) suggest that annual average PM 2.5 levels should not exceed 5 µg/m3.

But within the country, Begusarai in Bihar and Guwahati in Assam fared worse than Delhi in terms of annual average PM 2.5

Causing an estimated one in every nine deaths worldwide, air pollution is the greatest environmental threat to human health.

Key Findings – <u>India</u> had the *third-worst air quality* out of 134 countries in 2023 after Bangladesh and Pakistan.

PM2.5 Concentration – India (54.4 micrograms per cubic metre), Bangladesh (79.9 micrograms per cubic metre) and Pakistan (73.7 micrograms per cubic metre).

In 2022, India was ranked as the eighth most <u>polluted</u> country with an average PM2.5 concentration of 53.3 micrograms per cubic metre.

Begusarai – Begusarai, in Bihar stood out as the most polluted metropolitan area globally with an average PM2.5 concentration of 118.9 micrograms per cubic metre.

The city did not even figure in the 2022 rankings.

It is estimated that 1.36 billion people in India experience PM2.5 concentrations exceeding the World Health Organisation (WHO) recommended annual guideline level of 5 micrograms per cubic metre.

FSSAI sets up lab network to test food for pathogens

WITH FOOD poisoning and diarrhoea becoming a common occurrence, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) is working towards creating a network of 34 microbiology labs across the country that will be equipped to test food products for 10 pathogens, including E coli, salmonella and listeria.

"These labs will help test food for microbial contamination that can lead to spoilage of food and potential health risks," said a senior health official of FSSAI.

diarrhoea and food poisoning is so common that most people do not even report such instances. However, it is the job of the department to ensure that the food is safe. These labs will be able to test the food samples collected during routine surveillance for microbes now."

Data from the National Centre for Disease Control, which tracks the trajectory of several diseases every week, shows that acute diarrhoeal disease and food poisoning were the two most common outbreaks in the country. There were over 1,100 outbreaks of acute diarrhoeal disease across the country in the last four years and nearly 550 outbreaks of food poisoning.

However, none of the state food safety labs are currently equipped to test for pathogens as they require maintaining live reference samples, expensive reagents and a microbiologist. 'There are 79 state food testing laboratories in the country, but none of them really tests for microbes. They are equipped to test for protein or carbohydrate content of a food item to see whether it has what is written on the pack," said the official.

Pandavula Gutta boasts Palaeolithic (500,000 BCE–10,000 BCE) cave paintings offering a glimpse into prehistoric life.

- The cave paintings depict wildlife like Bison, Antelope, Tiger, and Leopard, as well as **shapes like swastika symbols**, circles, squares, and weapons.
- The paintings also feature geometrical designs and impressions in green, red, yellow, and white pigment colours.
- The topography of Pandavula Gutta makes it a popular destination for rock climbing enthusiasts.




What are the Key Facts About Ramgarh Crater?

Ramgarh Crater, Rajasthan formed around 165 million years ago due to a meteor impact, this 3-km diameter crater provides essential ecosystem services, contributing to the region's ecological balance and biodiversity.

Recognised as a Ramgarh Conservation Reserve under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, the Ramgarh Crater is protected to preserve its unique ecological and cultural heritage.

It is declared as the Ramgarh Conservation Reserve under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and the presence of Pushkar Talab complex within the crater, recognised as wetlands under Wetland (Conservation & Management) Rules, 2017.


Exercise Bharat Shakti

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) integrated Ombudsman Scheme (RB-IOS)



The number of complaints filed under the **Reserve Bank's ombudsman schemes** increased by over 68 per cent to 7.03 lakh in the fiscal 2022-23.

About RB-IOS

The RB-IOS was introduced on November 12, 2021.

It integrates the erstwhile three Ombudsman schemes of RBI namely, (i) the Banking Ombudsman Scheme, 2006; (ii) the Ombudsman Scheme for Non-Banking Financial Companies, 2018; and (iii) the Ombudsman Scheme for Digital Transactions, 2019

The Scheme simplifies the grievance redress process at RBI by enabling the customers of Regulated Entities (REs) to register their complaints at one centralised reference point.

RB-IOS, 2021 covers all commercial banks, Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs), Payment System Participants, most Primary (Urban) Cooperative Banks, and Credit Information Companies.

The objective of the Scheme is to resolve the customer grievances involving 'deficiency in service' on part of REs in a speedy, cost-effective and satisfactory manner.



Bank of Japan exits world's last negative-rate regime in landmark policy shift recently.

A negative interest rate policy (NIRP) is a monetary policy that allows central banks to set interest rates **below 0%**.

This policy used to encourage borrowing, spending, and investment, rather than hoarding cash.

Central banks and regulators use negative interest rates when there are <u>signs</u> <u>of deflation</u>.

In a negative interest rate environment, borrowers are paid interest instead of paying interest to lenders.

NIRP is seen as a "last resort" policy to use after exhausting all other options.

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
