The Supreme Court on Monday held in a judgment that a film trailer is not a promise or an agreement enforceable by law. A producer cannot be held liable for unfair trade practice if the contents of the promo do not feature in the actual movie.

"A song, dialogue, or a short visual in a promotional trailer may be seen in the context of the multifarious uses of advertisements. These could be used to popularise or to create a buzz about the release of the film, rather than to purely represent information about the contents of the film," a Bench headed by Justice P.S. Narasimha observed.

The judgment set aside an order of the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission in 2017, directing Yash Raj Films to pay ₹10,000 as

The Government of India instituted two civilian awards-Bharat Ratna & Padma Vibhushan in 1954.



The latter had three classes namely Pahela Varg, Dusra Varg and Tisra Varg.



These were subsequently renamed as Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri vide Presidential Notification issued on January 8, 1955.

- Padma Awards, which were instituted in the year 1954, is announced every year on the occasion of Republic Day except for brief interruption(s) during the years 1978 and 1979 and 1993 to 1997.
- The award is given in three categories, namely,
- Padma Vibhushan for exceptional and distinguished service;
- Padma Bhushan for distinguished service of a high order; and
- <u>Padma Shri</u> for distinguished service.
- All persons without distinction of race, occupation, position or sex are eligible for these awards.
   However, Government servants including those working with PSUs, except doctors and scientists, are not eligible for these Awards.

- The awards are presented by the President of India usually in the month of March/April every year where the awardees are presented a Sanad (certificate) signed by the President and a medallion.
- The recipients are also given a small replica of the medallion, which they can wear during any ceremonial/State functions etc., if the awardees so desire. The names of the awardees are published in the Gazette of India on the day of the presentation ceremony.
- The total number of awards to be given in a year (excluding posthumous awards and to NRI/foreigners/OCIs) should not be more than 120.
- The award does not amount to a title and cannot be used as a suffix or prefix to the awardees' name

- All nominations received for Padma Awards are placed before the Padma Awards Committee, which is constituted by the Prime Minister every year.
- The Padma Awards Committee is headed by the Cabinet Secretary and includes Home Secretary, Secretary to the President and four to six eminent persons as members.
- The recommendations of the committee are submitted to the Prime Minister and the President of India for approval.

Padma Awards - one of the highest civilian Awards of the country, are conferred in three categories, namely, Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri. The Awards are given in various disciplines / fields of activities, viz.- art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, civil service, etc. 'Padma Vibhushan' is awarded for exceptional and distinguished service; 'Padma Bhushan' for distinguished service of high order and 'Padma Shri' for distinguished service in any field. The awards are announced on the occasion of Republic Day every year.

2. These Awards are conferred by the President of India at ceremonial functions which are held at Rashtrapati Bhawan usually around March / April every year. For the year 2024, the President has approved conferment of 132 Padma Awards including 2 duo cases (in a duo case, the Award is counted as one) as per list below. The list comprises 5 Padma Vibhushan, 17 Padma Bhushan and 110 Padma Shri Awards. 30 of the awardees are women and the list also includes 8 persons from the category of Foreigners / NRI / PIO / OCI and 9 Posthumous awardees.

# A lesson from Taiwan in quake resilience

n the last two decades, major earthquakes have occurred in many parts of the world including Indonesia, Japan, China, Italy, Nepal, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Ecuador, Mexico, Morocco, and the Turkey-Syria border. On April 3, Taiwan was struck by an earthquake of 7.4 magnitude These earthquakes cannot be reated as random occurrences, as earthquake-prone regions share some tectonic similarities.

regional bands. The spatial distribution is explained by the theory of plate tectonics, which explains how the Earth's explains how the Earth's outermost layer, the lithosphere, is broken into 15 major fragments or plates which are constantly moving relative to each other. This is why powerful earthquakes are concentrated along convergent plate boundaries like the Himalayas, a tectonic product of the convergence of the Indian and

Eurasian plates. The earthquake in Nepal in 2015 caused severe devastation in central Nepal, but spared India. This was an example of an earthquake originating from under the Himalayas. On April 4, 2024, the region around Manali in Himachal Pradesh was struck by an earthquake of magnitude 5.3. an earthquake of magnitude 5.3. On the same day, 119 years ago, an earthquake occurred near Kangra, not far from Manali, killing thousands of people and levelling the buildings in the region.

The story of two earthquakes The story of two earthquakes In the Taiwan region, the Philippine Sea plate is moving northwest towards the Eurasian plate at a velocity of about 7.8 cm per year, which is faster than the motion of the Indian plate. Lying 160 km off the coast of China, Taiwan was formed at a convergent boundary of the Philippine and Eurasian plates in the western Pacific Ocean. It is a untry of strong earthquakes.

The 1999 earthquake was a major wake-up call that led to critical administrative reforms to improve emergency response and reduce disasters. The government passed the Disaster Prevention and Protection Act and set up two national centres to handle earthquake coordination and training. Between the Chi-Chi and

training. Between the Chi-Chi and Hualien earthquakes, Taiwan mounted a consistent effort in implementing building codes.
Today, Taiwan's earthquake preparedness is among the most advanced in the world. The island nation has the most advanced earthquake-monitoring network and early warning systems. Widespread awareness campaign and drills on earthquake safety have improved the public's understanding of earthquake risks. The government constantly existing building stock and incentivises residents by of

sound scientific judgements based on how severe the shaking would be in each location. With the knowledge of the frequency of earthquakes in each source and how severely the ground shakes in a particular area, specific seismic codes can be designed, and specific construction norms can be followed. Taiwan could also use new technologies such as seismic dampers and base isolation systems. Taiwan's most iconic building, Taipei 101, escaped damage during the latest earthquake. One of the earthquake. One of the components that helped the building retain its integrity was a tuned mass damper, a 660-metric-ton steel sphere suspended by cables within the tower. This acts as a giant pendulum to counter any motion of the building.

What India can do What India can do As India is going through a major phase of infrastructural expansion in many tectonically unstable regions including the Himalayas, sometimes flagrantly violating the norms that should be followed in ecologically sensitive areas, earthquake safety should be of earthquake safety should be of particular concern. All infrastructural projects must comply with seismic safety regulations. The Taiwan earthquake provides important earthquake provides important lessons for India. These include following seismic codes, seismic codes, seismic codes, services and overcoming inadequacies in the enforcement and non-compilance of seismic and non-compilance of seismic particular region, are prepared particular region, are prepared based on local earthquake activity, building types, and construction specifies seismic designs based on specifies seismic designs based on materiais. Indian code is 1893 specifies seismic designs based on seismic zonation maps so that buildings do not collapse. In some parts of India, traditional architectural styles possessing

earthquake resistivity can be rediscovered and encouraged.

A record number – just under 5,000 – people had arrived in the U.K. on boats via the English Channel in the first quarter of this year, according to U.K. government data. Afghanistan, Iran, Pakistan, India and Bangladesh were the top five countries of origin for migrants arriving in boats in 2023.

there tonight – and vote – no matter how late it goes," Mr. Sunak said at a press conference in Downing Street on Monday. The House of Commons and Lords were scheduled to consider the Safety of Rwanda (Asylum and Immigration) Bill on Monday.

The House of Lords, where Mr. Sunak's Conservative party does not have a majority, had passed amendments last week to exempt Afghan asylum seekers who had helped British operations in Afghanistan and to establish an independent body to review Rwanda's asylum system.

Immigration is a highly sensitive issue in the U.K., which is moving towards a general election in the second half of 2024. The initial plan to send illegal migrants to Rwanda was announced by the Boris Johnson government in 2022. The policy has faced numerous legal challenges, including from the European Court of Human Rights (EHCR) and no flights to Rwanda have taken off to date.

The current version of the Rwanda Bill declares that Rwanda is a safe country to send asylum seekers – a clause designed to circumvent a November 2023 U.K. Supreme Court ruling that said the policy (as it existed at the time) was unlawful. The deportation process would kick off as soon as the vote was over, Mr. Sunak said, as he outlined some of the preparations – from courtrooms to security escorts and flight slots.


ple smuggling gangs as part of their messaging around the deportation Bill and Mr. Sunak, on Monday, said the gangs were currently targeting vulnerable Vietnamese migrants, whose numbers had "increased tenfold" and who accounted for "almost all" the increase in migrant-carrying small boats arriving across the English Channel.

Mr Sunak's party has trailed the opposition Labour Party in polls for some time and stopping the boat crossings has been one of the Prime Minister's pledges. On Monday, he accused Labour of not having a plan to prevent boat crossings and was "resigned to the idea that you will never fully solve this problem".



# India ranks 4th in global military spending



INDIA WAS THE fourth largest military spender globally in 2023, a leading conflict thinktank said on Monday. At \$83.6 billion, the country's military expenditure was 4.2% higher than in 2022. At \$83.6 billion, the country's military expenditure was 4.2% higher than in 2022.

Meanwhile, global military expenditure grew 7% to \$2.43 trillion in 2023, the steepest annual rise since 2009 as international peace and security deteriorated.

As per the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) report, the 10 largest spenders in 2023, led by the United States, China and Russia, all increased their military spending.

Nan Tian, senior researcher at SIPRI's Military Expenditure and Arms Production The top 15 spenders account for over 80% of world military expenditure in 2023



Programme, said: "States are prioritising military strength but they risk an action-reaction spiral in the increasingly volatile geopolitical and security landscape."

SIPRI said Russia raised spending by 24% to an estimated \$109 billion. Ukraine

increased spending by 51% to \$65 billion and received at least \$35 billion in military aid from other countries.

"Combined, this aid and Ukraine's military spending were equivalent to about 91% of Russian spending," the think-tank said.

It said NATO member countries' spending totalled 55% of the world's expenditure.

"For European NATO states, the past two years of war in Ukraine have fundamentally changed the security outlook," SIPRI researcher Lorenzo Scarazzato said.

"This shift in threat perceptions is reflected in growing shares of GDP being directed towards military spending, with the NATO target of 2% increasingly being seen as a baseline rather than a threshold to reach."

NATO member states are expected to set aside at least 2% of gross domestic product for defence expenditure by the alliance.

SIPRI said most European NATO members had boosted such spending. The U.S. raised it by 2% to \$916 billion, representing around two-thirds of total NATO military spending.






- Portuguese Rule in Goa






