The "Framework for the U.S.-India Major Defence Partnership" was signed by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and U.S. Secretary of War Pete Hegseth on the sidelines of the 12th ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus (ADMM-Plus) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, on Friday. The development came amid strained ties due to Washington's slapping of 50% tariffs on Indian goods.

According to the Ministry of Defence, both sides appreciated the continuing momentum in bilateral defence cooperation and

Both sides had already launched the COMPACT initiative (Catalyzing Opportunities for Military Partnership, Accelerated Commerce and Technology) to drive transformative changes in key areas of defence cooperation.

The new framework underscores a shared intent to respond jointly to common security threats, deter conflict, and uphold the sovereignty and autonomy of regional partners, while laying the foundation for collective peace and prosperity in the region.

'Priority partner'

The U.S. Secretary of War on Friday reiterated that India remains a priority partner for Washington in defence cooperation.

In a post, Mr. Hegseth stated that the framework advances the bilateral defence partnership, a cornerstone for regional stability and deterrence. "We're enhancing our coordination, info sharing, and tech cooperation. Our defense ties have never been stronger," he wrote.

The defence framework is expected to give unified policy direction to transform and expand the partnership between the two countries over the next decade, the Ministry added.

The Ministry further said that India and the U.S. continue to expand their defence relationship through regular military exercises, intelligence sharing, industrial collaboration, and joint mechanisms for strategic coordination with regional and global partners.

The meeting on Friday included delegation-level discussions followed by one-on-one interaction between the two leaders.

In May this year, Mr. Singh and Mr. Hegseth held a telephonic conversation to review ongoing and upcoming initiatives aimed at strengthening defence cooperation. During that exchange, Mr. Hegseth had invited Mr. Singh to visit the U.S. for in-person discussions to advance bilateral defence ties. Mr. Singh's planned visit in August was, however, postponed amid tariff-related developments.



Kerala becomes first State to declare itself free of extreme poverty

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan declared Kerala 'free from extreme poverty' at a special session of the Assembly on the occasion of the State Formation Day (Kerala Piravi) on Saturday, making it the first State to do so.

The Opposition United Democratic Front walked out of the session questioning the propriety of convening a special session just for the Chief Minister to make a statement under Rule 300 of the House procedures. Leader of the Opposition V.D. Satheesan also called it a "hollow proclamation".

Mr. Vijayan, who called

this year's Kerala Piravi the birth of a new era, spoke at length about the four-year long process that led to the declaration. Refuting the Opposition charge that the declaration was a publicity stunt ahead of the local body elections, he said that the implementation of the Extreme Poverty Eradication Programme was a decision taken in the first Cabinet meeting of the Left Democratic Front in 2021.

Programme process

"We only make promises we can fulfil and we have fulfilled what we promised," he said. "This proud achievement belongs to the entire people of Kerala. We are witnessing a historic moment," the

Chief Minister said. He said that the process of identifying the extremely poor families began within two months of that decision, with active public participation, including local body representatives, Kudumbashree workers, volunteers and officials.

The families identified through data collection at the local body level were scrutinised and recommended by ward committees. This was subjected to another check and a draft list was prepared. This list was presented to the grama sabhas and from it, 1,03,099 individuals from 64,006 families were identified as extremely poor. Considering food, health, housing and income as the

critical factors for identifying the extremely poor, micro plans were prepared for each family.

In the first phase of the project, essential documents were provided to 21,263 people, who were struggling without even the basic documents. Regular supply of food has now been ensured through Kudumbashree for 20,648 extremely poor families. Health services, access to medicines, vaccinations, palliative care and organ transplants have been ensured, he said.

MGNREGS roped in

Houses were provided under the LIFE mission for 4,677 families, while 2,713 families were provided land and houses. Livelihood support was provided to 4,394 families. A total of 35,041 families were made part of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS).

A scheme to provide special attention to 5,583 children through the Education Department and free travel for educational purposes was implement-

ed. Scholarships were provided to 331 students. A total of 28 single-member families were shifted to safe shelter homes.

"The process of eradicating extreme poverty is a continuation of the steps taken earlier for the universal public distribution system and for the eradication of landlessness and homelessness. Kerala has made remarkable progress in the Sustainable Development Index envisioned by the UN by eradicating extreme poverty. Our State is a laboratory for many welfare activities. In terms of extreme poverty alleviation too, we can hope our experiments will become a model other States can benefit from,"he added.



A report in July 2024 by V. Viallon and coauthors (Scientific Reports 14, 16330) discussed the use of a healthy lifestyle index (HLI) to investigate specific disease outcomes. The authors studied how individual lifestyles were associated with disease outcomes. They used data from the European Prospective Investigation into Cancer and Nutrition (EP-IC) and the risk of diseases like type 2 diabetes, cancer, and cardiovascular disorders, causing premature death. Some of these lifestyles also involved unhealthy practices smoking, excess alcohol consumption, dietary habits, adiposity (excess fat in the body), and excessive sleep.

In the same vein, a paper by Reynaldo Cordova of Spain and coauthors from Denmark, South Korea, Northern Ireland-U.K., and Denmark, titled 'Plantbased dietary patterns and age-specific risk of multimorbidity of cancer and cardiometabolic diseases: a prospective analysis' appeared in the August 2025 issue of The Lancet -Healthy Longevity. The term 'multimorbidity' refers to the presence of two or more long-term (chronic) health conditions in a single person.

The researchers examined data of about 2.3 lakh individuals with such multimorbid cancer from the EPIC data bank and 1.81 lakh individuals from the UK Biobank. Based on analysing this data, they pointed out the crucial role and

mechanism of insulin resistance in metabolic disease. Upon comparing specific cohorts of people aged 35-70 and/or with characteristics such as certain dietary habits, the researchers concluded that a healthy plant-based diet might reduce the burden of multimorbidity of cancer and cardiometabolic diseases.

The study also reported evidence of how plantbased diets are also environmentally more sustainable than diets with a higher proportion of animal products (including meat, fish, and eggs).

The researchers were able to associate a higher adherence to a healthy plant-based diet with a lower risk of cancer and cardiovascular diseases (including hypertension, stroke, heart attack, and type 2 diabetes).

Destiny's child Shafali Verma scripted a sensational comeback story, with a half-century and two key wickets in the final to seal India's coronation.

ISRO launches advanced GSAT-7R, India's heaviest communication satellite

The Indian Space Research Organisation on Sunday successfully launched the Indian Navy's advanced communication satellite GSAT-7R (CMS-03) from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.

The indigenously designed and developed satellite, weighing approximately 4,400 kg, is India's heaviest communication satellite to date and marks a major milestone in strengthening the Navy's space-based communications and maritime domain awareness.

The ISRO launched the rocket aboard its most powerful launch vehicle, the LVM3, on its M5 mission. The lift-off took place at about 5.26 p.m. from the second launch pad, and mission control soon confirmed that the satellite had been successfully inserted into a geosynchronous transfer orbit (GTO).

This is the heaviest Indian-bull communications satellite launched from Indian soil so far. Because of the high mass of the GSAT-7R, the launch vehicle targeted a standard GTO; once there, the satellite will raise and circularise its orbit using its onboard propulsion systems.

Boost to self-reliance

The Navy said that equipped with state-of-theart indigenous components, the GSAT-7R would provide robust and secure telecommunication coverage across the Indian Ocean Region. Its advanced payload features transponders supporting

voice, data, and video links over multiple communication bands, ensuring seamless connectivity between the Navy's ships, submarines, aircraft, and Maritime Operations Centres.

The launch highlights India's growing self-reliance in space technology and the Navy's commitment to safeguarding national maritime interests, it said.

It stands as a testament to Aatmanirbhar Bharat, enabling the armed forces to operate with enhanced situational awareness and secure, high-capacity communication links in complex maritime environments, it added.

The launch also demonstrated the capacity of the LVM3 rocket to routinely handle four-tonne-plus satellites to GTO from India, reducing dependence on foreign launchers for heavy communications satellites as well as feeding directly into ISRO's preparations for Gaganyaan, its maiden human spaceflight programme, which plans to use an evolved LVM3 variant.

"ISRO has successfully launched the heaviest GEO communication satellite from Indian soil," ISRO Chairman V. Narayanan posted on X following the successful launch. "The Indian space sector is soaring high to provide valuable services to the user community in and around the Indian region," he added.





Barring MP, Leh now has no elected representatives

The five-year term of the hill council came to an end on October 31 and fresh elections may be held only after talks between civil society groups and Union Home Ministry take a decisive turn

s Leh district in Ladakh ceases to have any elected representatives from October 31, with the five-year term of the hill council coming to an end, elections to the local body are likely to be held only after ongoing talks between civil society groups and the Centre take a decisive turn, officials said. Ladakh MP Mohammad Haneefa is now its onby representative.

On October 22, a month after after four people were killed in police action against protesters seeking Statehood, the civil society groups Leh Apex Body (LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) – representing the two districts in Ladakh – resumed talks on the region's status with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).

The groups were asked by the government to prepare a draft framework, including a road map for constitutional safeguards for Ladakh. Though dates for the next meeting are yet to be announced, the LAB and KDA have taken the help of legal experts to argue for their existing demands, including inclusion under the Sixth Schedule

of the Constitution (tribal status) and Statehood, members of the groups said. "The LAB and KDA are drafting their suggestions and would share notes to present a common proposal," said Sajjad Kargili of the KDA.

Special provisions

At the October 22 meeting, Ministry officials indicated to the two groups that special provisions guaranteed under Article 371 of the Constitution can be considered for Ladakh.

On October 31, an order by the Ladakh administration cited ongoing process for creation of new districts and the consequent need for redrawing boundaries of council areas and constituencies, for the delay in holding elections. Besides, it also highlighted the need for implementation of the amendment to the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils (LAHDC) Act, 1997, providing one-third reservation for women in the LAHDCs. and said "holding elections to constitute a new LAHDC, Leh, is not practicable at this stage, as it would lead to representational anomalies and administrative inconsistencies".

The order delegated the hill council's functions to the Deputy Commissioner "until a new council is constituted following fresh elections".

The new districts were announced in 2024 and women's reservation was notified on June 3 this year.

Detrimental effect

Konchok Stanzin, former councillor of Chushul along China border, said barring an MP, there were no public representatives in Leh. "This is particularly detrimental for people living in the regions bordering China. If they have an issue, they will have to come to the district headquarters in Leh city, hundreds of kilometres away. Most people do not have the resources for that. As a councillor. I used to take care of their demands pertaining to connectivity, education, health, and livelihood, among others," Mr. Stanzin told The Hindu.

He said the hill council is empowered to take decisions on 40 functions and each councillor has a development fund of ₹1.5 crore.

The election to the 30member LAHDC, Leh was last held in 2020, with the BJP winning 15 seats and the Congress nine. Four councillors are nominated by the Lieutenant-Governor. The LAHDC for Kargil district was constituted in 2023 and its term will come to an end in 2028.

For 2025-26, the Leh hill council was allocated ₹255 crore by the MHA.

Washington: In a stunning testament to the boom in Artificial Intelligence (AI), three 22-year-old high school friends from Silicon Valley, including two Indian-Americans, have become the world's youngest self-made billionaires.

Brendan Foody, Adarsh Hiremath and Surya Midha, co-founders of the San Francisco-based AI recruiting platform Mercor, achieved the staggering feat after their company recently secured

Metros Among the Worst Performers

- Chennai and Delhi also performed poorly, placing third and tenth respectively.
- Greater Mumbai and Faridabad joined the list, showing that even financially strong cities continue to grapple with garbage management and drainage inefficiencies.

Russia Becomes India's Top Supplier of Sunflower Oil



• According to industry data, Russian shipments to India have surged twelvefold over the past four years, now accounting for nearly 56% of India's total sunflower oil imports.

• Sunflower oil is India's third-most consumed edible oil after palm and soybean oil. The country imports nearly 60% of its total cooking oil requirement, as domestic production remains low.

Palm oil accounts for about half of these imports. Interestingly, sunflower
oil gained popularity in 2023–2024 when its prices fell below palm oil,
narrowing the price gap with soybean oil. H

Gogabeel Lake Declared India's 94th Ramsar Site

- India has expanded its network of internationally recognised wetlands with the inclusion of Bihar's Gogabeel Lake as the country's 94th Ramsar site.
- The announcement marks another milestone in India's ongoing commitment to wetland conservation under the global Ramsar Convention.
- The oxbow lake, located in Katihar district between the Ganga and Mahananda rivers, is Bihar's first community reserve and a vital ecological habitat managed by local communities.

• With 94 Ramsar sites, India continues to lead Asia and ranks third globally, after the United Kingdom (176) and Mexico (144). The nation has added 67 wetlands to the list over the past 11 years, covering an area exceeding 13.6 lakh hectares.

Shenzhou-21 – China Launches Youngest Astronaut and Lab Mice to Tiangong Space Station

• China successfully has launched the Shenzhou-21 mission to its Tiangong space station, carrying a three-member crew that includes the country's youngest-ever astronaut and four laboratory mice.

• The mission marks another stride in China's rapidly expanding space programme, which aims to send astronauts to the Moon by 2030.



PM Modi to Inaugurate India's First Digital Tribal Freedom Fighters Museum

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Shaheed Veer Narayan Singh Memorial and Tribal Freedom Fighters Museum in Chhattisgarh on the state's 25th foundation day.
- The event will mark the launch of India's first fully digital museum dedicated to tribal heroes, along with infrastructure projects worth over ₹14,260 crore.
- The grand celebration will take place in Naya Raipur, where the Prime Minister will also unveil a statue of Bharat Ratna Atal Bihari Vajpayee at the newly constructed Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly.

Maldives Enforces World's First Generational Tobacco Ban

• The Maldives has become the first country globally to impose a generational ban on tobacco and vaping, marking a historic step towards a smoke-free future. The law, effective from November 1, 2025, prohibits anyone born after January 1, 2007—including tourists—from purchasing or using tobacco products.

- Comprehensive Ban on Vaping and E-Cigarettes
- Unlike similar policies elsewhere, the Maldives' law extends to all electronic smoking devices.
- The import, sale, possession, and use of vaping products are banned across every age group. Violations attract heavy penalties: retailers selling to underage buyers face fines up to 50,000 Maldivian rufiyaa (around ₹2.9 lakh), while individuals using e-cigarettes risk fines of 5,000 rufiyaa (about ₹29,000).

India to Triple Rare Earth Magnet Incentives to \$788 Million

- India plans to expand its rare earth magnet manufacturing incentive scheme to over ₹7,000 crore (\$788 million), nearly tripling the earlier allocation.
- The move seeks to secure critical materials for electric vehicles, renewable energy, and defence as the country works to reduce reliance on China, which dominates the global supply chain.

- What are the Provisions Related to Formation of States/UTs in India?
 - Part I of the Indian Constitution: It is titled "The Union and Its Territory" and comprises Articles 1 to 4.
 - It defines India as a "Union of States", specifies the names and territories of States and Union Territories, and empowers Parliament to admit or establish new States and to alter the area, boundaries, or names of existing States.
 - Article 1: It declares India as a Union of States, which includes all States, Union Territories, and any territories that may be acquired in the future.
 - This reflects the idea of a strong Union with an indestructible centre but flexible units.



- Articles 2: Empowers Parliament to admit new States into the Union or establish new States on such terms and conditions as it deems fit.
- Article 3: It gives Parliament the authority to form a new State by separating territory from any existing State or by merging two or more States or Union Territories.
 - It also allows alteration of the area, boundaries, or name of any existing State.
 - However, a Bill for this purpose can be introduced only with the **prior recommendation of the President**, who must refer it to the concerned State Legislature for its **views**.
 - The State Legislature's opinion is not binding on Parliament, and no such reference is required in the case of a Union Territory.
 - This provision has enabled major reorganisations such as the creation of Chhattisgarh,
 Jharkhand, Uttarakhand (2000) and Telangana (2014).



• Articles 4: Any law made under Articles 2 or 3 may amend the First Schedule (list of States and UTs) and the Fourth Schedule (Rajya Sabha seat allocation). Such a law is not treated as a Constitutional Amendment under Article 368.



• In K.S. Shivappa vs Smt. K. Neelamma Case 2025, the Supreme Court (SC) ruled that after attaining majority, a person can repudiate a property sale made by their guardian without court sanction, either by filing a suit or through clear conduct, such as reselling the property.

- Legal Framework: The laws on property acquired by minors through their guardians are determined through 3 pieces of legislation:
 - Indian Contract Act, 1872: Only persons of majority age and sound mind are competent to contract. Contracts by minors are void ab initio—invalid from the beginning.
 - A valid contract requires consent, a lawful object, legal consideration, and competent parties—the last being crucial when a minor is represented by a guardian.

- **Hindu Minority and Guardianship Act, 1956:** Natural guardians must act for the **minor's benefit**. Guardians **cannot sell, mortgage, or lease** a minor's immovable property **without court permission**.
 - Any sale without permission is voidable at the instance of the minor.
- Guardian and Wards Act, 1890: A guardian cannot dispose of a ward's property without the court's sanction.
- Limitation Act, 1963: It grants a person 3 years after attaining majority to challenge or set aside such a property transfer.

India Crosses 500 GW Power Capacity Mark



 - Non-fossil fuel sources: 256.09 GW (≈51%) including Solar(127.33 GW), Wind (53.12 GW), Hydro (30.29 GW) and Nuclear (45.25 GW).
