



## Trump claims U.S. averted 'nuclear conflict'

The U.S. did not just "broker the ceasefire" between India and Pakistan, it averted a "nuclear conflict", said U.S. President Donald Trump in his latest claims, adding that he had threatened to stop trade with both countries unless they agreed to end hostilities.

The comments, the first statement the U.S. President made in person at the White House on the developments, were rebutted by Indian government sources, who said there had been "no reference to trade" during talks between Indian and U.S. officials over de-escalating the situation last week.

"I said [to the Indian and Pakistani leadership], let's stop it. If you stop it, we're doing trade. If you don't stop it, we're not going to do any trade," Mr. Trump told reporters at

the White House on Monday, repeating some of the claims he had made over the weekend in social media posts and added that trade was the "big" reason the two sides reached an understanding to stop military action against each other. He added that the U.S. is "negotiating with India" at present, disclosing for the first time that the U.S. planned to start negotiating on trade with Pakistan as well.

Government sources, however, denied the claim. The sources said that after the commencement of Operation Sindoor on May 7, U.S. Vice-President J.D. Vance had spoken to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 9, while U.S. Secretary of State and NSA Marco Rubio spoke to External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on May 8 and to National Security Adviser Ajit Doval on May 10, when the ceasefire agreement was made.

"There was no reference to trade in any of these discussions," they said.

Mr. Trump also said that U.S. officials had "stopped the nuclear conflict" between India and Pakistan. "I think it could have been a bad nuclear war. Millions of people could have been killed. So I'm very proud of that," the U.S. President said in his comments.

#### Misri to brief panel

The controversial statements are likely to be raised by Opposition MPs at the next parliamentary committee meeting on external affairs, expected to be held next Monday, when Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri is expected to brief on the developments between India and Pakistan.

It is unclear whether Mr. Trump's reference to a possible nuclear conflict was connected to widespread speculation about the im-

pact of India's air strikes on May 10 on a suspected nuclear site in an area called the Kirana Hills near the PAF's Mushaf base in Sargodha. When asked about the reports, Air Marshal A.K. Bharti said Indian forces did not know about the site. "We did not hit Kirana Hills, whatever is there," he added. However, the government has not so far clarified on record about Mr. Trump's other contentions, including the claim of mediation.

As *The Hindu* had reported, several former diplomats had criticised Mr. Trump's comments, in two social media posts about the U.S.'s role in India-Pakistan talks, saying that they violate India's principles against third-party mediation, hyphenation with Pakistan, or internationalisation of internal issues.

# U.S., China agree to roll back recent tariffs for talks to end trade dispute



GENEVA

U.S. and Chinese officials said on Monday that they had reached a deal to roll back most of their recent tariffs and call a 90-day truce in their trade war to allow for more talks on resolving their trade disputes.

Trade Representative Jamieson Greer, who announced thetariff reductions at a news conference in Geneva with Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said the U.S. has agreed to drop its 145% tariff rate on Chinese goods by 115 percentage points to 30%, while China agreed to lower its rate on U.S. goods by the same amount to 10%.

China's Commerce Ministry said the two sides agreed to cancel 91% in tariffs on each other's goods



and suspend another 24% in tariffs for 90 days, bringing the total reduction to 115 percentage points.

The Ministry called the agreement an important step for the resolution of the two countries' diffe-

rences and said it lays the foundation for further cooperation.

"This initiative aligns with the expectations of producers and consumers in both countries and serves the interests of both nations as well as the common interests of the world," a Ministry statement said.

The two U.S. officials struck a positive tone as they said the two sides had set up consultations to continue discussing their trade issues. The high tariff levels would have amounted to a complete blockage of each side's goods – an outcome neither side wants, Mr. Bessent said at the news briefing following two days of talks in Geneva.

"The consensus from both delegations this weekend is neither side wants a decoupling," Mr. Bessent said. "And what had occurred with these very high tariff... was an embargo, the equivalent of an embargo. And neither side wants that. We do want trade."



Bengaluru Smart Infrastructure Limited (B-SMILE), a dedicated special-purpose vehicle (SPV) to execute big ticket infrastructure projects in the city, will have an initial financial commitment of ₹7,000 crore from the Karnataka government, but is authorised to attract private investment as well.

This dual approach is designed to enable greater flexibility and resource mobilisation for large-scale urban infrastructure projects, sources said.

However, the company will be fully owned by the State. According to the Memorandum of Association, the government of Karnataka will hold a 90% equity stake in the compa-

ny, while the Bruhat bengaluru mahanagara palike (BBMP) will retain the remaining 10%.

B-SMILE will be governed by an 11-member board, led by a full-time Chief Executive Officer, who is an IAS officer. The board will include the Mayor of Bengaluru, the Commissioners of the Ban-

galore Development Authority and the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board, the Engineer-in-Chief of the BBMP, and three experts from the private sector. This blend of public officials and domain specialists is expected to lend both administrative strength and technical expertise to the organisation.

The board is expected to be further revamped after the implementation of the Greater Bengaluru Governance Act, 2024 and when the present BBMP is split into multiple corporations.

One of the first major tasks before B-SMILE will be to oversee construction of 40 km of tunnel roads under the city, which is part of a larger blueprint to decongest surface traffic.
