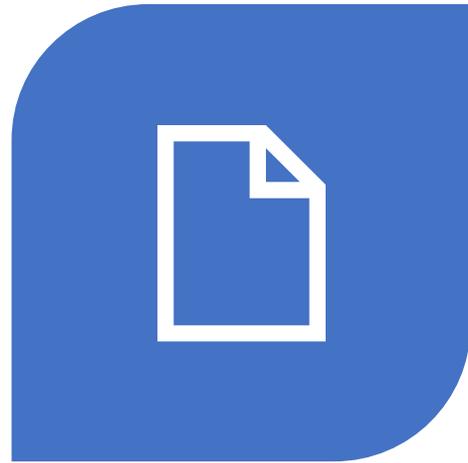

India and France elevated their relationship to a 'special global strategic partnership' on Tuesday when Prime Minister Narendra Modi met French President Emmanuel Macron. The meeting also saw the announcement of the protocol on Fusion-Fission Assistance Agreement, establishment of an annual Foreign Ministers dialogue to review the Horizon 2047 Roadmap, and an agreement on deployment of armed forces. At a time of global uncertainty, the India-France partnership is a force for stability, Mr. Modi said. The bilateral talks between Mr. Modi and the French President in Mumbai resulted in a wide-ranging agreement covering health, ethical minerals, defence, science and technology, renewable energy, and skills.

The court was hearing a petition highlighting instances of Chief Ministers, senior bureaucrats, and police officers making public statements that stigmatise entire communities, legitimise discriminatory governance, and erode public confidence in the state's commitment to equal citizenship.

"We would like to impress upon all political parties to follow the principles of constitutional morality, values, mutual respect,

and self-respect. This is a more than 75-year-old mature democracy; we do not expect people to behave like this," Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, heading a three-judge Bench, observed orally.

Justice B.V. Nagarathna advocated the need to "restrain" discriminatory and communally divisive public speeches "from all sides".

## 'Control of thought'

"Political leaders must ultimately foster fraternity in the country," Justice Nagarathna remarked. However, she pointed out that the origin of speech was thought. "How can we control thought?" the judge asked.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal and advocate Fuzail



Ahmad Ayyubi, appearing for petitioner-activist Roop Rekha Verma, said the court could certainly control the "consequences of thought" by laying down guidelines to govern public speech by constitutional functionaries, so as to ensure fidelity to constitutional morality, without imposing prior restraint or

censorship. "We have to do something now," Mr. Sibal urged the court.

The court said it was keen to lay down guidelines but noted that the petition seemed to name personalities only from a particular political party. The Bench indicated that the court did not want to enter the political thicket,

following which Mr. Sibal sought two weeks to modify the petition.

Chief Justice Kant said the petition has raised a "very serious issue" even as Mr. Sibal pointed out that public statements have become increasingly "toxic".

Mr. Sibal highlighted the "normalisation of constitutionally unbecoming speeches by holders of high public offices". He said these statements were not merely political rhetoric, but have weaved their way into administrative and law enforcement establishments.

Chief Justice Kant asked whether party constitutions did not have any clauses to control public conduct and speeches of their leaders.

Justice Joymalya Bagchi, the third judge on the Bench, said the public have an expectation that "democratic entities would live up to the constitutional ethos and values".

## 'Chilling effect'

The petition flagged statements of sitting Chief Ministers and holders of high public offices, which exemplify how constitutional and legal authority was used to legitimise discriminatory hostility. It drew attention to statements by senior bureaucrats and police officers that "reinforce exclusion, humiliation, or collective blame". It underscored that holders of public office and senior executive authorities who indulge in a continuing pattern of derogatory

speech were not ordinary speakers.

"Their words carry the imprimatur of the State, influence administrative action, shape public perception, and can have a chilling or exclusionary effect on vulnerable communities, even in the absence of direct incitement or hate speech... No structured guidance or framework clarifying how constitutional morality applies to the public speech of constitutional functionaries. This vacuum has allowed discriminatory and derogatory speech," it pointed out.

"Let this not be a populist exercise. It should be a contemplative and constitutional exercise. We need to take an objective approach," Justice Bagchi addressed Mr. Sibal.

# Congress, DMK together in fight against fascist forces: Venugopal

Party general secretary urges leaders in TN, not to make any comments on the issues surrounding the alliance, and says high command will take final call; amid speculation over tie-up for Assembly polls, he adds that both parties are old allies

In the wake of intense speculation whether the Congress-DMK alliance would continue for the Assembly election in Tamil Nadu, the All India Congress Committee (AICC) general secretary (organisations) K.C. Venugopal said on Tuesday that the "Congress and DMK are old allies" and "we are together" to fight the fascist forces.

Speaking to presspersons here after participating in a protest march against the Union government's decision to dismantle the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGS), Mr. Venugopal urged the Congress leaders in Tamil Nadu not to make any comments on the issues surrounding the alliance.

"I can categorically say the Congress and DMK are old allies. We have a tradi-

tion to have an alliance on common issues... to fight the fascist forces... fight against the communal forces. We were together, and we are together... of course, Assembly elections are coming... we are in the process of having discussions with the party, our people also have political ambition. There needs to

be a clear cut coalition discussion. We are waiting for the discussion, I think the DMK will inform us when it is going to start," Mr. Venugopal said on Tuesday.

Asked about the demand for "power share" despite DMK leader and Chief Minister M.K. Stalin rejecting it, Mr. Venugopal

said, "The Congress high command will inform us soon all in due course." He further said, "Nobody has a right to speak against or in favour of the alliance... the high command will take the final decision."

The clear cut directive comes after Congress Vice-President MP B. Manickam Tagore recently delivered a speech, which was considered critical of the DMK, in Madurai.

## Two digital initiatives to boost health AI ecosystem launched

Union Health and Family Welfare Minister J.P. Nadda on Tuesday launched two digital health initiatives - SAH (Secure AI for Health Initiatives) and BODH (Benchmarking Open Data for Health) during the India AI Impact Summit.

The launch marks a milestone in advancing safe, ethical, and evidence-based deployment of artificial intelligence in India's healthcare ecosystem," the Ministry said in a release.

He said that AI did not operate in isolation, but thrived on strong digital infrastructure and high quality data. He noted that the National Health Policy, 2017, envisaged the creation of a comprehensive digital health ecosystem that would be interoperable, inclusive, and scalable.

"Building on this vision, the government launched the Aryabhata Bharat Digital Mission in 2016 to realise a robust digital public architecture for healthcare," he said.

**SAH and BODH**

Describing SAH as not merely a technology strategy but a governance framework, policy compass, and national road map, he said the responsible use of AI in healthcare, Mr. Nadda said that SAH would guide India in leveraging AI in an ethical, transparent, accountable, and people-centric manner.

Additionally, collaboration between the government and academia has led to the development of BODH, which provides a structured mechanism to assess and validate AI solutions before large-scale deployment.

## Indian Army puts up a show with homegrown dual-use AI systems

The Army's display at Impact Mandapam highlighted dual-use platforms designed to serve both defence operations and civilian applications such as disaster management, cybersecurity and governance.

The Indian Army said it showcased several key systems, including AI-enabled, an automated assessment and feedback platform, aimed at stud-

## IT Minister apologises for summit troubles; Kharge slams 'mismanagement'

Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Tuesday apologised for the difficulties faced by attendees on the opening day of the India AI Impact Summit, saying the Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge criticised the AI ecosystem for the "utter chaos and rank mismanagement".

Addressing a press conference at Bharat Mandapam, the summit venue, Mr. Vaishnaw said the turnout on Monday was "phenomenal" and assured participants that corrective steps had been taken to ensure a smoother experience in the coming days.

More than 700 people attended the summit on the first day, he said. "This is the biggest AI summit in the entire world. The energy is palpable. We can see the organisers are very smooth now, if anybody faced any problems yesterday, we apologise for that," Mr. Vaishnaw said. A "war room" had been set up to address technical and operational issues, he added.

"Utter chaos" Earlier, in a post on X, Mr. Kharge said that what could have been a global showcase of India's digital capabilities had turned into "utter chaos" due to mismanagement.

"What could have been a showcase of India's digital capabilities, which is an annual feature, in smooth-running such large-scale digital & tech con-

gressions," the Congress Chief posted on X. ## Why Yuvraj Mehta's death was not an accident

In January 16, Yuvraj Mehta, a 27-year-old tech professional, was driving at night when his car veered off the road at a sharp turn and plunged into an unguarded, water-filled pit in Sector 16G of Greater Noida. His death has been described as a tragic accident caused by Noida Authority and builder negligence of safety audits at construction sites. That framing, however, leaves unresolved questions about responsibility and governance.

**A governance problem**  
In urban India, deaths caused by infrastructural failure are seen as unfortunate and incidental. In reality, cities do not witness such deaths, they produce them. When unsafe infrastructure becomes ordinary, harm is no longer unexpected. Data (2020) from the National Crime Record Bureau shows 1.73 lakh road accident deaths, urban areas accounted for about 32% of these, with higher per lakh rates than rural areas.

The language of "accident" implies uncertainty. In Indian cities, however, risks tied to congested roads, encroached, unguarded construction sites, unlined basements and collapsing public utilities are well documented. Civic complaints and official audits have flagged these conditions for years. Findings from the Ministry of Urban and Urban Affairs show that 70% of cities lack functional drainage systems, which helps explain why such risks go unaddressed.

Urban life is shaped by an everyday expectation of a safe space to live. They show down, citizens carefully avoid certain stretches during the monsoon, and learn to live with dangers as routine. Over time, this shift places the burden of safety on individuals rather than public institutions, even though the 74th Constitutional Amendment was meant to devolve urban governance, with only four of its functions effectively transferred. This is not simply a failure of

intention; it is a failure of priorities. Cities invest heavily in visible symbols of development, such as flyovers, expressways, and metro corridors. Over time, this creates cities where everyday necessities carry hidden risks.

This pattern becomes especially clear in places shaped by aspiration. In Delhi's Karol Bagh, a dense coaching hub associated with educational mobility, repeated episodes of monsoon waterlogging have exposed the lethal consequences of infrastructural neglect. In 2020, three students drowned in a flooded basement library that had already been flagged by audits by the Municipal Corporation of Delhi. The recent meeting between Grand Mufti A.P. Aboobacker Musliar, Kerala's prominent Sunni leader and general secretary of the All India Jamiaiyathul Ulama, and Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi was no routine courtesy call. The timing was significant, held ahead of Ramadan, the meeting also came just ahead of the Kerala Assembly elections and during the centenary year of the Samastha Kerala Jamiaiyathul Ulama, the state's largest body of traditional Islamic scholars. The public relations exercise initiated by Mr. Modi too, both the leaders shared multiple photographs and exchanged warm words on social media.

Beedis are taxed much lower than cigarettes but they pose serious health risks, in many cases exceeding those of cigarettes

Also, while there is almost no caste-based difference in cigarette smoking, beedi use shows a slight shift. Over 55% of the Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) population smoke cigarettes, which is similar to the share among the general category. With beedi, however, the numbers shift slightly: 40.6% of the SC population smokes beedi, compared to 7% in the general category.

The economic disparity in tobacco choice is stark, while wealth has little impact on cigarette consumption, it is the primary driver of beedi use. Among India's poorest households, the share of beedi and cigarette smokers is nearly identical (around 14-15%). However, as household wealth increases, beedi consumption plummets. In the richest households, while cigarette use remains steady at 11.5%, beedi consumption drops to just 3.1% (Chart 3).

The 2022 Report on Tobacco control in India indicates that beedi smoking poses serious health risks, as prevalent in rural areas (8.3%) compared to urban areas



highlights striking differences in respiratory risk: beedi smokers are 2.87 times more likely to suffer from asthma, compared to 1.82 times for cigarette smokers. Cancer risks show a similar pattern. Mumbai cohort study found that beedi smokers faced a higher risk of all cancers than cigarette smokers, with particularly elevated risks for lung and laryngeal cancers. Tuberculosis mortality is also more severe, with beedi smokers facing 2.6 times the risk of death. "Poor people who are main consumers of beedi end up spending more on health care," said health economist Rijo John. "That is only going to increase the existing inequality between the rich and the poor and the rich."

The Global Adult Tobacco Survey (GATS-2) shows that the average monthly expenditure of Indians on tobacco rose for beedi and cigarette smokers, but far more for cigarette smokers. Daily smokers spend about ₹192 per month on cigarettes, up from ₹98 in 2010-11 (GATS-1), and spent ₹226 per month on beedis, up from ₹116, after adjusting for inflation.

## World recognition for small savings drive

New Delhi, Feb. 18. India has been specially invited by the United Nations to attend a 10-day workshop in Colombia on the mobilisation of personal savings in developing countries. Mr. R.C. Khedekar, National Savings Commissioner, is representing India at the workshop.

The seminar is intended for the South American countries, but the invitation to India is in recognition of its success in inducing the voluntary co-operation of the various agencies and building up the image of small savings as the people's movement, according to an official press release from the Ministry.

There are nearly 2,00,000 volunteers in the country engaged in recycling up small savings. They include students at the schools and the university level who go to slum areas in cities and to the villages, women social workers, trade union workers and the members of the community. Saving deposits in India aggregated to Rs. 3,87,600 crore upto March 1976 and were the highest for any other organisation in the country. Last year alone, the deposits amounted to Rs. 127 crore. These savings accounted for 30 per cent of the internal public debt of the country. India offers the largest variety of savings schemes to the people and some of those like the protected savings scheme for low income groups are unique in the world.

While younger and middle-aged men largely prefer cigarettes, beedi consumption is disproportionately prevalent among the older population.

Also, while there is almost no caste-based difference in cigarette smoking, beedi use shows a slight shift. Over 15% of the Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) populations smoke cigarettes, which is similar to the share among the general category. With beedis, however, the numbers tilt slightly: 10.6% of the SC population smokes them, compared to 7% in the general category.

The economic disparity in tobacco choice is stark: while wealth has little impact on cigarette consumption, it is the primary driver of beedi use. Among India's poorest households, the share of beedi and cigarette smokers is nearly identical (around 14-15%). However, as household wealth increases, beedi consumption plummets. In the richest households, while cigarette use remains steady at 11.5%, beedi consumption drops to just 2.1% (**Chart 3**).

The 2022 Report on Tobacco Control in India indicates that beedi smoking poses serious health risks, in many cases exceeding those of cigarettes. The report

highlights striking differences in respiratory risk: beedi smokers are 2.87 times more likely to suffer from asthma, compared to 1.82 times for cigarette smokers.

Cancer risks show a similar pattern. A Mumbai cohort study found that beedi smokers faced a higher risk of all cancers than cigarette smokers, with particularly elevated risks for lung and laryngeal cancers. Tuberculosis mortality is also more severe, with beedi smokers facing 2.6 times the risk of death. "Poor people who are the main consumers of beedis end up spending more on health care," said health economist Rijo John. "That is only going to increase the existing inequality between the poor and the rich."

The Global Adult Tobacco Survey 2016-17 (GATS-2) shows that the average monthly expenditure of Indians on tobacco rose for both cigarette and beedi users, but for very different reasons. Daily smokers spent about ₹1,192 per month on cigarettes, up from ₹668 in 2009-10 (GATS-1), and spent ₹284 per month on beedis, up from ₹156, after adjusting for inflation.

For cigarettes, this increase was largely price-driven, the survey argued. The number of cigarettes smoked per day did not rise significantly between GATS-1 and GATS-2, indicating that higher spending reflects higher taxes and prices, rather than higher consumption. On the other hand, the number of bidis smoked per day increased significantly between the two surveys, driving up overall expenditure. This suggests that tax policy has been effective in containing cigarette consumption, but not beedi use.

John said specific excise is considered a better form of taxation in regulating consumption. "If the tax is levied solely on the basis of the quantity consumed, we pay the same tax whether the beedi is sold at a lower price or at a higher price by the manufacturer. This directly discourages consumption," he said.



**CHART 1:** The percentage of men aged 15-54 who smoked cigarettes and beedis across urban and rural populations as of 2019-21





Bangladesh reform agenda wins voters' backing, but rifts remain among parties

Bangladesh's landmark referendum on constitutional reforms delivered a decisive mandate in favour of the July National Charter 2025, setting the stage for the most far-reaching reformation of the country's governance framework since independence. According to official results published by the Election Commission, more than 48 million voters backed the Charter in the February 12 referendum, with 60.26% of participants voting "Yes". The vote coincided with the country's 14th parliamentary elections. The endorsement places immediate political and legal obligations on the new government, being led by the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), which secured a two-thirds majority in Parliament. While the BNP signed the Charter last year, it did so with a note of dissent on several key provisions raising questions about how smoothly the reform process will unfold. The July Charter is a 28-page reform blueprint from the July 2024 uprising which toppled the 15-year rule of Sheikh Hasina. It consolidates over 80 reform proposals aimed at redefining what its architects describe as the "requirements of authoritarian and fascist rule". In February 2025, the interim government of Mohammad Yunus established six reform commissions to review the constitution, judiciary, electoral system, police, public administration and anti-corruption mechan-

isms. Their recommendations were distilled into the July Charter through a National Consensus Commission process. In October 2025, 33 political parties, including the BNP, signed the Charter. ## Flattering carnival in poll year could land Lula in legal trouble

RIO DE JANEIRO

Rio de Janeiro's Sambadrome hosted a glittery parade Sunday evening celebrating Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva in a year he bids for a fourth term. However, his adversaries are seeking legal action against the 80-year-old leader and the samba school, alleging the tribute kicked off his campaign six months in advance.

The parade by top samba school Acadêmicos do Salton centered on Mr. Lula's rags-to-riches from a childhood of poverty in Brazil's northeast region to his current standing as one of Latin America's most prominent leaders.

Mr. Lula, Vice President Geraldo Alckmin and their wives attended the parade.

Julio Bastiana, Mr. Lula's campaign manager in his 2006 bid for re-election, does not foresee any electoral gains from the tribute. "The president and the first lady have dangerously approached this parade," he said in a video, published on Thursday. "This could all backfire."

In 2003, his first year as President, the prominent samba school Beija Flor featured a float depicting him as a corrupt politician helping a foreign investor. Nine years later, the São Paulo-based samba school Cavalo da Pólvora also centered its parade on Mr. Lula.

But never had such a carnival tribute happened for a sitting President in an election year and with an electoral court closely watching.

Within months, the electoral court's leadership will pass to Supreme Court Justice Roberto Nunes, who was appointed by Mr. Lula's foe and predecessor Jair Bolsonaro, a Carnival critic during his presidency. Mr. Nunes will also be in charge during Brazil's presidential election in October.

# As critical minerals become strategic assets, U.S. looks to realign supply chain

Trump administration's Project Vault aims to create a reserve of critical minerals to protect domestic industry from a disruption as witnessed when China restricted export of rare earth magnets to retaliate against U.S. tariffs, causing a near shutdown of car manufacturing operations in the U.S.

In the first week of February, the Trump administration unveiled Project Vault, an independently governed and operated public-private partnership aimed at establishing a strategic domestic reserve of critical minerals in the U.S. The partnership, backed by \$10 billion in financing by the Export-Import Bank of the United States (EXIM) and an additional \$2 billion in private funds, aims to store 60 critical minerals listed in the U.S. Geological Survey's 2025 Critical Minerals List to strengthen the resilience of civilian industries against supply chain disruptions. Under this development model, EXIM provides long-term loans to purchase and store critical minerals in the country. This stockpile build-up represents a whole-of-government approach to reduce dependence on foreign countries for minerals critical to geopolitical risks and economic coercion, complementing other major policy efforts to build substantive domestic production and processing of critical minerals.

**Reason for the move**  
The concept of strategic reserves in the U.S. goes back to 1978 when it established its Strategic Petroleum Reserve to protect its economy from the energy shocks caused by the 1973 Arab oil embargo. In the 21st century, critical minerals are foundational to modern economic and technological power, and China dominates different stages of mineral production such as mining, processing, and magnet manufacturing. In 2025, China retaliated against U.S. tariffs by restricting exports of rare earth magnets, causing a near shutdown of operations of car manufacturing in the United States and across the world. The unprecedented disruption forced production lines to rethink shifting some production to China, whose finished exports had numerous restrictions. Importantly, the disruption laid bare the vulnerabilities in the supply chain and caused a decisive blow to the Trump administration's plan to shore up rare earth elements not just commodities but strategic assets that underpin comprehensive national power.

**U.S. first, allies second?**  
EXIM chairman John Iovannone emphasized that Project Vault will initially focus on building and securing domestic manufacturing capacity in critical minerals, with a broader focus on allied engagement to strengthen shared supply chains for critical minerals. However, analysts

point out that given the deep pockets of the U.S. and the exhaustive list of stockpiles, its intervention could directly help non-Chinese producers, who have struggled to compete against cheaper Chinese mining. Diversified funds by the U.S. could directly contribute to the strengthening of alternative supply chains globally if partner countries also agree to trade minerals between each other at border-adjusted prices (border tax adjustment). In this regard, the U.S. administration has already agreed 11 new bilateral agreements with Japan, the EU, Mexico, and the United Kingdom, announcing action plans to develop border-adjusted price mechanisms.

On a multilateral level, the Trump administration's decision to host 54 countries at the Critical Minerals Ministerial sig-

nalled a welcome return to plurilateral initiatives to create a preferential trading bloc that would enforce similar rules. The multilateral initiative was named by Secretary of State Marco Rubio as the Forum on Resource Geopolitics Management (FORGE), whose broader objectives are to coordinate on critical mineral policy, pricing, and product development. For allies and partners, the FORGE initiative provides a platform to collaborate at the policy level on investments and access to critical minerals and set the price floor to build resilient supply chains.

**Pac Silica**  
The Pac Silica initiative was launched by the United States in December 2025 to form a coalition of capable countries committed to building secure and resilient supply chains foundational to artificial intelligence (AI), which include energy, critical minerals, and semiconductor. U.S. National Security Strategy, which asserts that U.S. geopolitical interests and U.S. standards drive the world forward, in the event, conditions on supply chains deliver best when they are predictable, trust, and low volatility, and ensuring these will remain the biggest challenge for the U.S.-led initiatives.

Two years on, Navalny's death casts a shadow over Russia and wider Europe

Mourners gathered in Moscow on Monday to mark two years since the death in custody of Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny, under the shadow of a Kremlin crackdown and just two days since a new analysis reinforced the suspicion that he was killed by poisoning.

Navalny died in an Australian colony on February 16, 2024, while serving a 19-year sentence that many believed to be politically motivated. His death at the age of 47 left the Russian opposition leaderless and dented, although not eliminated, an effective or united front without one of its most vis-

ible and charismatic figures.

On the second anniversary of Navalny's death, we look at the latest investigation into its cause and the continuing political repercussions, both within Russia and beyond.

**'He was murdered'**  
Navalny's mother, Lyudmila Navalnaya, and his mother-in-law, Alla Abrosimova, were among the mourners laying flowers on his grave. A mound of bouquets rose above the heavy drif of snow that blanketed Moscow's Borisovsky Cemetery.

Representatives from several European embassies also paid their respects, watched by a con-

sistently high security presence. "I hope, at some point, they gathered to sing by Navalny's grave."

Addressing the crowd, Lyudmila Navalnaya restated her belief that her son was killed by the Russian authorities, a scenario which has also been backed by several European countries in recent days. "We know that our son did not simply die in prison," she said. "He was murdered."

The Kremlin has denied the allegations, saying that Navalny died of natural causes.

Flowers were also laid at the memorial to the victim of political repression, last St. Petersburg, a mass to the Kremlin with a rare and lethal toxin

It was named after former India cricketer Yuvraj Singh. Like his illustrious namesake, Canada's Yuvraj Samra has roots in Punjab and bats left-handed.

On Tuesday, the 19-year-old took those comparisons to the next level against New Zealand through some exquisite strokeplay, scoring a scintillating 100 (65B, 18x4, 1x6). His efforts powered Canada to 173 for four after opting to bat.

And when the North American south reduced the Kiwis to 30 for two by removing openers Tim Setfert and Finn Allen, Dipak Banax's men would have seemed something monumental.

However, as is often the case, the more established teams have greater depth and temperament to navigate tricky situations. Glenn Phillips (59 r.o., 30B, 4x4, 1x6) and Rachin Ravindra (59 r.o., 30B, 4x4, 3x6) quickly turned the tables, putting the pressure back on Canada's inexperienced attack.

Their knocks ensured the Black Caps returned home to an eight-wicket win with 20 balls to spare in their final Group D league fixture. Phillips was particularly severe on the spinners, hindering them down the ground and into the

Samra signals his arrival on the world stage

Canada's soon opener Yuvraj Samra announced himself on the world stage with a record-breaking hundred against New Zealand in the T20 World Cup here on Tuesday.

Samra, named after former India all-rounder Yuvraj Singh, smashed a half-a-dozen sixes and 11 fours.

Though the knock went in vain as the Kiwis romped home in 15.1 overs, Yuvraj showcased championship stuff against a quality attack.

In smashing the century, he became the first from an Associate nation to breach the three-figure mark in the T20 showpiece and also the youngest (19 years and 141 days) to register a ton in the World Cups (T20 and 50-over) beating the record of Ireland's Paul Stirling, who was 20 years and the days old when he

scored a hundred against Netherlands in the 2011 ODI World Cup.

"I enjoyed the whole innings. I feel like it just went my way today and I felt great. Yes, I've been thinking about this moment every day," he told after the match.

**Turning point** Samra, whose lofted shots bear an uncanny resemblance to Yuvraj's, said the innings could be a turning point in his career as he would have caught the eye of franchises across the various T20 leagues.

"I feel this innings could change my life. I can actually make a good living out of this sport," he said.

New Zealand all-rounder Glenn Phillips, who stole Samra's thunder with a 36-ball unbeaten 76 to steer the team to victory, was all praise for the latter. "Yeah, obviously he hasn't unbelievably well. It's fantastic for him and he hit the ball really well today."
