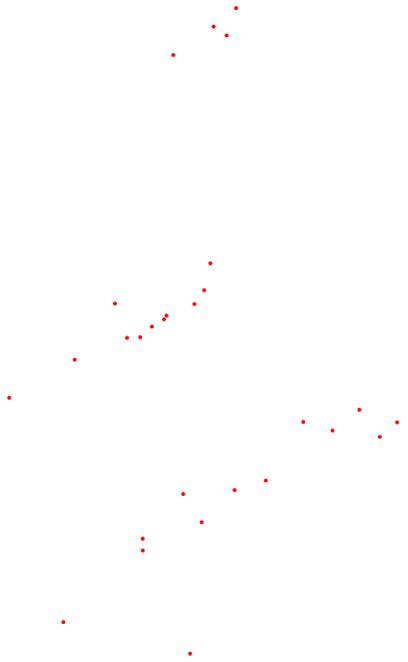

SC asks govt. to consider plea to treat 'racial slur' as a hate crime

The Supreme Court on Wednesday disagreed with the notion of pigeonholing crime on the basis of race and region, saying it would fuel polarisation, while hearing a petition seeking comprehensive guidelines to recognise 'racial slur' as a separate category of hate crime.

Chief Justice of India S. Upendra Kumar, heading a three-judge bench, said crime, whoever was on either end of it, should be dealt with on an iron hand.

Classifying crimes based on a victim's identity could risk dividing society, Chief Justice Kant said, adding that 75 years after independence, the nation must find strength and unity in treating all its diverse citizens equally.

Parting words
The court asked Attorney General R. Venkatesan to consider the petition

and refer it to an appropriate authority. The petition was filed by advocate Anoop Prakash Awasthi in the aftermath of shock and public grief over the fatal attack on Anshul Chakraborty, a 34-year-old MBA student from Tripura, by a group of men in Uttarakhanda.

Chakraborty was attacked after he resisted harkling while not sleeping with his younger brother. He died under medical treatment on December 27, 2025, never regaining consciousness. The petition requested Chakraborty's tragic words to his attackers, "We are Indians. What certificate should we show to prove that?"

Ruling the seas

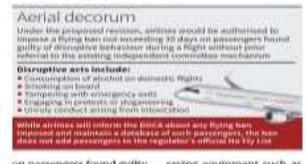

Airlines operators may soon be empowered to directly impose a flying ban of up to 30 days on unruly or disruptive passengers without referring the matter to the competent authority.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has proposed amendments to the Civil Aviation Requirement provisions governing the handling of unruly or disruptive passengers, emphasising that such incidents are an independent committee.

The DGCA said the definition of disruptive acts included smoking on board, consumption of alcohol on domestic flights, tampering with emergency exits, unauthorised use of life-

Nvidia, OpenAI announce partnerships with Indian firms, academic institutes

U.S. tech giants Nvidia and OpenAI on Wednesday announced partnerships with Indian industry and academia at the ongoing AI Impact Summit. The two firms will work with three firms - Vista (which runs data centres), L&T, and E&E Networks. The latter has signed up with multiple universities with a view to "strengthening AI use among students".

India's AI cloud infrastructure will host workloads as well as manufacture intelligence for model training, fine-tuning and high-scale inference, Nvidia, which makes the graphics processing units that run AI models, said in a statement. "Capacity within these data centres will be reserved for model builders, startups, researchers and enterprises to build, fine-tune and deploy AI in India." The firm will provide Indian partners access to NeMo, Train and NeMo, the former being a family of open-source LLMs and the latter a software suite for managing AI agents.

SC panel to guide judges on sensitivity, compassion

Over a year after a High Court judge used explicit language to narrate a sexual assault on a minor girl in his judicial order, the Supreme Court has assigned the Director of the National Judicial Academy, Justice Anandvardhan Bose (retd.), to draw guidelines to infuse the qualities of sensitivity and compassion in judges, especially in the context of vulnerable cases.

A three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice of India Sarva Kant directed Justice Bose, a former top court judge, to include legal practitioners, academics, and social workers in the expert committee. The court said the committee report should be comprehensive and well-

ten in simple language, without any legal jargon. It said there was no point in such an exercise if the victims were not protected, did not understand a word of the report. The bench said the report should be translated into regional languages and submitted in the apex court.

The court highlighted that there were several offensive words and expressions in local dialects which are used casually in society. However, the use of these words also constitute an offence under the provisions. The bench said it was time to spread awareness about how such expressions were a violation of the rights of victims of assault.

"It shall be highly appreciated if the executive, as a part of its report, is able to identify and compile such words/expressions, from different languages, so that they do not go unnoticed, and the complainants are not compelled to give a better and fuller narrative of the trans-

gress undergone by them," the judgment, authored by Chief Justice Kant, observed.

The judgment was triggered by a petition filed by an NGO 'We the Women of India', represented by senior advocate Shobha Datta, and other members of the Supreme Court Bar, including senior advocate H.K. Airline operators may soon be empowered to directly impose a flying ban of up to 30 days on unruly or disruptive passengers without referring the matter to the competent authority.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has proposed amendments to the Civil Aviation Requirement provisions governing the handling of unruly or disruptive passengers, emphasising that even a single disruptive passenger can jeopardise safety on board and adversely affect flight operations.

Under the proposed revision, airlines will be authorised to impose a flying ban not exceeding 30 days

Aerial decorum

Under the proposed revision, airlines would be authorised to impose a flying ban not exceeding 30 days on passengers found guilty of disruptive behaviour during a flight without prior referral to the existing independent committee mechanism

Disruptive acts include:

- Consumption of alcohol on domestic flights
- Smoking on board
- Tampering with emergency exits
- Engaging in protests or sloganeering
- Unruly conduct arising from intoxication



While airlines will inform the DGCA about any flying ban imposed and maintain a database of such passengers, the ban does not add passengers to the regulator's official No Fly List

Maharashtra village passes resolution to become caste-free: 'Don't want hatred to reach our doorstep'

Soundala (Maharashtra),
February 18

AT SOUNDALA, 60 km from Ahilyanagar in Maharashtra, Class 5 students sit in a circle outside the village temple preparing for their primary scholarship examination. A few steps away is the gram panchayat office, where, on February 5, the village gram sabha passed a unique resolution to make the village 'caste-free' and end discrimination on all grounds.

The effects are not just on paper. "We had Hindu religious reading last week. She is Muslim and she also had food at the festival with us," says one of the students Gauri Bhand, referring to her friend Mahira Sayyad sitting beside her. "Christian, Muslim, Maratha, everyone has the same

rights," she adds.

Led by sarpanch Sharad Argade, the resolution read, "There will be no discrimination on the basis of caste, religion, creed, or race in Mouje Soundala. All residents in the village will be equal and the belief of 'My religion — humanity' is being adopted."

It also declared that public places, government services, water sources, temples, crematoriums, schools, and public events will be open to all, and stated that village authorities would take action against any social media posts that create caste tension in the village.

The village has a population

of about 2,500, informs Argade, and 65 per cent of the villagers are Marathas belonging to the general category. Twenty per cent of the village population, around 60 families, belong to the Scheduled Caste (SC). At least 15-20 of the SC families follow Christianity. Three Muslim families also reside in the village.

Argade says that the village itself doesn't have any major caste divisions and no atrocity case has been registered in the past decade. "The resolution passed is a preventive measure. We are seeing the kind of hatred and division that is being spread in society. In Beed, people first check the caste of a shopkeeper before buying groceries. We don't want this kind of hatred reaching our doorstep," he explained.

Ashok Pandit, teacher at the ZP school, says that before each exam, all students, including Mahira, bow their heads at the two temples located just opposite the school. "These kids don't have any discrimination among each other. But they won't be here forever. Our school is just till fifth grade, they will go out for further schooling, then college. When they go out into the world, their minds get filled with hate. If we are able to finish all discrimination right here at the school level, then they will not get influenced by it later."

In September 2024, the gram sabha passed a resolution to provide Rs 11,000 for widow remarriage, a practice usually frowned upon. Another resolution, passed in November 2024, banned curse words that degrade women.
