he Congress on Saturday demanded an inquiry by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of Parliament into what it described as a "disturbing misuse" of Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) funds to benefit the Adani Group.

The party alleged that officials of the Union Ministry of Finance and the NITI Aayog pushed through a proposal in May to invest nearly ₹33,000 crore of the LIC's funds in the Adani Group to "signal confidence" in the conglomerate, and "encourage participation from other investors".

The allegations follow an exposé in The Washington Post, which cited internal documents to report how the LIC invested money in the Adani Group after a U.S. court had indicted business tycoon Gautam Adani in a bribery allegations case.

There was no immediate response from the Adani Group or the government on the Congress's allegations.

'Close friends'

However, referring to *The Washington Post's* report, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge asked why Prime Minister Narendra Modi was "squandering" the hard-earned money of 30 crore LIC policyholders.

ments led to losses for the LIC, including a ₹7,850 crore fall in just four hours of trading on September 21, 2024, following the indictment of Mr. Adani and seven associates in the U.S., he said. The business tycoon has been accused by U.S. authorities of a ₹2,000 crore bribery related to solar scheme power contracts. he added.

'Need for investigation'

The Congress reiterated its long-standing demand for a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe into the Adani matter, which it first raised through its 'Hum Adani ke Hain Kaun' ('who are we to Adani') campaign.

"As a first step, the PAC should investigate how LIC

was forced to invest in Adani Group companies. That will be well within its powers," Mr. Ramesh said.

He alleged the Modi government had "refused for nearly a year" to serve a summons from the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission to the Adani Group, which he described as "the Prime Minister's most favoured business conglomerate".

Calling it the "Modani MegaScam", Mr. Ramesh said the issue went beyond the LIC's investment, and included alleged misuse of Central agencies, including the Enforcement Directorate, the Central Bureau of Investigation, and the Income Tax Department to pressure private firms into selling assets to the Adani Group.

The BTP will partner with the Aarohan Foundation, which runs the 'Police Marshals' initiative aimed at conducting drug awareness campaigns among college students.

The foundation currently operates in 100 colleges with 14,000 student marshals, who will now also

Karthik Reddy, Joint Commissioner of Police (Traffic), told *The Hindu* that the foundation's student network represents a large and valuable resource that can be mobilised to promote traffic awareness and help identify violators. "We will add a 'Police Marshals' option on the ASTraM app, which onboarded students can use

to upload traffic violation photos," Mr. Karthik said.



An independent panel – the Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar Committee, steered by the Principal Scientific Adviser – decides on award recipients and makes a recommendation to the Minister of Science and Technology. It is unclear if the Minister has a veto on the recommendation.

The Vigyan Ratna aims at recognising lifetime achievements and contributions made in any field of science and technology. Vigyan Shri is awarded for distinguished contributions in any field of science and technology. Vigyan Yuva award is for young scientists under the age of 45 years to recognise their exceptional contributions. Vigyan Team award will be given every year to a team, comprising three or more scientists, researchers or innovators.

Lifeline of sitcoms and satire, Satish Shah passes away

An effortless performer who made even a corpse a timeless monument of Indian cinema, Satish Shah bid adieu in Mumbai on Saturday from kidney failure. Not just a supporting player, Shah was often the spark that lit scenes with humour and elevated his co-actors' performances.

Creating an endearing amalgam of instinct, intellect, and improvisation, Shah brought an irreverence to his roles that few could match. Lifeline of many a sitcom, he became a household name with Ye Jo Hai Zindagi, where he played a rainbow of roles, and hit the high point of his career with Sarabhai vs Sarabhai in which, as the mischief-loving, Gujarati patriarch Indravardhan Sarabhai, he made fun of the shenanigans of the bourgeois class and impact

of western values on Indian society in a measured performance. The series and his playful jabs at his elitist wife, Maya, played by Ratna Pathak Shah, have stood the test of time and found love across generations. He maintained that Indravardhan was a reflection of his real self.

As Indian television shifted from the sedate Doordarshan to the sparkly private satellite television, Shah was among the most popular faces on the small screen, with series like Filmy Chakkar, Ghar Jamai, and All The Best.

He was born in Mumbai in 1951 into a Gujarati business family. Bitten by the acting bug early, he started with Gujarati and Hindi theatre. A product of St. Xavier's College in Mumbai, where the cultural scene was at its acme in the 1970s, Shah was junior to Shabana Azmi and Farooq Shaikh, and senior to Anil

Kapoor and Mazhar Khan. He took the theatre route to the Film and Television Institute of India, where he came into contact with Naseeruddin Shah, Kundan Shah, and his life partner, Madhu.

A gold medallist in acting, Shah was not considered hero material by Bollywood. After a few years of struggle where he featured in bit roles in films like *Um-rao Jaan*, Shah, ironically, made his presence felt as the corpse of the corrupt Municipal Commissioner De Mello in Kundan's cult comedy *Jaane Bhi Do Yaa-ro (1983)*. His chemistry with Kundan went back to *Ye Jo Hai Zindagi* days, and the two Gujaratis conjured up comedy gold. Stuffed into a coffin for

most of the running time of the film, Shah made his performance as a corpse become an enduring statement of a rotting bureaucracy and an absurd system. The lifeless form became the living symbol of the rot that spurs the comedy of the ridiculous. He would say he never played a role; he became one.

From the physical comedy of *Peechha Karo* (1986) and *Hatim Tai* (1990) to the pure masala camp of *Main Hoona Na* (2004), over the years Shah displayed his mastery of all forms of comedy. Shah provided comic relief in a series of horror flicks in the 1980s. His turn as a wannabe director Hitcock in *Veerana* (1988) became quite a rage.

Off-screen, he was a softspoken person who loved good food and would indulge in serious discussion of the art of acting, timing, and the role of an artist in society. Not one to plan his career, whenever he was tested, he imbued light-hearted roles with emotional depth. Be it the dean of Dilwale Dulhania Le Jayenge (1995) or Shah Rukh Khan's uncle in Kal Ho Naa Ho (2003), Shah was the emotional pillar of many a star-studded structure.

Elevating ensemble casts without overshadowing leads, Shah appeared in cameos marked by nuanced pauses, sarcasm, and impeccable comic timing. His unique dialogue delivery and improvisation turned ordinary lines into punchlines.

When social media gained currency, his characters and dialogues became a popular ingredient for the meme mills. In the past decade, he had cut down on assignments due to a lack of challenging roles and had focused on mentoring.

Veteran actor **Satish Shah**, one of Indian cinema and television's most beloved comic performers, passed away in **Mumbai** on Saturday, after suffering from **kidney failure**.

Renowned for his effortless humor, sharp wit, and improvisational brilliance, Shah was more than a supporting actor — he was the **spark** that elevated every ensemble he was part of.

ndia-ASEAN strategic partnership has continued to prosper despite the prevailing "era of uncertainties", Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Sunday.

Delivering his opening remarks virtually at the 22nd ASEAN-India summit being held in the Malaysian capital of Kuala Lumpur, Mr. Modi described ASEAN as a "cultural partner" of India, and announced further deepening of India-ASEAN cooperation in the domain of maritime security in 2026.

"Even in this era of uncertainties, India-ASEAN comprehensive strategic partnership has continued to make steady progress. And this strong partnership of ours is emerging as a robust foundation for global stability and develop-



ment," the Prime Minister said in his remarks that were telecast to the

summit.

Mr. Modi welcomed Timor-Leste as the newest member of ASEAN, and said India and ASEAN together represented nearly one-fourth of the global population and the two sides were connected by "historical ties and shared values".

"The 21st century is our century, the century of India and ASEAN," he said.

Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim, who co-chaired the ASEAN-India summit, said India-ASEAN relationship was rooted in the "values of friendship, trust, and shared interests".

"Among the issues and matters discussed were efforts to finalise the ASEAN-India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITIGA) and the implementation of the ASEAN-India Plan of Action 2026-2030 to strengthen cooperation in trade, investment, education, food security and technological development," Mr.

Ibrahim said.

He appreciated close ties between India and the ASEAN region in the fields of education, economy, and culture.

Mr. Modi said the AITI-GA could "unleash the full economic potential" of India-ASEAN relationship.

Humanitarian aid

Mr. Modi said India and the ASEAN member-states in Southeast Asia were "companions in the Global South", and promised that India would work with the ASEAN countries to advance digital inclusion, food security, and resilient supply chains "amid global challenges".

The Prime Minister referred to India's active participation in humanitarian assistance and disaster relief activities in the ASEAN region, and said that to deepen maritime relation between the two sides, 2026 would be declared "ASEAN-India Year of Maritime Cooperation".

Mr. Modi mentioned the danger posed by terrorism and reminded the need for unity in fighting terror. "At the same time, we are steadily advancing our cooperation in education, touscience rism. and technology, health, green energy, and cybersecurity." he said, highlighting the "shared cultural heritage" and "people-to-people" ties between India and the ASEAN member-states.

While addressing the heads of governments of the ASEAN region, Mr. Modi conveyed his condolences to the Royal Family and the people of Thailand on the passing of the Queen Mother.

The ASEAN summit began on Sunday with the arrival of heads of the member-countries as well as President Donald Trump of the United States. Ahead of the ASEAN summit, Mr. Modi had called Mr. Ibrahim on October 23 and informed him that he would deliver the speech at the summit virtually.

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar is leading the Indian delegation at Kuala Lumpur and he will lead the Indian delegation at the East Asia summit on Monday.

India's relations with the ASEAN member-states had received top level focus since January this year when Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto was hosted here as the guest of honour at the 76th Republic Day celebrations.

Singapore Prime Minister Lawrence Wong visited India in September, and before that, Philippines President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. visited India in the first week of August.



Satellite for armed forces to be launched next week

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) will launch military communications satellite CMS-03 on November 2 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.

The CMS-03 communication satellite, also known as GSAT-7R, will be launched by the Launch Vehicle Mark 3 (LVM3).

Heavy satellite

"CMS-03 is a multi-band communication satellite that will provide services over a wide oceanic region including the Indian landmass. CMS-03, weighing about 4,400 kg, will be the heaviest communication satellite to be launched to Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO) from Indian soil," the ISRO said on Sunday.

The launch vehicle has been fully assembled and integrated with the spacecraft, and has been moved to the launch pad on Sunday for further pre-launch operations, it added.

The launch of CMS-03 will be the first by the LVM3 rocket in over two years. The last time the rocket was deployed was in July 2023 to launch the historic Chandrayaan-3 mission from Sriharikota.

• The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to launch a new military communications satellite — CMS-03 (GSAT-7R) — on November 2, 2025, from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota.

The launch will mark a significant boost to India's **defence communication network** and the **first deployment of the LVM3 rocket** since the Chandrayaan-3 mission in **July 2023**.

Bhutan's capital, Thimphu, is gearing up for a fortnight-long spiritual festival to pray for world peace and the healing of humanity.
