


The notifications pave the way for 85% reservation for resident Ladakhis in government jobs. For other residents -including children of Central government officials-to be considered "domiciles", they will have to show 15 years of continuous residence from October 31, 2019, Ladakh's foundation day.

In a first, a third of the seats in hill councils have been reserved for women

on a rotational basis. The official languages of the UT will be English, Hindi, Urdu, Bhoti, and Purgi.

President Droupadi Murmu notified the Union Territory of Ladakh Reservation (Amendment) Regulation. 2025, which amends the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act. 2004 in Ladakh's context.

The new proviso, substituting a section in the 2004 Act which capped the reservation at 50%, said, "The total percentage of reservation shall in no case exceed 85%, excluding reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)." Total reservation for government jobs in the Union Territory now stands at 95%, one of the highest in the country. Meghalaya has 85% reservation for Scheduled Castes/Tribes. and Arunachal Pradesh has an 80% quota for STs.

The motion of impeachment can be moved in either House. "The attempt of the government would be to make it a wholly bipartisan move," a senior government source said.

1. Background

- Justice Yashwant Varma (formerly of Delhi High Court, now with Allahabad High Court) was indicted by a 3-member committee.
- A fire incident at his Delhi residence in March led to the discovery of unaccounted cash in an outhouse.
- Despite being nudged to resign, Justice Varma **refused**, leading to further action.

2. Legal Procedure: Impeachment of a Judge

- Governed by Article 124(4) and Article 217 of the Indian Constitution.
- Requires:
 - 50 MPs in Rajya Sabha or 100 MPs in Lok Sabha to initiate motion.
 - Investigation by a **3-member committee**.
 - Final removal only if passed by both Houses with a 2/3 majority (present and voting + total membership).
- Current phase: Committee report submitted on May 4 to Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud (referred to earlier CJI Sanjiv Khanna).



IISc researchers develop artificial metal-based nanozyme that prevents excess blood clotting

The Hindu Bureau BENGALURU

Researchers at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc.) have developed an artificial metal-based nanozyme that can potentially be used to clamp down on abnormal blood clotting caused by conditions like pulmonary thromboembolism (PTE).

According to IISc., under normal circumstances, when a blood vessel is injured, specialised blood cells called platelets get activated, and cluster together around the vessel to form protective blood clots.

This process, known as the blood clotting cascade



The research team synthesised redox active nanomaterials via controlled chemical reactions starting from small building blocks.

(haemostasis), involves a complex series of protein interactions triggered by signals from physiological agonists (chemicals), such as collagen and thrombin.

However, when these

signals go haywire in conditions like PTE or diseases like COVID-19, oxidative stress and levels of toxic Reactive Oxygen Species (ROS) increase, leading to over-activation of platelets. This triggers the formation of excess clots in the blood vessel, contributing to thrombosis, a major cause of morbidity and mortality.

To tackle this challenge, researchers led by G. Mugesh, Professor in the Department of Inorganic and Physical Chemistry, have developed nanomaterials that mimic the activity of natural antioxidant enzymes, which scavenge reactive oxidative molecules. These nanozymes work by controlling ROS levels, thereby preventing the over-activation of platelets that leads to excess clot formation or thrombosis.

The team synthesised redox active nanomaterials

of different sizes, shapes, and morphologies via a series of controlled chemical reactions starting from small building blocks.

They then isolated platelets from human blood, activated them using physiological agonists, and tested how effectively the different nanozymes could prevent excess platelet aggregation.

The Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday said it had introduced a new tech-driven system to provide faster, real-time updates on voter turnout, addressing concerns raised by Opposition parties about discrepancies in turnout data. This system will be implemented before the Bihar Assembly election later this year.

Under this initiative, presiding officers at each polling station will enter turnout figures every two hours directly into the ECI-NET app on polling day to reduce the time lag in updating the approximate polling trends. This will be automatically aggregated at the constituency level.

"This new process significantly reduces the time lag associated with the earlier manual reporting methods," the commission said.

Previously, voter turnout data were collected manually by sector officers and relaved to returning officers through phone calls, SMS, or messaging apps. This information was aggregated every two hours and uploaded on the voter turnout app. The polling percentage trends were often updated with a delay of

connectivity.

Where mobile networks are unavailable, entries can be made offline and synced once connectivity is restored.

Why international students matter to the U.S.

Stemming the flow of Indian and Chinese students will affect STEM research in U.S. universities

The U.S. has paused sche-duling of new visa inter-views globally and expanded its vetting of accounts of foreign students on social media. This is the latest move in a series of intrusive measures carried out by the Donald Trump administration targeting international students and premier universities in the U.S.

This decision comes days after the administration tried to block xperience in the U.S. and work for an employer (Chart 2). 

Namibia: India demands sanctions against S. Africa

New York, June 3: India's Permanent Representative at the U.N., Mr. Rikhi Jaipal, has told the Security Council that "there is a clear case" for imposing mandatory measures under the Charter against South Africa for its refusal to quit Namibia.

Intervening in the Council's discussions on Namibia vesterday, he said the U.N. was fully ustified to take these measures since all othe steps had failed. The mandatory measures envisaged by him

The mandatory measures envisaged by him, though not specifically stated at the Council meeting, included an arms embargo, economic sanctions and severance of diplomatic relations Although India is not a member of the Council, it asked for the floor to reafirm its views on the Namibian question. India has supported the case of the Namibian question self determination and independence right fro Mr. Jaioal aid that the crux of the Namibian

Mr. Jaipal said that the crux of the Namibian issue was the Security Council's resolution calling on South Africa to withdraw its illegal presence from the area and to transfer power to the people of Namibia "with the assistance of the U.N." But, he said, quite simply, the Pretoria ent "does not accept that the U.N. has any role in Namibia." "We are thus in a quandary. The territory has international status but the U.N. has no effective

role concerning it or the future of its people There is a conflict here between 'de jure' responsibility and 'de facto' authority."

Chart 4: Employed foreign-born college graduates by broad field of occupation in 2023




Chart 6: Economic benefits of international student enrolment to the

U.S. Values in \$ billion





Chart 5: Enrollment of master's and doctoral students in science, engineering, and health fields by citizenship






Netherlands still largest destination for India's petrol product exports

THE NETHERLANDS, WHICH became India's largest destination for export of petroleum products in FY23, has consolidated that position since, reports **Saikat Neogi**. In FY25, the country in northwestern Europe, accounted for more than a fifth of India's shipments of these products, with the UAE coming in as a distant second with just 10% share. Of the total \$22.7 billion of India's shipments to the Netherlands in FY25, the share of petroleum products was 58%. In fact, the Netherlands is also India's third largest goods export destination after the US and the UAE now. The country is a prime centre for storing petroleum products because of its port infrastructure and strategic location to ship these products to other European countries.

Married woman can't accuse man of rape on promise of marriage: SC


New Delhi: SC has ruled that a married woman cannot accuse a man of rape on promise of marriage while her own marriage is still subsisting, and quashed a rape case filed by her against a man.

The case involved a Muslim woman, mother of a fouryear-old, residing at her parents' home in Maharashtra's Satara. She developed a relationship with her 23-year-old neighbour, a BSc student.

In her police complaint alleging rape on the promise of marriage, she claimed that the man maintained a physical relationship with her from June 8, 2022, to July 8, 2023, assuring her repeatedly that he would marry her after her divorce. She obtained a 'khulanama' (divorce) from her husband only on Dec 29, 2022.

After FIRs were lodged, the man approached HC for quashing the case, but failed. He moved SC, where a bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and Satish C Sharma found inconsistencies in the woman's narrative and conduct.

"The complainant alleged the appellant had physical relations with her without consent. However, she not only sustained the relationship for a year but also visited him at lodges on two occasions. Her conduct does not corroborate



her allegations," court said.

The bench highlighted that the woman was still married during part of the relationship. Writing the judgment, Justice Sharma noted, "Khulanama was executed on Dec 29, 2022. It is inconceivable she entered a physical relationship with the appellant on promise of marriage while still married. Such a promise was illegal & unenforceable."

The court observed that the complaint seemed to have been filed after the man graduated, returned to his hometown Ahmednagar, and a visit by the woman led to a confrontation with his family.

Quashing the police cases, SC said, "No reasonable possibility exists that a married woman with a four-year-old child would be continuously deceived or maintain a prolonged association with someone who sexually assaulted her: A consensual relationship turning sour cannot invoke state's criminal machinery."

SC trashes rape FIR, finds complainant's intent malicious

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New Delhi: Supreme Court has quashed rape charges against a man who had a consensual physical relationship with a 30-year-old woman but later backed out of marrying her after observing her "aggressive sexual behaviour, obsessive nature, and manipulative & vindictive tendencies."

Allowing the man's plea to quash FIRs lodged by Cyberabad police in 2022 on the woman's complaints of rape on the pretext of marriage, a bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta said, "The facts on record clearly establish the vindictive and manipulative tendencies of the complainant and these aspects have a great bearing on the controversy."

Writing the judgment, Justice Mehta said allowing the man's prosecution would amount to a gross abuse of legal process. He noted that the complaints were "nothing but a bundle of lies full of fabricated and malicious unsubstantiated allegations levelled by the complainant (woman)." SC was also informed that

the woman had filed a similar complaint in 2021 against a professor at Osmania University, where she was studying.

What proved crucial in the current case were the woman's social media chats, where she went by the name 'Muffin'. These chats revealed her intent and pattern. She admitted to being manipulative and expressed a desire to "get a green card holder."

"At one point, she stated it would not be difficult for her to trap the next one. In the same breath, she mentioned she would not waste time with accused appellant and needed to 'invest on the next victim'. She also said she would irritate her victims to the extent that they dump her, so she could happily start with the next one," the bench noted.

The court said the chats revealed a consistent pattern that supported the man's claim of being falsely implicated, and quashed the criminal proceedings against him.

Supreme Court's Key Observations:

- 1. Marital Status is Material
 - A woman still legally married cannot claim she was lured into sexual relations on a false promise of marriage by another man.
- 2. Invalid Consent Argument
 - Consent obtained by a married woman based on the alleged promise of marriage by another man is legally and morally untenable.

- 3. Case Specifics
 - The complainant: A Muslim woman, mother of four, initiated a relationship with a 23-year-old neighbor.
 - She alleged that from **June to July 2023**, the man promised to marry her after she divorced her husband (khulanama on Dec 29, 2022).
 - SC found she was still married during the relationship, making any promise of marriage "illusory and unenforceable."
- 4. Malicious Intent Identified
 - Court found **manipulative conduct** from the complainant, including repeated false FIRs.
 - She had filed a **similar complaint in 2021** against a professor in Osmania University.
