

The Supreme Court on Monday said more than ₹3,000 crore had been scammed by fraudsters from victims, mostly drawn from the elderly population, through "digital arrests".

A Bench headed by Justice Surva Kant was referring to a confidential re-Union government. Justice dering gangs". - What Are 'Digital Arrests'?
- **Digital arrest** is a *new form of cybercrime* where:
- Victims receive fake video calls from fraudsters posing as police, CBI officers, or courts.
- They are told they are involved in a crime or money-laundering case.
- They are **virtually "arrested" online**, often forced to stay visible on camera for hours or days.
- Victims are coerced into transferring money to "settle" or "verify" their case.
- Artificial Intelligence (AI) for *deepfake videos* (fake courtrooms, police officers).
- Forged documents and fake background calls to mimic authenticity.







Mark Housing & Living Costs	Surging rent prices in major university towns pushed both locals and international students into a housing crisis.
─ Government Policy Changes	Visa restrictions, curbs on post-study work, and tightening of student migration caps (especially in the U.K. & Canada).
Inflation & Currency Fluctuations	The strong U.S. dollar and British pound increased education costs for Asian and African students.
Local Backlash	Political pressure to limit migration led to reduced student visa quotas.








Chart 2: Top 20 nationalities of international tertiary-level students enrolled in OECD countries, 2014 and 2023 (in thousands) 2014 2023



In its clarification order, the apex court said that the prayer in Vodafone Idea's petition sought relief not only on the additional demand but also for a comprehensive reassessment of all dues up to FY17. The bench said there was no impediment



to the government reviewing both aspects, given the peculiar circumstances of the case, including its own equity holding in the company and the wider public interest involved.

This clarification now allows the government to revisit the computation of all dues arising from the AGR dispute, and not just the incremental amount that had triggered the current litigation.

The need for clarity arose after the court's October 27 orderwas widely interpreted as permitting the government to reassess Vodafone Idea's entire AGR liability. However, when the detailed text of that order was uploaded two days later, on October 29, it appeared to confine the relief only to the additional ₹9,449crore demand raised by the DoT. That interpretation narrowed the scope of review and prompted Vodafone Idea to seek a clarification from the court, supported by the Centre. clarification Monday's removes that ambiguity.
